

Rector's Reflections The Gift and Responsibility of Liberty

The summer is finally here - a time for holidays and outdoor parties. It is also a good time to celebrate the democratic values which mean so much to us all. On 4th July, the USA will be celebrating Independence Day, and 10 days later, the French will be celebrating Bastille Day with their customary flair.

Both of these events are an opportunity to celebrate national identity, but they are also a reaffirmation of the importance of the liberty of the individual. The American and French Revolutions of the 18th Century were, at least in part, the result of a desire to ensure individual freedoms against infringement by a largely unaccountable State. The main reason that England did not have a Revolution in the 18th century was that it had already had its Revolution back in the previous century, when it had established the constitutional principle that the State must respect the liberty of the individual citizen.

Of course, society will always impose some limits on the liberty of the individual, but within the democratic tradition, it is generally believed that such limits should be very much the exception rather than the rule, and that any limits that are imposed should be kept to the minimum.

The gift of liberty has been celebrated in the Christian tradition, and it has been felt to be important that Christian leaders develop and protect the liberty of those under their rule. There have been arguments over what this "liberty" means in practice, but the principle has been clear.

But the Christian faith has also been clear that the gift of liberty must not be misused. We are given freedom in order to care for others, rather than to oppress them. An early Christian called St Paul wrote the following words to Christians in Galatia: "you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another. For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment: "You shall love your neighbour as yourself.'"

Liberty is such a precious gift. Many people around the world yearn to enjoy the liberties which we enjoy in our country. But how are we using our precious gift of liberty? Are we using it for the benefit of all, or do we just use it for our own selfish ends? $-\mathcal{F}ather\ Jason$







HUGS July/August News

Hagbournes and Upton Group for Sustainability

Only some like it hot The Met Office has forecast a 5% chance that this summer will be cool and a 45% chance that it will be hot. June has already been hot, and May saw the highest sea-surface temperatures around the UK ever recorded since 1850. We know more heatwaves are possible because they're already happening. Last year's heatwave of over 40C was record-breaking for the UK. This heat is dangerous to human life (over 65s in particular) as we don't get to recover from daytime heat when the night-time temperature stays above 20C.

We've also had extremes of drought last summer and long spells of frost over a cold winter. If you love your garden, it's been a tough year. And it's been even tougher for the wildlife in our gardens and beyond. If you want a better balance of life in your garden and work for yourself, read Alys Fowler's <u>article</u> and consider no digging, forgetting fertiliser, listening to what your weeds tell you about your soil and make your own compost.

Having sorted out your garden, any extra help for wildlife would also be great. Leave out water for the wildlife in your garden.

And if you have nesting birds in your trees, hedges or the eaves of your house, let them be.

Avoid hedge cutting between April and September, leave any necessary tree work till autumn and delay building and DIY projects if they risk disturbing nesting birds. Continue to leave wilder areas in your garden so that insect and other life has a chance to survive too.

And as for being ready for the next heatwave, we know the UK government is woefully behind where it should be on both leading the reduction of carbon emissions and planning for climate adaptation. But we can still prepare ourselves for more extreme heat. Trees and vegetation reduce air and surface temperatures by as much as 25C. They do this via shading and evapotranspiration. So, if our houses become too hot to be in, during the next heatwaves, hopefully are gardens are full of shade and cool in comparison, because they are full of plants. If these plants are native to the UK (trees, shrubs, hedging and wildflowers) they will better support biodiversity too.



A Guided Walk to look for Butterflies in East Hagbourne - Wednesday 5th July with The Upper Thames Branch of Butterfly Conservation

Join us for a trip to the **Sustrans Track at East Hagbourne:** This is a repeat of the fascinating evening walks, exploring what butterflies get up to outside normal 'transect' hours; However, Karen Saxl has now handed over the baton to a new leader. Our route follows the disused railway track which offers expansive views over the surrounding countryside and supports an interesting flora and fauna. We will amble along the track, checking wildflowers and sun traps for 'nectaring' and basking butterflies before they go to roost. *Target species*: Marbled White, Small Blue and other butterflies of the wider countryside.

Comments from the East Hagbourne Parish Council Chairman

Wilding v Tidiness One of the main issues that I hear about in my surgeries and in general discussion in the village concerns the balance between wilding and tidiness. This is indeed a debate happening at national as well as local levels. Over the last couple of months the Parish Council has had many letters supporting a wide range of opinions on this.

On the one hand, there is the campaign to support biodiversity through encouraging growth of wild flowers to encourage and support the animal population of East Hagbourne, particularly insects such as bees. One aspect of this has been the recent "No mow May initiative". There is a regular article in the Parish Magazine by HUGS (Hagbournes and Upton Group for Sustainability) that addresses these issues.

On the other hand, there are those who feel that this leads to a very untidy village and recall the days of the best kept village competition and our appearance in the finals of England in Bloom in 2009. They feel that wilding makes the village very untidy and can sometimes block footpaths and compromise safety. It would be ideal if we could accommodate the interests of all residents through a well-managed approach to achieving a balance between wilding and tidiness.

At its meeting on Thursday 22nd June, the Parish Council decided to try to move forward to achieve this balance. It was felt important to establish clearly what the current situation is and what is the role of the Parish Council in this. Thus, a detailed map of the village will be circulated to all households where the responsibilities for the upkeep of public areas in the village will be clearly defined. This will include current grass-cutting regimes for verges and public spaces. There will also be a short survey to help plan an open meeting on this topic that is tentatively scheduled for 8th September.

Housing development by the Village Hall Thames Water did not connect the mains water supply during the school midterm but have extended their current supply to the site through a temporary holding tank to enable the first residents to arrive starting from mid-July. Thames Water plan to install the full system in August during the school holidays since the work will involve traffic light control and perhaps some road closure.

Communications Some councillors use their personal email addresses for parish council business while others have set up a separate account for this. The local association of parish councils (OALC) recommend having separate and identifiable accounts for this and so the parish council at the June meeting decided to set up addresses of the form: name.surname@easthagbourne.net. These will be broadcast fully when it has been implemented.

The parish clerk sometimes sends a broadcast on the village Facebook pages. Since there are many villagers who do not use Facebook, these broadcasts are also sent by email to an address list held in the mailchimp system. If you wish to be so notified, an easy to complete form is available on the village web site or by going directly to https://mailchi.mp/9791c642ed24/ehpc. Please note that your email will not be shared with any other people or used for purposes other than sending communications from the Parish Council. Normally, you should expect no more than about one message each week.

Parish Council meetings Parish Council meetings are held in the Pavilion on the Recreation Ground. Members of the public are welcome to join the meeting and the agenda is posted on village notice boards and the village web pages at least three clear days before the meeting. The next meeting will be held starting at 7.30pm on Thursday 20th July. Let me remind you that this is not a formal or even approved article from the Parish Council but is rather a few words from me. Thus anything in this article should not be construed as coming from or endorsed by the Parish Council.

VEGETATION AND FOOTPATHS



Grass cutting and verges are a current issue on the Parish Council's priority list, with planned public consultation on the matter in the coming months. The village is lush and green after the recent sunshine and showers and concerns over accessibility throughout the village have been raised. The recent cut of the verges through the village has hopefully alleviated some of these concerns.

However, residents do have a legal responsibility (Highway Act 1980 s154) to ensure that the 'public highway' is not obstructed by vegetation from their property, so please ensure you trim or tie back planting on your property boundaries regularly, particularly if they are alongside a public footpath. Thank you in advance for keeping the village both beautiful and safely accessible to as many people as possible.

RECREATION GROUND – DESIGNATED TRIAL AREAS OF LONGER GRASS

There are currently two designated areas along the western boundary of the recreation ground that have been left uncut, to ascertain whether they could be more biodiverse in the future without impacting the recreational use of the site. The intention is to cut these again in late summer. There are notices on site to make recreation ground visitors aware of the trial. Please email the clerk if you have any feedback.




