



Rector's Reflections Conversations at Christmas time

Christmas is very much a time for conversations - conversations with friends and family, conversations with neighbours and perhaps also with strangers, as we do our Christmas shopping or take part in communal carol singing. Sometimes these conversations will be light-hearted and full of fun, but I'm also well aware that Christmas can also have it's awkward moments. It can be a quite a stressful time, and it's easy for tempers to fray.

As I write these words, I am struck by the number of times conversations feature in the traditional Christmas readings. The accounts of the events surrounding the birth of Jesus found in the gospels, especially in the gospels according to Matthew and Luke, are full of conversations. Some of these conversations involve a dialogue between a human being and an angel, perhaps most famously in the story of the Annunciation, found in the 1st chapter of Luke's gospel. In this story, the angel Gabriel is sent to the Virgin Mary, and he begins the conversation with the memorable words: "Greetings, favoured one! The Lord is with you". The conversation finishes with Mary saying, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word".

I think there is something very special about a good conversation. A good conversation is the opposite of a speech or a monologue, in which one speaker gives the audience the benefit of their own particular thoughts and views. A good conversation is a dialogue, in which the parties listen to each other and learn from each other, sharing experiences and allowing the conversation to go where it will go.

I think we can learn so much from a good conversation, and this is why recently I have started hosting a series of conversations around Christianity. These conversations provide an opportunity to explore the questions and issues which might be occupying our minds. The next series starts on Sunday 26th November, and it runs for 4 weeks – you are very welcome to drop in to any one of the sessions, or come to all four! They take start at 2.30pm at the Benefice Centre in Blewbury, and last an hour. Seasonal refreshments will be provided – conversation often flows better with some tea and cake! There is no need to book a place, and everyone is most welcome, whatever your particular beliefs. May this Christmas time be a rich source of blessing to you all. Father Jason





Hagbournes and Upton Group for Sustainability

The State of Nature? in Deep Trouble When 16% of UK monitored species are in danger of extinction – one in six – you are in deep trouble, says naturalist and TV presenter Chris Packham. The new State of Nature report, led by the RSPB and supported by more than 60 conservation and research organisations, maps the continued decline of British wildlife species decline averages 19% in the UK. Species providing pest control, such as the two-spot ladybird, have declined by more than a third, creating a vicious cycle for farmers' yields. Only half of fish stocks are sustainably harvested and none of the seafloor is in good condition due to damage from fishing gear. Only 7% of woodlands and 25% of peatlands are reported as being in a good ecological state. These habitats are crucial for carbon storage, and can be harnessed to help fight climate change. The report illustrates that although the UK leads the world in biodiversity monitoring, it has less than half of this remaining.

Although the problems faced and the solutions needed are well understood, large scale action is clearly lacking and restorative work to bring degraded habitats to life needs to be replicated and expanded, says the report.

Farming must shift to regenerative models, developments must build nature into the way we plan our homes and infrastructure, and polluters must pay and invest in nature, demanding behaviour change in every corner of society and every inch of the economy - says Richard Benwell, chief executive of the Wildlife and Countryside Link, describing the figures in the report as "heart-stoppingly horrible". Environment Secretary, Therese Coffey, in response to the report, said the Government has legally committed itself to protecting 30% of the UK's natural environment by 2030 with an Environmental Improvement Plan to create and restore at least 500,000 hectares of new wildlife habitats, starting with 70 new wildlife projects including 25 new or expanded National Nature Reserves."

Let's hope the political parties put the money in to make this actually happen. At a local level we can all help nature - in our gardens, along our roads, in our ponds, in the decisions we take to fight for nature in our own ways. As Chris Packham says "this is our time. So, it doesn't matter whether you're into bats, bumblebees, butterflies, birds, bugs or badgers – **ultimately, we need to come together.**"



Local Farmers respond to last month's HUGS item . . . We, the working farming communities of the Hagbournes would like to express our disappointment at the article by the HUGS group in the November magazine - which demonised the chemical Glyphosate (brand name Roundup). We need to offer this counter argument in defence of this very important product.

Glyphosate is a broad-spectrum herbicide, and the world's most reliable and safest weedkiller. It has been used in agriculture, sports grounds, public spaces, and private gardens for over 40 years now. Its use has been vital in agriculture to help create seedbeds that do not need extra carbon producing cultivations such as ploughing and discing. Many farmers are now practising regenerative farming - where a winter cover crop is sown (and often grazed by sheep) and then destroyed using glyphosate (Roundup). This then means that a cereal crop can be directly drilled into the ground without any need for cultivations. This chemical, used correctly, does NOT degrade the soil.

A typical on-farm dose of glyphosate would be just 2. litres per 150 litres of water --a miniscule 1.35% of chemical in the tank mix. Many of us use 200 litres of water to 2.0 litres of glyphosate - just 1% of chemical in the mix .

The key, as with most things, is using the product sensibly and within the guidelines. If you think about how little chemical should be used in a watering can of water it is clear to see that many gardeners are using too much. This has also been the case with slug pellets - which have been used in far too large quantities in gardens over the years. Similarly - many pets are being treated for fleas and ticks - whether they need it or not. This treatment often contains neonicotinoids - and traces of this product are now being found in watercourses-particularly in cities -due to over dosing .

The use of glyphosate on farms is absolutely vital in crop production. Without it UK agriculture would add the equivalent of 12 million tonnes of CO2 to the atmosphere each year--the equivalent of emissions from 2.5 million new petrol cars-through the added use of machinery, and bringing more land into production to enable current yields to be maintained.

The use of glyphosate has helped nature friendly farming - fewer cultivations help earthworms thrive and ensure ground nesting bird habitats are not disturbed.

We could continue this over some pages -but will finish with the following:

The International Agency for Research on Cancer has said that drinking hot drinks and working night shifts "are as likely to cause cancer as glyphosate". Similarly, too much sunlight, baking soda, table salt, and caffeine are more likely to cause cancer than glyphosate.

We enjoy the HUGS articles in the magazine - let's all be friends and keep working to protect the beautiful environment in which we live.

Comments from the East Hagbourne Parish Council Chairman

County and District collaboration in clearing channels of weeds Just recently we had a very interesting meeting with officers from both county and district, who are both responsible for the edge of the road by the kerb or verge, the area that is now termed the channel, so no longer the gully or gutter! The district is responsible for cleaning including the road sweepers and the county for all other matters. For these officers it was the first time they had discussed their complementary roles. Together they plan on helping the village clean up the channels on Main Road in a sustainable and environmentally friendly way.

At the same meeting, the Fix My Street patrol joined us and confirmed that efforts would be made to get SGN (Southern Gas Network) to replace the historic stone steps at the foot of Bakers Lane. Other good news at this meeting was that the footway repairs by the Fleur should be done soon and that dropped kerbs would be installed in Kingsholm Close at no cost to the Parish Council.

Footpaths We really are blessed with a rather large infrastructure of footpaths in the village most of which are used by villagers and visitors on a very regular basis. A map of this path system, based on OpenStreetmap data, https://www.openstreetmap.org/copyright can be found in the dropbox file:

However, this blessing has a downside in terms of maintaining these footpaths. A subgroup of councillors led by Carolyn Shaikh is looking carefully at all the footpaths in this map to identify the main problem areas and to prioritise work on them. One footpath with a high priority is FP4 from Wilcher Close up the side of the allotments to join the Sustrans path. One possibility that the Parish Council is currently investigating is to get this work part funded by a grant so that we can ask OCC to install a completely new path.

Housing development by the Village Hall Hopefully by the time you read this, there will be access for anyone through the site onto the railway embankment. The ramp will be immediately accessible, and the steps will also be after handrails have been installed. Many people have asked if Deanfield will make good the damage done to Main Road outside the site. This is in fact a requirement of the planning permission and will be done under an S273 agreement with OCC. Deanfield's current plan is to do this during the school Easter holidays next year.

They are also re-seeding some areas by the embankment and planting a few shrubs to replace those that were removed for the construction of the two accesses. Deanfield have also installed a number of bat boxes and bird boxes (including swift boxes) in the houses.

Half of the 44 houses marketed directly by Deanfield have now either been sold or are reserved. The 30 affordable houses are managed by the Housing Association Fairhive Homes from Aylesbury and allocation will be carried out by SODC. The first residents should be arriving towards the end of January.

Parish Surgeries As it is now the season to be jolly, I think the Fleur might just be too lively for a surgery in December and I suspect most people's main thoughts at this time are unlikely to be parish concerns. However, feel free to contact me (iain.duff@easthagbourne.net), the clerk or any other councillor should you have urgent concerns.

Parish Council meetings Parish Council meetings are held in the Pavilion on the Recreation Ground. Members of the public are welcome to join the meeting and the agenda is posted on village notice boards and the village web pages at least three clear days before the meeting. The next meeting will be held starting at 7.30pm on Thursday 7th December. Let me remind you that this is not a formal or even approved article from the Parish Council but is rather a few words from me. 
