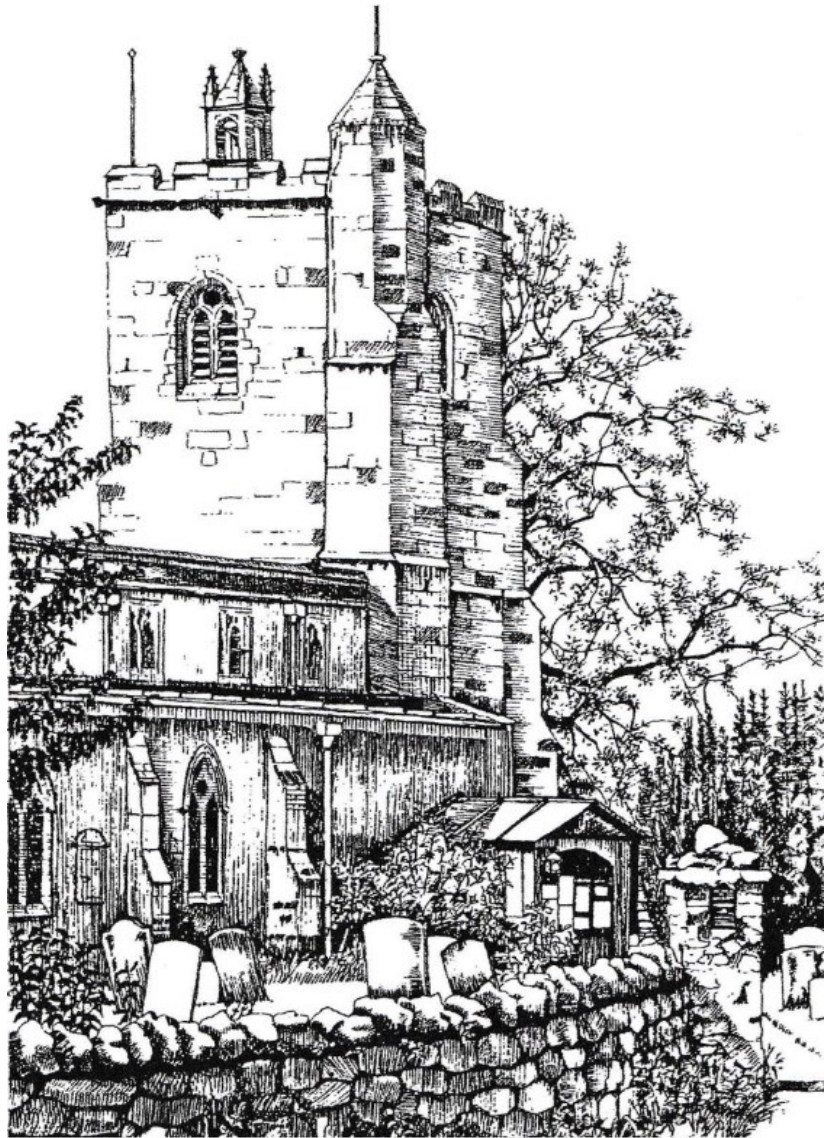

## Rector's Reflections A Scottish Island

I wonder if you have plans for a Summer holiday? Some years ago, I went on a short holiday with a group of friends to the island of Iona, a small island off the west coast of Scotland.

We drove up to Oban, and then took the ferry over to Mull. We then crossed the island, and took a second ferry over the short stretch of water which separates Mull from Iona. We happened to take the car, but it is possible to get to and from Iona by public transport.

Iona is a small but beautiful island, with plenty to see. Back in 563, an Irish missionary, St Columba, visited the island and established a monastery, which became one of the centres of Celtic Christianity. Missionaries were sent out from Iona to mainland Scotland and to the North of England. The abbey survived until the 16th Century. In the 1930s, an inspirational Scottish minister, Revd George MacLeod, had the vision of rebuilding the abbey buildings, and using the buildings as a base for a new type of Christian Community, which would seek to empower and inspire Christians to serve the needs of contemporary society. This community is known as the Iona Community, and it continues to flourish.

There are many places to stay on the island. My friends and I booked ahead and were able to stay in the abbey buildings, but there are other places to stay as well. Because the island is so well known, it attracts visitors from around the world, so it is best to book well in advance.

The island has been described as a "thin" place. What is meant by this phrase? It is meant to describe the sense of being in a holy place: many people who visit Iona feel that being on the island brings them close to God. It feels as if there is very little separating us from God – the boundary between earth and heaven feels very "thin" on this Scottish island. In short, it is a holy place.

I think it does us all a lot of good to spend some time in a holy place - a place where we feel that we might almost stretch out our hand and touch God. We don't have to go as far as Iona to find a holy place - there are holy places all around us. I do hope you will be able to spend some time in a holy place over the next month or so - a place where you can feel close to God, and can rest in God's love. It does us all a world of good.

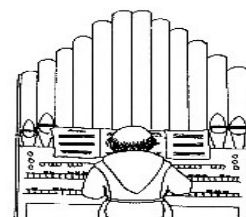
## YEAR OF THE QUANTUM

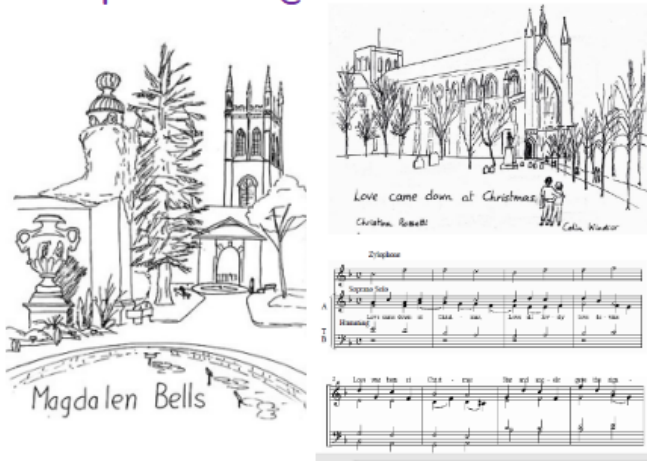

## FRIENDS OF HAGBOURNE POOL

**Our lovely pool has been an integral part of Hagbourne CE Primary School since the 1970s, helping children develop water safety skills, build confidence, and stay active.**

We're sure many readers of the Parish Magazine will have fond memories of the pool. Perhaps you were part of the original working party who helped dig the ground all those years ago? Or maybe you, your children, or your grandchildren were taught to swim there.

Currently, all Hagbourne pupils are fortunate to swim for two terms each year, from Reception through to Year 6.

The pool is also used by children from other local schools, including Blewbury and Chilton, and benefits the wider community through after-school and weekend swim sessions, baby and toddler classes, lifesaving training, local groups like Cubs and Young Farmers, and free lessons for eligible children through the YouMove initiative.

**Friends of Hagbourne Pool** is a newly registered charity (No. 1213633) set up to support and enhance the swimming provision at Hagbourne School.

**We're currently fundraising for:**

- Replacement of the pool liner, skimmers, and pool surround.
- Upgrading the outdated heating and filtration systems to improve efficiency and sustainability.

**The total cost is estimated at £34,000.** Thanks to existing funds, grants, and generous pledges, we're already over halfway there. Pupils have raised over £4,000 through two themed fundraising challenges: HMS Hagbourne (a pirate adventure) last Summer, and this year's Swimming Pool Time Machine challenge, celebrating the 150 year anniversary of the school. We hope their involvement gives the children a lasting sense of pride and achievement.

**Our goal is to complete the essential refurbishment this winter**, during the pool's closure period. Restoring the pool will ensure it remains a vibrant, inclusive space for learning, fun, and community use for years to come. With school swimming provision under pressure nationally, keeping Hagbourne's pool open helps protect access for all—regardless of background.

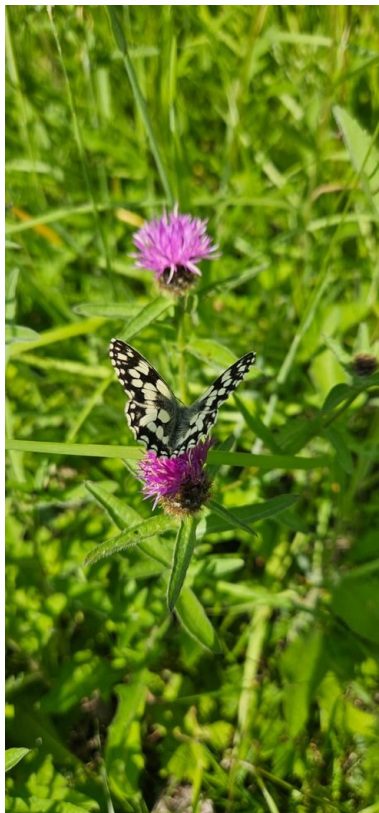

### Summer in the garden

Summer is the time to be outside and enjoying the sights and sounds of nature. What better place than your back garden? Hopefully you've been serenaded by the sound of fledgelings during May and June and will still hear more baby birds during July and August. To help them, do avoid hedge cutting until September so their nests are safe and undisturbed.

Leaving grass long and having a wild corner (or more) is also a fantastic support for birds, as they need insects (especially the young) to feed on.

Long grass is a place that butterflies lay their eggs – another reason to mow less often or not at all in some areas if you can.

If you're keen to help butterflies, have a look at the Big Butterfly Count ([bigbutterflycount.butterfly-conservation.org](http://bigbutterflycount.butterfly-conservation.org)). It's just takes 15 minutes to count butterflies and day-flying moths in your garden (on one day between the 18th of July and the 10th of August). And if you're off to the garden centre soon, a large RHS study found that the best way to help promote a healthy ecosystem in the garden is to use native plants (flowers, bulbs, shrubs and trees) and to plant them densely.

## Comments from the East Hagbourne Parish Council Chairman

**Unitary Council** For the local governance of East Hagbourne, in addition to the Parish Council, there are two other statutory councils: South Oxford District Council and Oxford County Council. Central Government have decided that local government in the future will be based on Strategic Authorities. For Oxfordshire, this means that the district and county councils will be replaced by a single unitary authority. Oxfordshire has until 28th November 2025 to submit proposals for this, with a decision expected in 2026 and the new councils in place by 2028.

Is this important and will it affect us? The answer is yes. On the one hand, it might simplify things and avoid confusion over who is responsible for what. On the other hand, unitary councils will be larger than current districts so that level of local government may be more distant. There could be compensating changes to parish councils, although nothing has been said about them yet.

Three different proposals are being prepared for submission in November. One, strongly promoted by our district council, is for Two Unitary Councils, one comprising South Oxford, Vale of the White Horse and West Berks and called Ridgeway Council and the second called Oxford and Shires comprising Cherwell, Oxford City, and West Oxfordshire (<https://twocouncils.org/home>). Another proposal, promoted by Oxford County council, is for a Single Unitary Council (<https://news.oxfordshire.gov.uk/local-government-reorganisation/#>), and a third proposal, promoted by Oxford City Council, is for Three Authorities: an expanded city, the Ridgeway Council, and Northern Oxfordshire (<https://www.oxford.gov.uk/future-local-government/greater-oxford>).

Our district council is conducting a survey to inform their proposal. This is accessible through their website (<https://twocouncils.org/home>) by clicking on "You can take part in our survey here" and then in the box "Click here to take part". The deadline for responding to this survey is 11.59pm on 16th July.

**CIL Projects - Making our Village Sparkle** Last month I focused on the category that includes footways and said that I would give more information on each other category in turn in later articles. Although I have not had feedback on my call for help with footways, I am very encouraged by a meeting that I had with our new County Councillor, Johnny Hope-Smith, who has offered to help us in our discussions with OCC on this topic. For this second article, I am pleased to focus on "Making our Village Sparkle" where some progress is already being made. I refer the reader to the Potential CIL Projects listed in our web pages and available as a paper copy from the village community shop.

The Parish Council has already acted on item c) with the lighting in the pavilion being upgraded in early August.

Councillor Cordelia Gover has been very proactive for items a), b), and d). Both the bus shelter (item a)) and the recreation ground gates (item b)) will be improved (made to sparkle!) through support from the Art Project (see below) and a proposal on cemetery seating (c)) was presented at the last parish council meeting and will be actioned at the July meeting after input from WHPC and the Cemetery Committee.

**Public Art Project** The Steering Group for the public art project, financed by S106 money from the Deanfield development, met on Monday 16th June and considered the applications from local artists to our three briefs on: the recreation ground gates, the bus shelter, and sculptures. The applications were all excellent and it was tough to select the winning candidate for each category but this was done and the recommendations were ratified by the Parish Council at its meeting on 19th June.

I have thus great pleasure in reporting that the artists chosen were:

**Recreation Ground Gates:** Julie Grose - blacksmith. **Bus Shelter:** Linda Benton - visual artist.

**Sculptures:** Alex Wenham - sculptor working in stone. These artists will shortly be liaising with the local community for input to their work to ensure it enhances our village experience.

**Parish Surgeries** The next parish surgery will be in the Fleur de Lys on Friday 4th July from 5.00 to 6.30 pm. As always, feel free to contact me ([iain.duff@easthagbourne.net](mailto:iain.duff@easthagbourne.net)), the clerk or any other councillor should you have urgent concerns.

**Parish Council meetings** The next meeting of East Hagbourne Parish Council will be held in the Pavilion in the Recreation Ground starting at 7.30pm on Thursday 17th July. Members of the public are welcome to join the meeting and the agenda is posted on village notice boards and the village web pages at least three clear days before the meeting. Although I often ask the clerk or a council member to review parts of this page, and I am grateful for any improvements, this is not a formal or even approved article from the Parish Council. 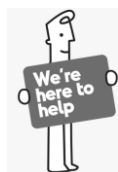

### **Bus service to the Churchill, Nuffield and Warneford Hospitals**

**The bus to catch for any of these hospitals from the centre of Oxford is number 15 which is every 1/4 hour during the day, taking 10-12 minutes, longer at busy times.**

You can catch it near the entrance to the Covered Market or near Queen's Lane. Those stops work whether you're connecting from Didcot with the Thames Travel X32 or, quicker but more walking, using the train from Didcot. The set down points are announced on the bus; for the Warneford, Warneford Road; for the Churchill, Roosevelt Drive; for the Nuffield, the stop is further on, called Lime Walk, and is actually in Old Road near the Old Road entrance to the hospital. **The website for the 15** is <https://www.oxfordbus.co.uk/services/OXBC/15>, where you can also find a useful bus map and even live information. When using the X32 to Oxford, it's also possible to connect with the 15 near the Police Station, generally fewer people trying to get on at once.

A recent report shows that there has been a 56% increase in the number of food parcels provided to families with children in the South East over five years. Locally we've seen a significant drop in donations to the foodbank.
