

Rector's Reflections On the Road to Damascus

Have you ever heard the phrase "a Damascus Road experience"? It's a phrase that's sometimes used to describe a time when someone has had a dramatic change of mind on an important issue. Something has happened which has led them to see things in a totally new light.

The phrase refers to one of the best-known stories in the New Testament. Saul of Tarsus was travelling to Damascus, intent on arresting the Christians in the city. As he approached the city a light from heaven suddenly flashed around him, and he heard a voice saying to him, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" This event became a turning point in Saul's life: he no longer persecuted Christians but became a Christian himself. He became known as Paul, and as Paul, became one of the greatest missionaries the Church has ever known. The event on the Damascus Road is sometimes referred to as the Conversion of St Paul, and it's celebrated every year on 25th January.


January is often a time of new beginnings, when we think about how we might change our own lives for the better. Such New Year resolutions are often things that we hope will make a small, but significant, difference. Perhaps we are resolving to take more exercise or learn a new skill.

But are we willing to make a major change in our lives? Major change requires insight, courage and will-power. It's not always easy to see where we need to make a major change in our lives - this is where we will need insight. And any major change will take us away from familiar ways and patterns of behaviour - this will take courage. And it will take hard work. Major change takes effort and commitment. Perhaps this is where most attempts at major change fail: we simply don't have sufficient will-power to the make the change happen.

So, we spend most of our lives struggling with those small changes which are of course all for the good, but hardly life changing.

Might this year be the year when we are open to the possibility of a different sort of change? Might this year be the time when God is calling us to make a fundamental change in our lives? Might this year be the year when we have our Damascus Road experience?





HAGBOURNE FUN RUN AND WALK

It has been a frustrating year for the Fun Run Committee – knowing that the charities we support are in greater need than ever, but unable to raise funds for them. Will there be a Fun Run in 2021? Well, I doubt very much that we could hold such a mass participation event in Spring, but if vaccination rolls out successfully, we hope to be able to do it later in the year. So, the good news is that, if you start now with your New Year's resolution to get fit, you will have plenty of time to train: it could be a good year for recording a personal best, or breaking the Fun Run record! (Conversely, the bad news is you have no excuse!)

There are plenty of fitness videos online (including yoga for the non-runners), so you can train from the safety of your living room. If you are planning to jog or run out around the villages, do please remember to give others using the paths their 2m space.

The two charities we support are Cancer Research UK and the **East & West Hagbourne Village Fund**. The Village Fund is a modest pot of money available to support local good causes, funded entirely by the Fun Run and donations made on the day. It was set up in March 1995 with the objective "to provide a contingency fund of money for the villagers of East and West Hagbourne." This can be funds to assist villagers quickly in times of need, or to provide an item / facility to benefit the villages. Applications have to be made in writing [email is fine]: they are considered on their merits by the Village Fund Committee (basically the Fun Run Committee members) who decide whether funds should be awarded and how much.

In the past we have supported such diverse causes as the defibrillators, the village hall extension, an educational course, posters for a local campaign, and family support for medical treatment.

Of course, the Covid pandemic has caused much financial hardship in the last year, and continues to wreak havoc. If you need a little help, or if you are aware of any residents of the two villages who are in need at the moment, please do contact us. Citizens Advice can guide you through a claim for benefits

As the cold weather closes in with biting frosts and long, depressing hours of darkness, the combined effects of the pandemic and financial problems threaten to drive us into a pit of total despondency. But if lack of money is your problem, take heart because there could be a way to take control of the situation: you might be entitled to receive benefits and Citizens Advice can help you all the way.

If you are unemployed, have a low income, an illness or disability, or are caring for somebody, you could get Universal Credit. This also applies to the self-employed. The amount you might get depends on your individual circumstances. Always do a benefits check before starting an application. Don't forget that if you need help with paying Council Tax you need to apply to the District Council.

Even if you are not a UK citizen you might be able to get some benefits, and if you already receive benefits, you could get more because of Covid-19.

All the information is on the Citizens Advice website https://www.citizensadvice.org.uk. Also have a look at the government website www.gov.uk where benefits rules are signposted on the home page. There are some reliable online benefit calculators like benefits-calculator.turn2us.org.uk In order to apply for benefits you will need to assemble all the relevant information: details of your bank or building society accounts; your income, e.g. payslips and savings; and proof of identity.

Citizens Advice has a dedicated "Help to claim" team to get you started on claiming benefits. Phone us on 0800 144 8444 (Mon-Fri 0800 to 1800) or use webchat (same hours). Appointments in person are not available at present.



Tower Talk The Alternative Christmas Tree Festival was a great success this year with trees appearing throughout the Hagbournes. The ringers sponsored one of the four-foot trees and it was one of two decorated trees to be on display in the church, the other being the Knitwits Tree.

Comments from the Parish Council Chairman

2020

As this sad year comes to an end, we can reflect on a year where many things progressed as normal or nearly so while other things just did not happen. We held our normal quota of Parish Council meetings this year (12) although ten of these were held online. We accept the minutes of the previous meeting at the beginning of the next meeting so that a draft can be posted on the village web page (Go to Parish Council/Meetings Minutes & Agendas to see them). They will be formally signed when we next have a face-to-face PC meeting.

For some people their only interaction with the Parish Council is when they submit plans for extensions or are the neighbours of such submissions. There were 23 applications in 2020 of which the Parish Council only objected to two although we made detailed comments on a few others. Sometimes our comments affect the conditions that the planners include when granting the application so we feel this is a useful exercise even if we are not objecting to the plan. On other occasions, the plans are slightly altered after a discussion between applicant and planners. I always try to visit the site of any application, to speak personally to the applicant and any immediate neighbours, even if the plan does not seem very controversial. One concern is to ensure that the neighbours are aware of the plans since occasionally SODC have not been able to contact them. Of course, this has been difficult and sometimes impossible because of lockdown restrictions this year, but at least there has been no bar on inspecting site applications from roads and footpaths.

In addition to responding to individual plans, the Parish Council have also submitted comments to a number of consultations for planning and infrastructure at national and regional levels. One major casualty of the pandemic has been that we were unable to hold the Annual Parish Meeting this year. This really must be face-to-face so we hope that it will be possible to hold the 2021 meeting even if it needs to be delayed by a month or two. We will then be able to discuss priorities for village projects, some potentially quite major, but the Council would welcome comments at any time on the draft for these that is on the village website https://easthagbourne.net/parish-council/projects/

Two of the major issues during this year have been the plan for 74 dwellings on the field beside the Village Hall and the SODC Local Plan both of which I comment on below.

At the PC meeting in December, the Council decided to keep the precept unchanged so that there will be a small reduction in the parish tax element for next year because of a slightly larger tax base.

District Planning

The very long running saga of the South Oxfordshire Local Plan 2035 came to an end on 10th December when the District Council voted to adopt the plan. This has of course been highly controversial, but with its adoption we feel that there should be no further building sites allocated in the Didcot area including the gaps between Didcot and the Hagbournes.

Of course, there is still very significant building going ahead in Didcot in Valley Park, the North East, and Ladygrove East so our hope now is that some funding, which should be available because of the local plan adoption, can be used to mitigate the effects of the increasing traffic from these new developments. The first real test of the Local Plan will be the Appeal judgement on the Sandringham Road proposal by A2 Dominion that we are told has been delayed by the Inspector pending the decision on the local plan.

Housing Development by the Village Hall

A full survey of the main village drainage system was conducted by Lane on behalf of Deanfield Homes on 23rd November. This survey did identify one or two areas of possible concern including the blocked entry to the Main Road culvert that caused flooding in mid-November. The access point to this part of the culvert was cleared of leaves by OCC and is no longer blocked although it may need more remedial work. Both this and the culvert under the Harwood Road allotments are being investigated further between Christmas and New Year. With the drainage system hopefully in good order, we await the ruling from SODC drainage as to the system proposed for surface water collection and disposal for the development.

If this is felt appropriate and safe, then the developers, Mactaggart and Mickel and Deanfield Homes, would then anticipate acceptance of the Reserved Matters plan and building could possibly commence as early as next Spring.

Parish meetings

The Parish Council will continue to hold Parish Council meetings on-line and, as in normal times, members of the public are welcome to join the meeting through the Zoom link that will be included on the agenda. The next meeting will be held starting at 7.30pm on Thursday 21st January.

I have cancelled my face-to-face surgeries but am very willing to talk on the telephone or online with any parishioner. You can get details of how to do this by phoning 07891 551851 or emailing the Parish Clerk (easthagbourneparishcouncil@gmail.com).



The route and larger size timetable can be found on the East Hagbourne website.


