

Rector's Reflections A Special Gift

Have you ever received a really unusual gift? I have received several unusual gifts over the years, and I have one of them sitting on my desk in front of me as I write these reflections. The item in question is about the size and shape of a pack of frozen peas. It is wrapped in clear plastic, so its contents can be clearly seen.

There is a simple sticker on the front, which reads: "Omani Frankincense Hojari". Yes, it is a packet of frankincense, all the way from Oman. It was given to me a gift by a couple from one of our local congregations, who went on holiday to Oman a few years ago. I certainly rank this as one of the more usual gifts I have received, and I treasure it.

Why do I treasure it? In part, because it is a sign of love. The presents we give and receive are so often an expression of love. As people often say about gifts, "it is the thought that counts".

But there is another, and deeper, reason why I treasure the gift of frankincense. It brings me back to one of my favourite Bible stories: the story of the Magi or Wise Men, and their journey to Jesus. This story is traditionally read in Church on the Feast of the Epiphany, which is celebrated on or near 6th January.

There are many different aspects to the story of the Magi, but the one I wish to write about today is the story of the gifts given to the baby Jesus. As you will remember, three gifts were given: gold, frankincense and myrrh. Down the centuries, much has been written about why these particular gifts were chosen. Frankincense is connected with the offering of prayer to God: in many religions, incense is burnt as part of worship, and the aroma and smoke is seen to symbolise our prayers going up to God.

So, when I see the packet of frankincense resting on my desk, I am reminded of the visit of the Magi to the baby Jesus, and in particular of the offering up of prayers to God. I don't think God minds the words we use in our prayers, and He quite understands that sometimes we're not quite sure how to pray about something which lies on our heart or mind. But I think God really appreciates our efforts, however imperfect. I wonder what He might like us to pray about, as we enter the start of a New Year?

Home Communion is available to anyone who is unable to get to Church through sickness or frailty, either for a short time or on a long term basis. If you, or anyone you know, would like to receive Holy Communion at home, over Christmas or at other times, please contact the office 01235 850267 and Elaine will arrange it for you.



Christingle Service at St Andrew's Sunday, 19th January at 10.30am

The word 'Christingle' actually means 'Christ Light' and celebrates the light of Jesus coming into the world. The orange is round, like the world; the candle gives us light in the dark, like the love of God; the red ribbon goes round the 'world', as a symbol of Christ's blood, given for everyone; the four sticks point in all directions, and symbolise that God is over all: North, South, East and West; and the fruit and nuts remind us of God's blessings.

HUGS - Hagbournes and Upton Group for Sustainability

Top tips for a wildlife happy garden! Many thanks to Vicky – our HUGS wildlife gardener of the year in 2021 – for these great winter tips to create ideal homes and look after the wildlife in your garden.

Keep their homes warm! Leaves on your flower beds provide habitat for small insects. More insects in your garden in spring and summer means more food for the birds – and more birds! Make sure not to leave leaves on the plant crowns where they can cause rot. Curled up leaves are also ideal homes for hibernating ladybirds and leaves also protect the soil from frost and rain. A win-win result for everyone!

Create a blackbird heaven! Vicky keeps her apple windfalls on a tray in the garden outside in a cool spot and puts them out gradually over the winter, attracting large numbers of blackbirds – and the occasional fox!

Bee nice - Mahonia — an early food source. Vicky is an ardent fan of Mahonia - a trouble free plant on any soil with lovely flowers, tolerant of windy areas (even Upton!) and an early bloomer — a valuable early source of nectar for bees as well as providing berries later in the year for birds.

Mindful tidying - plus 5 star hotels for wildlife! Vicky says she removes slimy leaves from plants but leaves the drier perennials for insects and for food for birds until the spring when plants start growing strongly again. Cotoneasters, pyracantha, ivy, hawthorn – all provide 5 star homes in her garden for birds and small animals.

Tree time! Bird beacons! Vicky's garden is full of trees which provide perfect homes for birds. Any tree over 2m is a real beacon for them. Hazel is great for birds and insects and is easy to cut back, says Vicky.

And finally ponds! - the best thing since Vicky has multiple small ponds in her garden. Even a small pond is a valuable source of water, food and habitat – a real haven for wildlife - just make sure small creatures can get out – leave some overhanging plants or some stones they can climb up on, to get out of the water.



Comments from the East Hagbourne Parish Council Chairman

Firstly, let me wish you all a very Happy New Year.

Flooding Perhaps the strongest memories of last year were the unprecedented flooding in the village, making some roads impassable and flooding many homes, some of which had never suffered in this way before. It was truly the worst year in anyone's memory with storms from Henk near the beginning of the year to the recent Darragh causing havoc in the county. Perhaps this is compensation for the number of years we have witnessed storms in the north from our cosy armchairs. The only silver lining has been that it has really awakened our local authorities, particularly the County Council, to revise and strengthen both the warning system and the response so, although we may continue to have bad storms, we may be better prepared to deal with them. When the Parish Council receives a warning from SODC or OCC, it now posts these on Facebook and sends them to the Mailchimp email list and also to a flood group in the village set up after storm Henk. Some information on how messages are cascaded can be found in our revised Emergency Plan on the village website.

The ground saturation and increase in water table levels has also led to much distress in the East and West Hagbourne Cemetery, with occasions when a lot of surface water has remained for some time after storms with particularly heavy rainfall. The geological strata has prevented the water draining away so the two councils are consulting with drainage engineers to find a solution. It will not be easy and not cheap but we are determined to find a resolution to this to avoid such a problem in the future.

Budgets At this point, it is worth saying that in addition to the large Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) fund of over 1/4 million pounds, which I have highlighted in previous magazine articles, East Hagbourne Parish Council also has a regular budget whose main income is the precept which is around £30,000 a year from the council taxes. So, while CIL money can be used fairly widely on almost any infrastructure project, we like to think of this being used to make significant changes to the village, recent examples being the construction of usable more all-weather footpaths internal to the village. I discussed other proposals last month and we will be continuing to engage with you on this during the year. However, our basic budget is very healthy and can be seen in the minutes of council meetings, so we do have funds to support remedial work that might not qualify for CIL expenditure or, if it did, would not be an imaginative way to use our perhaps once in a lifetime windfall.

Housing development opposite School A paragraph on this development has been in most parish magazines since 2020 and the building works and subsequent occupation of houses has been a major feature of the village for some time. There are now only four out of the 74 properties unoccupied and all residents have received a Welcome Pack from the Parish Council to encourage them to participate and enjoy the many facets of our village life. There is already an active community presence with a local WhatsApp group and several residents are involved in village activities. Occasionally I am asked the name of the development. There are four roads, St Andrews Crescent, Hacca Close, Roundhouse Row and Bellcote Row that will shortly be adopted by OCC but no formal name although some use the old Mactaggart and Mickel name of St Andrews Park.

New District Councillor At the recent District Council by election on December 5th, Crispin Topping was elected to join Anne Marie Simpson as our second South Oxfordshire District Councillor. Congratulations, Crispin, we look forward to working with you and benefitting from the promises made in your election material!

Parish Surgeries The next parish surgery will be in the Fleur de Lys on Friday 17th January from 5.00 to 6.30 pm. As always, feel free to contact me (iain.duff@easthagbourne.net), the clerk or any other councillor should you have urgent concerns.

Parish Council meetings The next meeting of East Hagbourne Parish Council will be held in the Community Room of the Pavilion in the Recreation Ground starting at 7.30pm on Thursday 9th January. Members of the public are welcome to join the meeting and the agenda is posted on village notice boards and the village web pages at least three clear days before the meeting. Let me remind you that this is not a formal or even approved article from the Parish Council but is rather a few words from me. Wordsearch - The story of 'Silent Night'

This much-loved carol comes from Austria, where it was first sung as Stille Nacht, heilige Nacht on Christmas Eve, 1818. It was written by Father Joseph Mohr, a young priest at St Nicholas parish church, in the village of Oberndorf bei Salzburg. As Christmas 1818 approached, he asked the local schoolmaster, Franz Xaver Gruber, to compose a melody for his carol. Gruber was organist in the nearby village of Arnsdorf, and so was happy to oblige. On Christmas Eve they presented the carol to the church during the midnight mass. The carol went on to become loved world-wide; and the version sung by Bing Crosby is the third best-selling single of all time.

Bus service to the Churchill, Nuffield and Warneford Hospitals

All donations are greatly appreciated. Thank you.

The bus to catch for any of these hospitals from the centre of Oxford is number 15 which is every 1/4 hour during the day, taking 10-12 minutes, longer at busy times. You can catch it near the entrance to the Covered Market or near Queen's Lane. Those stops work whether you're connecting from Didcot with the Thames Travel X32 or, quicker but more walking, using the train from Didcot. The set down points are announced on the bus; for the Warneford, Warneford Road; for the Churchill, Roosevelt Drive; for the Nuffield, the stop is further on, called Lime Walk, and is actually in Old Road near the Old Road entrance to the hospital. The website for the 15 is https://www.oxfordbus.co.uk/services/OXBC/15, where you can also find a useful bus map and even live information. When using the X32 to Oxford, it's also possible to connect with the 15 near the Police Station, generally fewer people trying to get on at once.
