Rector's Reflections God Bless Her Majesty!

I wonder if you have made any particular plans for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee weekend. Our Queen's 70 years of service is a truly remarkable achievement. It is something which I am sure we will all wish to celebrate. You may or may not be aware that the Queen has a deep Christian faith.

I am sure her faith has provided a great source of strength and comfort throughout her life, and especially at times of stress and bereavement.

For centuries, there has been a very close connection between the Church in England and the royal family. This link was strengthened and formalised back in the 10th century, and our current Coronation Service can be traced back to this time. In essence, a partnership was formed between the Church and the Monarchy: the Church was expected to pray for the Monarch, and the Monarch was expected to protect the Church. This partnership has had its ups and downs over the years, but it survived the Reformation and continues to this day. Prayers for the Queen and the royal family are said regularly in churches up and down the land, and indeed in some churches they are said twice daily. There is also provision for a special service every year on the anniversary of the Monarch's Accession, although these services have largely fallen out of use in recent years.

Does this close association between the Church and the Monarchy still make sense in our democratic and multi-faith society? What do you think? The closeness of the link can have its dangers: it might-perhaps- encourage an uncritical deference to the Royal Family, and it can lead to a muddling of the necessary distinction between Christianity and Patriotism. On the other hand, the close link between the Church and the Monarchy is in practice perfectly compatible with respect for men and women of all faiths and beliefs.

Personally, I am delighted that Services will be held in churches up and down the land to celebrate our Queen's Platinum Jubilee. Whatever your religion, if any, and regardless of whether or not you would consider yourself to be at heart a Republican rather than a Monarchist, there can be no doubt at all that our current Queen is a remarkable woman, and it is surely right for us to celebrate her seventy years of selfless service.





The bus starts at Windsor Crescent, East Hagbourne at 10.15am, down Main Road to Blewbury Road and then picks up passengers from Blewbury at 10.23, Aston Tirrold at 10.28, South Moreton at 10.33, North Moreton at 10.37 and Brightwell at 10.43, arriving in Wallingford at 10.55am. A request can be made to stop at Wallingford Hospital at 10.50. Tickets cost £2 each way and you will need to register to use this service and purchase the tickets from Hagbourne Community Shop. You can use any tickets that you may still have. Covid restrictions may need to be applied and mask wearing will probably be requested. **The bus returns from Wallingford at 1.15pm**

HUGS June News

Garden Centres will no longer be allowed to sell peat-based compost from 2024 onwards. But as gardeners we can take action immediately!



We went along to Sustainable Didcot's Wild Café on May the 14th and they had a wide range of peat-free options out to look at and squeeze! Sometimes peat-free compost retains water differently to how peat composts did. However, the range available is enormous and each compost is different. We really liked <u>Dalesfoot Wool compost</u>. It comes from Lake District sheep wool and has a good structure to it for holding water and nutrients. You can pick it up from <u>Winterbrook Garden Nurseries</u> in Brightwell cum Sotwell. The nursery grows all its plants in peat-free compost. They also grow their own stock onsite from seed or cutting without importing plants. They don't use pesticides. They use harvested rainwater and it is one of the first nurseries in the UK to send plants out in cardboard Posipots so that plastic pots don't go out into the UK waste chain. Why not go and check out one of the most sustainable plant nurseries in the UK – on our own doorstep?!

We would like to thank our Tower Keeper, John Napper, for putting the flag up on the tower for St George's Day. We are all so happy that he has left it flying again this year.



On Saturday 21st May, Laura organised a Hagbourne tower ringing outing which involved a visit and ring at three towers in the local area. There were 13 ringers on the outing including learners and more experienced ringers. We all met at St Deny's in Standford-in-the-Vale at 1:45, a light ring of eight bells which proved quite a challenge for some of our learners. We then moved on to Childrey for 3:00, a ground floor ring of eight. The group were much happier ringing these bells as they were a bit heavier and easier to handle. The village was very busy as they had an open gardens day, several people said that it was nice to hear the bells as they went around the village. Our last tower of the outing was Wantage at 4:15, another ring of eight which are very similar in weight to Hagbourne bells. I think these proved to be a favourite with our learners. The group then gathered in a local pub near the church for refreshments which included beer, soft drink, tea and even a hot chocolate.

We will be ringing the bells for a Wedding on Saturday 4th June during the Jubilee weekend, a busy weekend all round! One of our quarterly meetings will take place on Tuesday 7th June in the parish room following a short ringing practice.

The 30th Hagbourne FUN RUN and WALK, 2022

The Fun Run did what it said on the tin! The many, many smiles and thanks on the day made it all worthwhile. Although it made a lot of extra work, most of the Village Hall operations were moved outside, and we followed Govt. Covid 19 guidance (which does still exist!) to protect everyone, not least our fabulous volunteers: of the hundreds of people present, only one made a negative comment, and lots of people enjoyed the outdoor space. Our new online entry worked really well, too. Huge thanks to all our helpers, both on the run organisation and the catering, and especially to our new volunteers: please come back next year!

It was the 30th Fun Run, so we were delighted to have Jenny Smith, whose husband Tony set the event up in 1990, to start the race – with her own homemade flag! Particular thanks also to Stan Eldon MBE, former GB international runner, who gave a fantastic speech at the prizegiving: he spoke about great runners he knew and competed against, and also about the rise of mass-participation events, especially the inclusion of disabled competitors, in which he has played a significant role. Everyone enjoyed it, and it was great for the class winners to receive their trophies from a world-class runner.

Numbers were a bit down, but we still had 161 running, a great mix of local and club runners and some very fast children. Andrew Humphrey won the overall title in a fine time of 24mins 51 sec.

The 60+ trophies were new – many thanks to Jeff Powell – recognition of the growing numbers of runners in that category. It is officially a 'Fun Run & Walk' and we also had 67 people - and a record number of dogs - on the walk. One of the attractive side-effects of the walk is that new connections are made between villagers, both established and new.

Of course, today just as back in 1990, the main aim of the Fun Run & Walk was to raise money for charity. **We raised just over £2000**, **a fabulous effort.** Half of the entry fees go to the East & West Hagbourne Village Fund, which exists to help villagers in time of need, and to support specific projects to benefit the villages. The rest of the money raised goes to Cancer Research UK, a very fine cause which – ultimately – touches us all at some time. Huge thanks again to everyone who joined in or volunteered. Comments from the East Hagbourne Parish Council Chairman

Annual Parish Council Meeting At the Annual Parish Council meeting on Thursday 12th May, I was re-elected by councillors as chairman and Derek Button was re-elected as vice chairman. Our office continues until the Annual Parish Council meeting in May 2023, following the quadrennial elections for the Parish Council.

At the annual meeting, in addition to normal business, we discuss many procedural matters including financial regulations and inventory of land and assets. As for all Council meetings, minutes for this meeting will shortly be available on the village website under Parish Council/Meetings, Minutes & Agendas: https://easthagbourne.net/parish-council/meetings-minutes-agendas/

Housing Development by the Village Hall Although the building will not start in earnest until after the discharge conditions plan (P19/S0334/DIS) is granted, we had a small foretaste of what is to come with work by SGN on the gas main by the entry to the site in mid May. It is still entirely possible that you will see the builders on site before you have read this article. A site manager will be assigned before the building commences and communication links will be set up with the school and the Parish Council so that any news from the site can be disseminated quickly to all parties.

We have been assured that no construction traffic will come through the central village. In addition, there should be no deliveries to site during the school in-muster or out-muster times. Of course, it is difficult to legislate for every single contractor and sub-contractor, but Councillor Carolyn Shaikh will be keeping a spreadsheet to log concerns or complaints to assist Deanfield in enforcing these requirements. So do report to the Parish Council if you feel something needs reporting.

20mph limit At the meeting "Delegated Decisions by Cabinet Member for Highway Management" on Thursday 28 April our application for a 20mph speed limit was accepted. We have just heard that the signage should be installed on Tuesday 14th June with the legal order in place the following day. Our first serious application for a 20mph limit was ten years ago so it is really great news that we will finally achieve this goal.

For the moment, the restriction will apply only to Main Road from the entrance to the village to Lower Cross, Harwood Road, Lake Road, the adopted part of The Croft, Church Close, and Kingsholm Close. However, it is not inconceivable that this limit could be later extended to New Road and Blewbury Road even though they are classified as a B road, although some criteria need to change before this could happen.

Parish surgeries Although I did somewhat better with an early evening surgery than at lunchtime, it did not bring in the hoped for big crowds However, I will give these times another go and will hold the next surgery in the committee room of the Village Hall from 5.30 to 7.00 on Tuesday 28th June.

Parish Council meetings Parish Council meetings are held in the pavilion on the Recreation Ground. Members of the public are welcome to join the meeting and the agenda is posted on village notice boards and the village web pages at least three clear days before the meeting. The next meeting will be held starting at 7.30pm on Thursday 23rd June.
