

# Rector's Reflections Giving something up for Lent

I wonder if you are giving something up for Lent? In the old days, Lent was a serious business. It was associated with a time of fasting when people expressed sorrow for their sins. But times change, and so has the keeping of the Lent. It is fairly rare nowadays to hear anyone proclaiming the virtues of abstinence, perhaps because self-denial

seems quite negative concept. Nowadays, people often choose to keep Lent not by giving something up, but by taking on an additional commitment. It might take the form of giving money to a charity or attending a course to learn more about the Christian faith.

But I'm wondering whether we might still find spiritual nourishment in the old-fashioned idea of giving something up.

To start with, for most of us, our lives are probably so crammed full of activity and commitments that realistically we simply aren't able to do anything more. Perhaps we need to do less, so that we can create a bit of space in our lives – space for ourselves and for our relationships with one another. Lent can give us the permission to stop doing something. It's not that the thing we're stopping doing isn't a good and valuable thing. But we just need to give ourselves a bit more space in our lives. We can't be running at full speed every moment of every day.

Furthermore, giving something up helps us to strengthen our ability to make good choices in our lives. Our willpower is like a muscle: it needs to be exercised. Sometimes there are things we know we need to do, but we simply lack the willpower to do them. So, we need to strengthen the willpower that we do have. Some people have found that giving something up for Lent is a good way of strengthening our willpower more generally. If we have the strength to give up something fairly small, this will help us when we need the strength to make a more significant choice in our lives.

And what if we fail and give in to temptation? This can also be a helpful if painful experience, because it is a reminder that by ourselves none of us has the strength or insight we need to live the lives we ought to lead.

In short, Lent is a time to remind ourselves of our need for God.

We're very grateful for all your owl surveillance over the winter months, emailing in about the owls you've seen or heard. We're now using this information to survey areas in the three parishes. Then, with landowner permission, Lu Barton, our Owl Specialist, will be installing owl nest boxes for Little Owls, Tawny Owls and Barn Owls. Lu will then be monitoring these boxes across the year and sharing data with the British Trust for Ornithology.


The project also aims to encourage us all to be more wildlife-friendly on our land and in our gardens. So, we'll be running a wildlife garden competition this year - more information to come! We'll also be surveying our parishes for areas where we can enhance habitat: planting new trees and hedging as well as wildflowers.

We want our three parishes to be even more owl-friendly. As they are apex-predators, helping owls means helping every species in the food chain. So please do keep sending in your owl information to <a href="mailto:Lusowls@btinternet.com">Lusowls@btinternet.com</a>. If you can, please include a postcode or use the <a href="mailto:what3words">what3words</a> app on your phone, to help us get your accurate location.

Tawny owls will be going quieter for now, while they start nesting. Little Owls should start calling from now on until late June / July. And from March onwards, you might hear the screeching of Barn Owls until they start nesting too. So, lots to be listening and looking out for (and you can listen to the different owl calls on our owl page <a href="https://example.com/hugsustainability.org/owls">https://example.com/hugsustainability.org/owls</a>)

They offer specialist palliative care to those facing life threatening illness, death and bereavement in Oxfordshire, which encompasses physical, psychological, social and spiritual care and includes supporting families of patients and those close to them.

They care for around 3,000 patients and their families every year. Their mission is to enrich the lives of patients and those who love and care for them and they aim to make sure that excellent palliative and end of life care is available to everybody in our community who needs it.

# Fairtrade Fortnight 2021 Monday 22nd February to March 7th



With the next UN Climate Summit taking place in Glasgow in November 2021, it is critical we all make sure producers' voices are heard in the UK and beyond.

That is why the Fairtrade Foundation is part of the Climate Coalition, a group of over 130 organisations across the UK, working towards a truly green and sustainable world.

Fairtrade farmers are among the people who have contributed the least to climate crisis – but are already feeling the worst effects. 21 people from Cote d'Ivoire have the same carbon footprint as one person in the UK, but studies have shown that Africa is the continent most vulnerable to climate change.

Tackling climate change is at the heart of the FAIRTRADE movement, as it threatens the livelihoods of those we are working to protect. You can hear from Fairtrade farmers on the Fairtrade website:

So, when you're out shopping look for the Fairtrade Mark and know that you're supporting farmers and workers to protect themselves against the climate crisis.

Our local Community Shop will have a display of Fairtrade items during the fortnight.

Fairtrade is more than a Mark on a product. It's a call for change.

#### **Comments from the East Hagbourne Parish Council Chairman**

**CENSUS 2021** The big event of this month is the decennial census on 21st March. The census is conducted by the Office of National Statistics (ONS). This is a big event since the data from the census is used in many ways by many bodies and can have an influence on government policy and future funding. It is also a big event in that it is mandatory to complete the census although some of the questions are optional. Details of the census can be found on the website www.census.gov.uk. My comments below are obtained from this website so I have hopefully interpreted things correctly.

Every household should receive a letter containing a 16 character access code to enable online access and completion of the census. It is also possible to obtain a code for individual completion outside of a household. Paper copies of the census form can also be requested. At the moment these requests have to be made through the website but other ways of contacting ONS regarding the Census will be available from 1st March. These will include phone, webchat, email or text messages. There are also Support Centres although, at present, our nearest centre is at Rose Hill Community Centre in Oxford. Their email address is <a href="mailto:rhcc@oxford.gov.uk">rhcc@oxford.gov.uk</a>.

Right now, the Parish Council is trying to ascertain what role we and other community organizations in the village might have in assisting with the census. At the very least, the Clerk to the Parish Council will broadcast any information that we receive both on the village facebook pages and by email to our mailchimp distribution list.

There are of course several people in the village who do not access any online system. They should of course receive the letter that should offer the option of applying for a paper copy but, if you have neighbours whom you know to be in this group, it might be worth checking with them to make sure that they are able to complete the Census.

#### **Communicating information**

I am pleased that, after my comments last month, we had a significant increase in people joining our list for receiving emails. Anyone on this list will have been made aware that brown bin collection recommenced on the week of 22nd February and should continue at fortnightly intervals until further notice. My article above is hopefully an additional incentive to sign on to the distribution list. An easy to complete form for this is available on the village web site or directly by going to https://mailchi.mp/9791c642ed24/ehpc. Please note that your email will not be shared with any other people or used for purposes other than sending communications from the Parish Council. Normally, you should expect no more than about one message each week.

**Dog fouling** The dog waste bin on the Sustrans footpath on the railway embankment near to Mowbray Field and Green Close will be replaced by a much larger bin on or shortly after 1st March. There should also be an additional bin on the corner of North Croft and Wilcher Close.

**Housing Development by the Village Hall** We still await a response from the Case Officer to the RM application by Mactaggart and Mickel. As soon as anything happens, we will let people know through our facebook and mailchimp channels.

**Parish meetings** The Parish Council will continue to hold Parish Council meetings on-line and, as in normal times, members of the public are welcome to join the meeting through the Zoom link that will be included on the agenda. The next meeting will be held starting at 7.30pm on Thursday 18th March. I have cancelled my face-to-face surgeries but am very willing to talk on the telephone or online with any parishioner. You can get details of how to do this by phoning 07891 551851 or emailing the Parish Clerk (easthagbourneparishcouncil@gmail.com).

#### REPORTING ISSUES IN THE PARISH

There has been an increase in recent months of reported issues such as fallen trees, damage to verges, potholes, footpath concerns and street lighting.



The majority of these issues are the responsibility of Oxfordshire County Council or South Oxfordshire District Council and the best way to report them is using one of the websites listed below. This is important to ensure the issues are logged with the correct department and actioned.



https://www.fixmystreet.com/ allows you to report on a wide variety of issues and the reports are forwarded to Oxfordshire County Council or South Oxfordshire District Council depending on the nature of the problem. You can request updates to be sent and follow up with further comments on your post if you wish.

https://publicrightsofway.oxfordshire.gov.uk/standardmap.aspx can be used if the issue is with a countryside path or public right of way. Reports are again forwarded to the relevant departments and dealt with accordingly.

# Don't despair! Citizens Advice can help you with debt

When bills start piling up and multiplying, vague fears can turn into a paralysing panic for people experiencing money troubles.

Turn to Citizens Advice, which has eighty years of experience in pulling people back from precipices. Your burden might seem overwhelming and impossible to resolve but in reality there is a lot you can do to turn things around. Start by assembling your bills and make an overall list, with relevant details like dates when payment is due. Sort the bills into priority debts (rent and mortgage arrears, Council Tax, gas and electricity, tax and National Insurance and see https://www.citizensadvice.org/debt-and-money for a complete list) and non-priority debts (water rates your supplier can't cut you off - credit card debts, unsecured loans, hire purchases etc). Take the priority debts first and contact your creditors. Don't be afraid of this step. Many companies will be expecting you to get in touch, saying on the bill itself "We know that paying a bill can be difficult" or "Affected by Covid-19?" - and providing a telephone number or web link. Approach them with a constructive attitude, tell them you are actively tackling your debts, and perhaps ask them to suspend interest charges while you do so. They also might be amenable to letting you defer payment or pay smaller amounts over a longer time period. Ask about any special reductions – for example, the Warm Home Discount Scheme for electricity supplies (see www.gov.uk for more information).

If you need to compose a letter or email to a creditor, you don't have to start from scratch: you could copy or adapt a template letter from the Citizens Advice website. One especially useful letter asks creditors to give you more time. If your circumstances have changed you might be able to claim benefits, or extra benefits. Citizens Advice runs a Help to Claim programme (call 0800 144 8444) and can guide you through all the stages. The Turn2us website at <a href="https://www.turn2us.org.uk">https://www.turn2us.org.uk</a> will tell you what benefits you might be able to claim and has details of grants available to those on low incomes.

If you have an overdraft, talk to your bank. In the coronavirus age many banks are making concessions and charging no interest on overdrafts up to a certain amount. Contact your district council about a possible Council Tax reduction. And think creatively about ways of increasing your income. Could you rent out a spare room in your house, for instance?

Talk to a volunteer at Citizens Advice: call Adviceline free on 0800 278 7907, Monday to Friday 9 am to 5 pm or through webchat "chat with us online about debt" Monday to Friday 8am to 7pm Appointments in person are not available at present.


