#### **Rector's Reflections - Grace before Meals**

Is it your custom to say a short prayer of thanks before you sit down to eat? Some people do, and some people don't. I can remember one occasion on which everyone present sang the grace, using the following words:

Praise God, from whom all blessings flow,

Praise him, all creatures here below, Praise him above, ye heavenly host, Praise Father, Son, and Holy Ghost.

I wonder if these words ring a bell? They come from a hymn, "Awake my soul, and with the sun", written by a 17th century Englishman, Thomas Ken. Thomas was born in 1637, and in 1685 he was appointed Bishop of Bath and Wells. Three years later, there was a political revolution, and the then king, James II, fled to France. William of Orange was invited to become the new king, and in due course he was crowned as William III, and his wife Mary as Mary II. However, the previous king, James II, was still alive.

Many people were placed in a difficult position. They had sworn their oaths of loyalty to James II: did they keep their oath to James, or did they take a pragmatic view, and swear a new oath to the new King William? Thomas felt that he could not in good conscience take the coronation oath to King William, and in due course he was deprived of his bishopric. Thomas spent his retirement living at Longleat, a guest of his friend Lord Weymouth. Thomas was a very godly man and is often regarded as one of the saints of the church. His saint's day is 8th June, and that's why I'm writing about him this month.

I'm thinking of Thomas's words, which I have quoted earlier: 'Praise God, from whom all blessings flow, praise him, all creatures here below'. We enjoy so many blessings in our life, and more often than not we take them pretty much for granted. God must look at us and say to himself: what ungrateful creatures they are! I think it would be good for us to pause, from time to time, and say a prayer of thanks to God. We might even be tempted to sing the four lines of Thomas's hymn! But it doesn't have to be anything so formal or elaborate. I'm sure God will be happy with a simple "thank you"! Father Jason.

## Basil Pryor 13th August 1928 to 1st May 2021

It is with great sadness that the Hagbournes have lost another wonderful character. Basil passed away peacefully in hospital on 1st May 2021 surrounded by his family.

He was born in Didcot on 13th August 1928, one of seven children to William and Elsie Pryor. After leaving school he worked for Gordon Bosley on his Harwell cherry farm before moving to work with dairy herds on the Cliveden Estate at Cookham and the Crown Estates, Windsor.

Following his National Service he returned to work in the family grocery business at 43 The Broadway in 1951. In 1955 he started Pryors Taxis, first living in Haydon Road, Didcot, and then moving into 3 Mereland Road. He married Gwyneth Abbott from Manor Farm in 1957 and together they worked tirelessly to grow the business. They moved to Church Close in 1974 with their three children, Jane, Caroline and David.

Throughout his life, Basil served his community in many different areas including as a retained fireman, a founding member of Didcot Rotary Club, a local and district Councillor, Mayor of Didcot, President of Didcot Chamber of Commerce, Vice-President of Didcot Boy's Football Club and Rugby Club.

Together with Gwyneth, they thoroughly enjoyed hosting the Church Fete in the garden at Highmead for 25 years. Basil was a kind and hospitable host with a wonderful sense of humour. His energy and passion for life was ever present. He leaves his 3 children and their partners, 5 Grandchildren, 3 Great Granddaughters, his sister Rosemary and brother Robin. May he rest in peace.

Basil's Funeral Service took place at St Andrew's Church on 14th May. We send our heartfelt sympathies to all his family and friends.

# HAMS = 'To a Mouse', a poem by Rabbie Burns.

Read by Iain Duff and dramatised by Doug Amos for the ODN Winter Festival 2021.



#### These are lain's reflections:

I have always had a passion for the works of Scotland's greatest bard, Rabbie Burns, who is arguably one of the most internationally celebrated poets of all time. As many of you know, we have had several Burns Suppers in the village, with the most recent being one of the last major pre-lockdown village events at the

beginning of February 2020. At this event, commemorating the poet's birth on January 25th 1759, I usually do the Address to the Haggis but that lends itself to the dinner setting and the high drama of the Burns Supper.

However, perhaps the best known of Burns' work is the poem "To a Mouse" that recounts the story of a farmer who inadvertently ploughs through a field mouse's nest and causes the ploughman poet, an epithet for Burns himself, to reflect on nature, life, and the contrast between man and mouse.

I was encouraged by Mary Hands and Doug Amos to recite this poem in front of a blazing fire whilst cuddling a glass of whisky. A feat which gave me the greatest of pleasure.

The process of filming oneself in isolation has been commented on by the previous contributors to this HAMS column and it is certainly quite bizarre to perform without any feedback, although it was easier for me than for actors who would normally be interacting directly with other actors.

However, what really made for a great production that I hope you will like in the link below, and which won a commendation from the Oxfordshire Drama Network evaluators, was the splicing of my rendering with footage of images and real mice by Doug Amos. It was brilliantly done, and I still like looking at the mouse nibbling the corn just as I am reciting "Has cost thee monie a weary nibble". I enjoyed it so much myself that I am tempted to have another dram. Truly in the spirit of Rabbie.

**Dark Skies** This month we're highlighting an issue where we can all make a difference:

for the planet

- for our pocket
- and for nature

That issue is light pollution. Light spill from our external lighting (as well as from streetlights) has a devastating affect on many different species; from birds, moths, amphibians to bats and other mammals. Artificial light at night affects animals and birds ability to function normally, from reproduction to hunting. It also makes them more vulnerable to predators.

**We** are also directly affected by bright light at night. Our sleep is disrupted which has a knock-on effect on our mental and physical health. **What's more**, it costs us and the planet to run these lights, adding to our energy use (and therefore our bills).

#### So, what can we all do to help?

- Consider how you can avoid light spill. Minimise the spread of light.
- Avoid lighting up trees that could be roosts or feeding sites for bats, owls and other nocturnal wildlife.
- Focus lights downwards just on the objects you need to see.
- Avoid blue-rich lights these pose the highest risk. If you need outside light, use low energy 'warm' light bulbs.
- Keep your garden dark: remove or switch off outside lights when not needed and ask your workplace and your neighbours to do the same.
- By turning off lights you save money, save energy use and help to save nature.

**HUGS** Readers of this Parish Magazine will be very aware of HUGS (Hagbournes and Upton Group for Sustainability) who had their first AGM in February 2021. Some people have been asking me how this is related to the Parish Council so I feel it will be useful to clarify the situation in this column. In short, there is no formal link of any kind between HUGS and the Parish Council. However, there are many areas of common interest for the two bodies.

One example concerns footpaths. These are usually the responsibility of the County Council but Parish Councils are empowered and encouraged to help with minor issues and generally to liaise with OCC concerning their upkeep.

One of the aims of HUGS is to encourage people to appreciate the countryside, so good path networks are important to them. HUGS have already worked to improve management of scrub, hedgerows and trees along footpath (197/18) from Blewbury Road to the Great Mead footpath (197/18).

The Hagbourne Environment Group (HEG) who, inter alia, organized work parties in Butts Piece, Millennium Wood, and the Cemetery, has been subsumed into HUGS. Like HUGS, HEG was not formally linked to the Parish Council, but both groups have applied for and been given small grants from the Council.

Each year at the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council, we update a review of the council operations including referencing some outside bodies that have aims that we believe support EHPC. At the APCM on 6th May this year, HUGS was added to this list (see <a href="https://easthagbourne.net/wp-content/uploads/2021/05/EHPC-Annual-Meeting-Checklist-May-2021.pdf">https://easthagbourne.net/wp-content/uploads/2021/05/EHPC-Annual-Meeting-Checklist-May-2021.pdf</a>).

**Housing Development by the Village Hall** Sometimes it feels that a step forward is accompanied by a couple of steps backwards when it comes to a final resolution to the detailed planning approval for the housing development by the Village Hall.

Following a lengthy but successful clearance of the culvert under the Butts Piece allotments, Mactaggart and Mickel are submitting a Schedule 73 application that should tidy up any loose ends blocking acceptance of the main Reserved Matters application. This Schedule 73 application mainly deals with drainage matters and should shortly be open for comment on the SODC webpages.
