Rector's Reflections Why bother with Lent?

Have you ever asked yourself the question: **why should I bother with Lent?** It's a good question to ask. To answer the question, we need to look at the purpose of Lent.

At its simplest, Lent is a time of preparation leading up to Easter. This year, Easter Day falls on 17th April, so the beginning of Lent falls on 2nd March. Lent is often associated with acts of fasting and self-denial, but these are secondary to its main purpose. Lent is fundamentally about preparing ourselves to celebrate Easter: Jesus's death for our sins on Good Friday, and his resurrection from the dead on Easter Day.

So Lent is all about preparation. This preparation can take many different forms, but whatever form it takes, it's basically about asking ourselves one question: what really matters in our lives? It's a time to reflect honestly about our lives. What are our priorities? Where are we going? Are there changes we need to make? Where might we need to seek forgiveness?

Another way of looking at this is to think about the choices we make. Looking over our lives, where have we made good choices? Where have we made choices which we regret? What choices are we currently facing in our lives? How can we make good choices? Traditionally, Christians have spoken about "temptations": a "temptation" is a word to describe a choice which we know or sense will not be good for us, or not good for others. Such "temptations" can have a strange power over us: we know that the choice will be a bad choice, but there's something in us which makes us want to do it anyway!

Jesus experienced such "temptations" in his life. After Jesus was baptized in the river Jordan, he spent 40 days in the wilderness, thinking about the choices which lay ahead. In other words, Jesus went on retreat for 40 days, to think and pray about the priorities in his life. The 40 days of Lent are intended to provide us with the opportunity for a similar period of retreat – a time to think deeply and honestly about our priorities in life, and the choices which may lie ahead.

In short, Lent is a time for us to reflect on our lives; and I think time for reflection does us all a power of good. *Father Jason*

We have received the following letter from Asylum Welcome regarding the donation made to them from monies raised at our Christmas Tree Festival. They were very happy to receive the donation and say that it will make a difference to the important work that they do.

Dear Helen, Alice, and the Hagbourne Christmas Tree Festival Committee,

Thank you so much for the absolutely incredible donation, raised through the 2021 Hagbourne Christmas Tree Festival. I can confirm that the funds have been received. We are so overwhelmed by the support of the East Hagbourne community, and this amazing donation will make such a difference to our work.

We remain exceptionally busy at Asylum Welcome. The pandemic continues to have a vast impact on our clients, and we are seeing more complex cases and urgent needs. Meanwhile, we continue to provide intensive support to around 130 recently arrived Afghan refugees, housed in a local hotel. This wraparound support has included initial support with items and urgent needs, as well as English language tuition, support with education and employment, and help to settle the children into school.

We are developing our services in response to need. We recently started a new resettlement project to resettle up to 18 families, many from Afghanistan and Syria. Our immigration work is also being bolstered with the appointment of a new full-time immigration advisor. Work is underway to become more refugee led and we are pleased to have recruited several people with lived experience including our new fundraising assistant who was a client and then a volunteer, and who is now a paid member of staff! One new arrival from Afghanistan described our support as follows, "...they welcomed us like a brother and sister, a very warm welcome... it makes me feel like we live in a castle with all the family... they support us with everything we need, and I am really thankful... My first goal is that I would like to be a bus driver."

Thank you again from all of us at Asylum Welcome. We appreciate you all so much!

Hagbournes and Upton Group for Sustainability

This is the time of year we start to get outside and think about gardening. Spare a thought for wildlife though!

The wilder side of beauty – hold off tidying your borders and flower beds until the last frosts (often in April). That makes a huge difference to insects, birds as well as other wildlife in your garden. You're leaving habitat, food and nesting materials for a host of different wildlife!

Early flowers in your lawn – crocus and daffs are now following on from snowdrops. Scientists are saying that daffodils at Easter may now be a thing of the past as climate change means long established flowering times are altered. Early wildflowers are vital for pollinators emerging early in the season. Queen bumble bees have been active in some gardens on and off from February. Leaving your lawn uncut and allowing daffodils to flower will be a life saver for these bees as well as other pollinators.

Now's the time to plan your planting - will you plant some super-friendly pollinator plants this year? Will you plan a wildlife pond? How about a mini-makeover for an unloved corner of the garden to bring more wildlife in? Have a look at our <u>wildlife gardening page</u> for more ideas!

Be an early adopter – peat will be banned from 2024, help by going peat-free now to help save the unique environments that peat is extracted from. All of our local garden centres stock it – get in early to buy the supplies you need now for the gardening year!

Comments from the East Hagbourne Parish Council Chairman

Annual Parish Meeting The 2020 and 2021 Annual Parish Meetings were cancelled because of the pandemic so, while recognizing that not everyone is yet comfortable with meeting indoors, we feel it is important to go ahead with the APM this year and so will hold it at 7.30pm on **31st March**. We will hold it in the church to enable more social distancing than in the pavilion. The main focus of the meeting will be to discuss village projects using as a background the list on the village webpages at URL: <u>https://easthagbourne.net/parish-council/projects/</u>

This could be even more pertinent than usual since we will have significant funding available for the village from the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) from the development by the Village Hall.

Other possible topics for the meeting will be the review of our Neighbourhood Plan and a discussion on possible wilding initiatives in the village.

A more detailed programme for the meeting will be posted on the village website, the village Facebook pages, the Parish Council email distribution, and notice boards in early March, but save the date now, as this is very much a village meeting and not a Parish Council meeting.

Housing Development by the Village Hall The name for this project is Deanfield Green and Deanfield will be hosting an open meeting on **Thursday 7th April** in the church to update everyone on their plans for this development of 74 houses on the field in Main Road opposite the school. Deanfield will be in the church with display boards from 3pm and a Q&A session will be chaired by our District Councillor, Jane Murphy, starting at 6.00pm.

Before then you may already see some activity on the site at the car park end. This is to enable the extra car parking spaces to be provided early on in recognition of the fact that street parking will be quasi-impossible when the building commences.

The S73 application (P21/S2893/FUL) principally on drainage has just been granted and planning decisions on the two remaining planning applications are expected shortly.

20mph speed limit As we have already publicised on the village website and Facebook, the consultation process for the establishment of a 20mph speed limit in the centre of the village has now begun and will run until 18 March. Comments can be posted on the website: https://letstalk.oxfordshire.gov.uk/easthagbourne_20mph202 or by letter to OCC. Assuming there are no adverse comments that cannot be answered easily or are significantly outweighed by positive comments, the signage should be installed in early May.

Parish meetings Parish Council meetings are held in the Pavilion on the Recreation Ground. Members of the public are welcome to join the meeting and the agenda is posted on village notice boards and the village web pages at least three clear days before the meeting. The next meeting will be held starting at 7.30pm on **Thursday 10th March**.

Astronomy Notes This month we have an image produced from photons gathered in January of "The Cone Nebula", also known as "The Madonna and Child". A huge dark cloud of gas and dust, obscuring a large star forming region of sky, producing the cloud with a silver lining effect.

Sitting in the constellation of Monoceros (the unicorn) to the left of Orion, it lies at a distance of 2,700 light years, and is approx. seven light years in length. It was discovered in 1785 by the great William Herschel, one of my astronomical heroes. He made his own telescopes, which he used to great effect, and went on to discover the planet Uranus. A man after my own heart, as I have made several telescopes in my time, but I very much doubt that I will be discovering a new planet!
