# **Rector's Reflections The Gift of Holidays**

As I am writing this, I'm thinking of holidays. I was chatting with someone this morning, and I asked them whether they had any holiday plans for the Summer. They replied that they were looking forward to a few days in a caravan on the Gower peninsula. There was a fine beach nearby, and it was clear that it was ideal spot for their family holiday.

In case you are wondering whether I am working for the Welsh Tourist Board, there are of course so many other wonderful places to go on holiday, in this country and abroad. (Although having said this, I must admit I do enjoy visiting Wales!)

It does us a world of good to get away. We all need some rest and a change of scene.

However, I am well aware that it is not always possible for people to get away. Some people are struggling to get by on a very limited income, and there's simply nothing left over to pay for a holiday. Sometimes the requirements of work make it difficult to get away. And sometimes, people are faced with significant caring responsibilities, and these make it hard to go away. It might be technically possible for them to arrange a holiday but it can be so complicated that at the end of the day the hassle and stress simply isn't worth it.

I wonder we might be able to give someone the gift of a holiday? We might be able to help someone to get away, who simply might not otherwise have the opportunity to do so. The gift of a holiday can be something on a very small scale - for example, inviting someone to come with us on a day out. It can be a wonderful opportunity to get to know someone better, and it's so much more fun visiting somewhere as part of a small group. And if you've travelling by car, it doesn't add much to the cost.

As human beings, we are not created to live solitary existences. We need each other - for friendship, for support, and for fun as well. There is much loneliness in our society, and holidays can be an excellent opportunity to connect and re-connect with one other.

I wonder who we might take with us on our next holiday? Or our next day out? *Father Jason*



**Wildlife what's on this summer** July and August are great months to get out and about in nature. It's also summer holidays for kids and grandkids so here are some ideas for families, as well as individuals, to enjoy being outside.

**HUGS activities** Join us on our next two summer work parties on Saturday the 2nd of July and/ or 6th of August from 10-12 for some local conservation work (email <u>hugsustainabilty@gmail.com</u> for more info). Come and see us on **Saturday the 16th of July at the Hagbourne Fete** for some fun activities.

We have our <u>Wild Walk</u> route to follow with summer seasonal wildlife guide to use – see how many of our top ten birds, butterflies, moths and plants you can spot! This year SODC and East Hagbourne Parish Council are organising a Litter Bugs Trail along the route. Find out more on our <u>website</u> about how to take part.

**Make a mini-meadow** The Hagbourne Cemetery Wildflower Meadow will be cut in July and provides the opportunity for 'green hay'. This cut material is full of flower seeds that are likely to do well in the local area. Do get in touch if you'd like to arrange to pick up some green hay from us at <u>hugsustainability@gmail.com</u> All you need to do at home is to mow and remove grass cuttings then rake the ground to clear thatch and expose more bare soil ready to lay down the green hay.



**Summer in the garden** If you're enjoying time in the garden over summer, how about some wildlife gardening? Moths and butterflies need our help. Check how many plants you have in your garden that provide nectar and food for caterpillars (find the lists for moths and butterflies <u>here</u>). And then **15th July to 7th August** why not take part in the <u>Big Butterfly Count</u> and help to assess the state of our local environment by counting what you find.

## **Comments from the East Hagbourne Parish Council Chairman**

**Housing Development by the Village Hall** As you will have noticed, the activity on the site has been essentially non-existent this week (18-22 June). This is because the District Council planners decided that the preparatory work was effectively a commencement of building and demanded it was stopped until the discharge of some pre-commencement conditions. As it is expected that this should happen around the end of June, you might expect serious activity to start by the beginning of July. However, routine work on keeping the site safe and non-building activity will continue, for example the painting of the wooden panels in Deanfield blue.

One benefit of this is that more signs are now in place to avoid contractors and sub-contractors accessing the site through the centre of the village. This will include signs on the War Memorial triangle at the Lower Cross. There will be an occasional supervised and escorted access through the village but the problem that we had earlier will hopefully not be repeated. However, please notify the Parish Clerk of any incidents that are being logged by parish councillor Carolyn Shaikh.

On the next page of this Parish Magazine, there is a map of the site, included with the permission of SODC, that has street names and house numbers. Of course, it will be around two years before all houses are built, but this map certainly puts flesh on the bones on the largest single housing development in village history.

**20mph limit** It is great to note that the 20mph limit signage was installed on time and with relatively minimum disruption. Hopefully, the bright new signs will encourage drivers to respect the village more. The legal documentation for the new speed limit was adopted the day after the sign installation so anyone breaking the new limit could be prosecuted. Not a police priority for now, but maybe more so in the future.

**Village footways** We have been trying for the last few months to get a pilot scheme launched by OCC for resurfacing of some village footways (aka pavements). There was unexpected activity of a different kind on verges near the Fleur de Lys in mid-June. The Parish Council have requested a meeting with the appropriate Highways people from OCC to discuss these works and to press for some action to improve the state of our footways.

**Parish surgeries** Although I have not yet had my June surgery and any feedback from it, I will hold a final one before the summer from **3.00 to 4.30 on Wednesday, 20th July**. I am keeping in close contact with the builders so can hopefully answer questions on this at a time when the building should have restarted in earnest.

**Parish Council meetings** Parish Council meetings are held in the pavilion on the Recreation Ground. Members of the public are welcome to join the meeting and the agenda is posted on village notice boards and the village web pages at least three clear days before the meeting. The next meeting will be held starting at 7.30pm on **Thursday 21st July** 



	The owner or occupier of a property has a legal responsibility (Highway Act 1980 s154) to ensure that the 'public highway' adjacent to a property is not obstructed by vegetation from their property. Thank you in advance for keeping the village both beautiful and safely accessible to as many people as possible.
