

Rector's Reflections 40 Days and 40 Nights

Do you enjoy singing? In the Christian tradition, there are certain hymns which tend to be sung at particular times of year. One of the hymns which is often sung during Lent begins as follows: "Forty days and forty nights Thou was fasting in the wild; forty days and forty nights tempted, and yet undefiled".

The season of Lent will soon be upon us. It starts on Ash Wednesday, which this year falls on 22nd February. Lent is, of course, the time of preparation before Easter. The words of "Forty days and forty nights" seek to make a direct connection between the forty days of Lent, and the forty days when Jesus was tempted in the wilderness. But this is only one way of looking at the spiritual significance of the season.

Down the centuries, Christians have observed the season of Lent in many different ways. For some Christians, the season has been about giving something up - this is what "fasting" means. We might give up a particular type of food or drink, for example chocolate or alcohol.

Other Christians observe the season by taking on some additional commitment, for example reading a spiritual book or giving money to a charity. Of course, it is possible to do both: to give something up and also to take on some new commitment. I wonder what your custom has been. Do you give things up or take on new commitments? I think the old tradition tended to focus on giving things up, and the newer tradition tends to focus on taking on new commitments; but both traditions have their value, and both have their limitations.

Indeed, there is no obligation to keep Lent at all. We're not going to get into trouble with God if we ignore Lent. But Lent, in common with other seasons in the Church's year, provides us with an opportunity to reflect on how we are choosing to live our lives, and the encouragement to make changes for the better. That is why Christians have traditionally chosen to give something up during Lent, or to take on a new commitment. The choices we make during Lent are designed to make a positive difference to our lives, and to the lives of those around us.

I wonder how we might choose to keep Lent his year? How might we make a positive difference to the world around us? $\mathcal{F}ather\ Jason$

Travel with us to Narnia and Middle-earth this Lent

In the 1930s and 40s an informal group of like-minded Christian academics met frequently in Oxford to share and discuss their writing. They were known as 'The Inklings'. Two of them, CS Lewis and JRR Tolkien, have become world famous as authors of profound Christian insights and imagination. However, 75 years later, in our more diverse age, we might well ask if they still have anything to teach us.

Our four-week Lent course explores themes suited to Lent from the work of 'The Inklings', particularly Tolkien and Lewis. Come to learn more about the themes of Middle-earth and Narnia, stay for friendly discussion and time for reflection. We believe 'Lent with the Inklings' will have something to say to Christians as well as those who wouldn't give themselves that label. You are welcome to attend any (or all!) of the sessions.



10.30am, Sunday, 5th February at St Andrew's.


Christingles are made using oranges and a few other bits, as you choose. The candles are lit at the end of the Service to spread a magical glow around everyone. All welcome to this special Service.

Wednesday Church: who are we and what are we for?

Why do we call ourselves 'Wednesday Church? The name was suggested back in 2011 when we began to meet on the first Wednesday of each month. A number of us from several different churches in the Didcot area, St Peter's and other C of E churches, Methodists, Baptists, and people from the King's Church, were concerned that there did not seem to be any provision for adults with special needs to meet and worship together.



So, we have been meeting at St Peter's Church in Newlands Avenue since March 2011. St Peter's is an easily accessible modern building which is ideal for our purpose. Our members are adults of all ages who come because they want to and are brought in by their carers from several Day Centres around the area. They are welcomed with drinks and biscuits and various craft activities until 11am when we go into the church for our worship. Our members contribute to our worship in many ways: lighting candles, ringing the bell, singing, making suggestions for thanksgiving and prayer. Sometimes we include percussion, wave streamers or dance! Even those in wheelchairs can join in! We have been very glad to see friendships developing between members from different communities and the concern that they show for each other.

Local churches have supported us generously and we have been able to buy our own projector so that we can prepare PowerPoint presentations to show the words and pictures that help us to focus our worship. The songs and prayers are projected onto the wall and Rosie Jackson Kilham interprets them with Makaton signing for those who appreciate that help.

In the early days we used to hire a special coach in July to go on an outing to somewhere like the Cotswold Wildlife Park, but recently the Day Centres are wanting to take their people back for a proper cooked meal at lunch time and so now we have a Garden Party at St Peter's with sideshows and so on which is very popular. We would normally expect between forty and fifty people at our meetings but from time to time we have had up to seventy or more. **Our team continues to be ecumenical with many different skills. We welcome everyone and have many friends. Do drop in and share our worship sometime. It's fun Jenny Loder.**

Midweek Communion Everyone welcome to the Midweek Communion at **St Andrew's**, **Hagbourne** every Wednesday at 10am. This is a said Communion Service without hymns and the opportunity to stay for a coffee or tea afterwards and a chat. For the safety of others, please consider wearing a face covering. **This is a popular Service – all welcome.**



Hagbournes and Upton Group for Sustainability

Citizen Science

Did anyone take part in the one-hour RSPB BIG GARDEN BIRD WATCH at the end of January? If you did, you're one of around a million people joining in. On this scale, citizen science provides an enormous source of data that would otherwise not be collected. Taking part really is making a difference to our understanding of changes in our bird populations.



If you're keen, you can also log in and look back over the last 6 years of your own Bird Watch and notice if you saw less starlings perhaps and more blue tits and great tits over that time. Some birds are faring much better overall with climate change so far than others.

And if want to do more, you can join in with many other surveys. If you're interested in flowers and therefore nectar for pollinators, have a look at Plantlife's Every Flower Counts https://nomowmay.plantlife.org.uk/every-flower-counts/. This is done on an area of lawn in your garden at the end of No Mow May and again in the beginning of July.

If you remember the 1970s and 80s and the sheer number of insects you could see in the car headlights while driving at night, then take a look at Buglife's Bugs Matter survey https://www.buglife.org.uk/get-involved/surveys/bugs-matter/ It involves attaching a splatometer on your car's cleaned front registration plate and counting the number of insects for each trip you make in the car over the summer (photos to be submitted with each journey you record).

If you prefer your insects alive, then Butterfly Conservation's Big Butterfly Watch may be for you. https://bigbutterflycount.butterfly-conservation.org/ This is just 15 minutes of a warm July or August day watching and recording butterflies in your garden or local area.

Not sure where to start? iNaturalist will help identify any species you photograph so you can begin to learn hands-on what nature is living around us https://uk.inaturalist.org/ **Do get in touch and tell us what you find!**



Comments from the East Hagbourne Parish Council Chairman

Housing development by the Village Hall With the roofs now on some of the houses, this development is very real, and Deanfield suggest we will welcome our first residents before the end of May. I know that some villagers have shown an interest in the houses for themselves or family members. For the market houses, the best port of call is the sales office (aka Marketing Suite) on the site itself. However, 30 of the 74 units will be affordable housing, with 22 for rental and 8 for shared ownership. Allocation of these housing units will be managed by Fairhive Homes, a Housing Association in Aylesbury.

If you have been walking under the embankment at the end of Lake Road, you will have seen some building there. Not more houses but part of the infrastructure for the drainage system for the site. All structures that side of the embankment will be underground when completed.

The survey also asked your opinion on possible traffic calming measures should they be deemed necessary. If your household did not receive a copy of the survey or the dog has eaten it, please contact the Clerk to get a copy.

PHOTO ID REQUIRED TO VOTE AT UPCOMNG ELECTIONS



As noted in the Chairman's letter, the local elections for East Hagbourne parish are happening on 4th May. One important thing to note is that the government has introduced a requirement for voters to show photo ID when voting at a polling station at some elections.

This will apply for the first time at the local elections on Thursday 4th May 2023.

Accepted forms of photo ID will include, but are not limited to, passport, driving licence (including provisional license), disabled parking blue badge, certain concessionary travel cards and proof of age cards with a PASS mark. You can still use your photo ID if it is out of date, as long as it looks like you.

Anyone who doesn't have accepted photo ID can <u>apply on the government's website</u> now for a free voter ID document, known as a Voter Authority Certificate. The deadline to apply for voter ID for this election is 5pm on Tuesday 25th April.
