Rector's Reflections What's in a Name?

Tracing the origin and significance of names can be a fascinating activity. Take, for example, the name Barnabas. The name means "son of consolation": in other words, a person who provides consolation and encouragement to others.

I'm thinking about Barnabas because in a few weeks' time it will be 11th June, which is the day on which the Church celebrates an early Christian called St Barnabas. We don't know much about him beyond what is recorded in a book in the New Testament called the Acts of the Apostles.

This tells us that Barnabas was a Jewish Cypriot, who became a Christian and a leader in the early Church. St Barnabas worked with St Paul, and by tradition he was martyred for his faith in AD 61. As I have mentioned, we don't know much about St Barnabas, but I think we can guess a lot about his character from the fact that we are told that his name meant "son of consolation". Barnabas clearly had a reputation for bringing consolation and encouragement to the early Christian community.

I think for all of us, there are times in our lives when we need some consolation and encouragement. Perhaps we can think of people who have encouraged us in the past, or who are encouraging us now. Let us give thanks to God for them. And perhaps we can think of people whom we might console or encourage.

At the risk of making a wild generalisation, I think that there is a great shortage of encouragement in our world at large. Many organisations and workplaces provide little or any encouragement to their members and employees. No wonder there is often unhappiness and under-performance in the workplace. And the bigger the challenge we face, the more encouragement we need. We need men and women who will encourage us to tackle the really difficult issues in our communities and our world: men and women who will encourage us to keep on going and not give up. A classic example is the challenge of tackling global warming. We need men and women who will encourage us in our efforts to live more sustainable lives. It's so easy to succumb to despair when faced with something as huge as Climate Change. We need men and women who will help us move from despair to hope — men and women who will encourage us in our efforts to live more eco-friendly lives.

We can never have too many "sons and daughters of encouragement"! - Father Jason

Natural corridors

Seen from above by drone or on Google Earth, our parish consists of big blocks of fields plus smaller blocks and lines of housing. How much room there is for nature here depends on the owner. The farmer for the field and the homeowner or tenant for the garden. However, linking and dividing the fields and houses are natural corridors; the stream, hedgerows, foot paths and road side verges.

Natural corridors are vital for wildlife. Bats navigate using hedgerows, birds nest and feed from hedgerows. Hedgerows are a fantastic habitat for insects. However, hedgerows with gaps in, are much less helpful to nature. Grasses, wildflowers, and insects rely on verges which provide a continuous string of habitat and food source.

When you look at the verges along our lanes going out to Coscote and to Blewbury, they are full of cow parsley and other wildflowers through May and June. If we continue this abundance through our village and up to the long verges of Didcot, we would connect each verge for plants and insects alike.

Insects in turn, feed birds, mammals, reptiles and amphibians. Insects are a key part of the food chain and they need plants to survive. Long grass is home to butterfly eggs, grasshoppers, ladybirds and many other small insects and their larvae. Wildflowers provide nectar for our beleaguered pollinators. Many of our insects are reliant on certain plants for their survival.

Butterfly and moth species tend to rely on one type of plant to lay their eggs on, their caterpillars feeding on them. Without these plants, the insects will disappear.

Wouldn't it be wonderful if all the verges in our village could be lush and long with wildflowers and grasses? Alive with the sound of bees feeding on flowers.

From Volunteer Marian Powell: "I have lived in the village for many years, and have been a volunteer in our shop for about seven. A very happy memory for me is when our photographs as 'shop angels' were hung on our tree at the Christmas Tree Festival in the Church, and of the Bakers Dozen 2017 Calendar produced by the shop, which included baking recipes from the volunteers. I still use these recipes regularly now! It is nice to be involved in helping to keep the Community Shop going. The shop is appreciated by so many people."

Volunteer Coordinator Alice Smith has served as member of the Operating Committee for 14+ years, and her uncanny ability to engage new recruits of all ages and backgrounds has expanded and enriched our Shop community immeasurably: "Over the years the Shop has been lucky to have a wide variety of Duke of Edinburgh students volunteering on a Saturday morning. We've had twin sisters who served side by side, brothers who subbed for each other, brother and sisters, and other DOE volunteers whose mothers volunteered after the student left, including a current volunteer. Some of our volunteers serve for only one term while others stay longer. Some work part-time or go from the shop to dance or music classes. These young people have gone on to become nurses and engineers, to raise farm animals, to study in Japan. We appreciate all the hours they've given us, and we wish we knew all their stories!"

Comments from the East Hagbourne Parish Council Chairman

Housing development by the Village Hall The main works for the S278 requirements (work on road humps, yellow lines etc) will not now be done during this year's school summer holidays. As was planned earlier, the work will be done after all building is completed (summer 2024) to avoid subsequent damage.

I was asked twice recently whether the site is going to be called Deanfield Green as this is what appears in their promotional material. As I mentioned some time ago, this answer is no. Deanfield Green is just the name they use for marketing and sales and follows an internal naming convention for their sites. There will be no name globally for the estate, but there are four roads which are: St Andrews Crescent, Hacca Close, Roundhouse Row, and Bellcote Row. All have some connection with the parish and you can partly blame the parish council if you don't like them. Some alternatives suggested were far worse!

Annual Parish Council Meeting The Annual Parish Council Meeting (APCM) was held in the Pavilion on Thursday 11th May. This was the first meeting of the new council since the elections and council members: Paul Dixon, Iain Duff, Cordelia Gover, Robin Jaboor, Natalie Milner, David Rickeard, and Carolyn Shaikh, and our clerk Laura Lloyd can be seen in glorious technicolour on the village website: https://easthagbourne.net/parish-council/councillors-details/ At the APCM, I was re-elected as chairman and Paul Dixon was elected as Vice-Chairman. These elections are held every year. In addition to the normal business of the annual meeting when we conduct the annual review of council operations including membership of committees and working groups, reviews of statutory documents, and setting of dates for next year's council meetings, we had a lively contribution in the public forum from HUGS (Hagbournes and Upton Group for Sustainability), who have their own regular page in this magazine. The Parish Council agreed to one of their requests, namely to cut many areas of the recreation ground less frequently. We are planning to hold an open meeting to gauge public opinion on some of the recommendations made at the Council meeting. More on this soon.

Parish and District Surgeries The surgeries at the Fleur de Lys continue to be lively, and so I will hold the next one there from 5.00 to 6.30 on **Friday 23rd June**. Feel free, however, to contact me, the clerk, or any councillor should your concerns be more urgent. I am not sure it is because of the popularity of my surgeries but we have been told that the newly elected District Councillors: Anne-Marie Simpson and Ben Manning also plan to hold village surgeries on a regular basis. So watch this space, remembering they have a lot more money in their budget than we have!

Parish Council meetings Parish Council meetings are held in the Pavilion on the Recreation Ground. Members of the public are welcome to join the meeting and the agenda is posted on village notice boards and the village web pages at least three clear days before the meeting. The next meeting will be held starting at 7.30pm on Thursday 22nd June. Let me remind you that this is not a formal or even approved article from the Parish Council but is rather a few words from me. Thus anything in this article should not be construed as coming from or endorsed by the Parish Council.



11 Wood Street, Wallingford, Oxfordshire, OX10 0BD



There will be teas, short electric boat trips, plant sales and stalls, including a local artist, wine tasting and strawberry sales. We are sorry but no dogs please, except assistance.


