Rector's Reflections A Controversial Sunday

I wonder what you think about Mothering Sunday? Traditionally, it is celebrated on the 4th Sunday in Lent, which this year falls on 19th March. On this Sunday, churches will typically make an extra special effort to welcome families, and often little posies of flowers are given to any mothers who might happen to be in the congregation.

The meaning of Mothering Sunday has changed down the centuries. In the Middle Ages, the emphasis seems to have been on celebrating the role of Mother Church. People might visit their local cathedral, which was regarded as the "Mother Church" of the diocese. Later on, when many unmarried women lived and worked away from home, the custom arose that their employers would be expected to allow them to take this Sunday off, so they could go back home and visit their mothers. In more recent years, Mothering Sunday has been about celebrating the role of mothers – a role which is so often taken for granted.

However, over the last 10 or 20 years, the idea of celebrating Mothering Sunday has been brought into question. It has been pointed out that our relationships with our mothers can be complex and sometimes a source of deep pain. Furthermore, what if you are woman who has never had children? A traditional Mothering Day service could make you feel quite uncomfortable. And does the whole idea of Mothering Sunday hark back to some mythical age when women stayed at home to look after the children, and the men went out to work? In the modern world, there is the expectation that parenting is shared, so why do we still talk about "Mothering Sunday"? Why don't we change its name to "Parenting Sunday", and recognise that in the modern world, families come in all shapes and sizes?

What do you think? Is it time to get rid of the traditional "Mothering Sunday"? Or do you think it should be kept, as it provides a wonderful opportunity to thank our mothers for all that they have done for us? In our local group of churches, we still keep the traditional Mothering Sunday, but we try to bring it up to date so that it reflects the reality of family life as it is lived today. We see it as an opportunity to say thank you to all who look after us – whatever their gender, and whether they are family members or not. Father Jason

Travel with us to Narnia and Middle-earth this Lent

In the 1930s and 40s an informal group of like-minded Christian academics met frequently in Oxford to share and discuss their writing. They were known as 'The Inklings'. Two of them, CS Lewis and JRR Tolkien, have become world famous as authors of profound Christian insights and imagination. However, 75 years later, in our more diverse age, we might well ask if they still have anything to teach us.

St Michael's is running a Lent course exploring themes suited to Lent from the work of 'The Inklings', particularly Tolkien and Lewis, led by author and Inklings expert Julia Golding. Come to learn more about the themes of Middle-earth and Narnia, stay for friendly discussion and time for reflection. A Tribute to Sean Thomas O'Neill, RIP

17th November 1941 to 30th January 2023

It is with great sadness that we inform you of the recent death of Sean, a former long-time resident of Harwood Road in East Hagbourne with his wife Joan and three daughters. Sean and Joan lived here from 1969 to 2014.

Sean Thomas O'Neill was born in 1941 at home in Runcorn, Cheshire to James and Anne O'Neill; the third son of eight children. He grew up in the thriving parish of St Edwards and at primary school there he met his lifelong best friend, Roy Warburton who read the first reading at his Funeral at the Church of the Immaculate Conception in Bicester on the 20th February.

Sean and Roy went on after their schooling to become apprentices at ICI Rock Savage in Cheshire. In his spare time he enjoyed walking, climbing in Wales and archery. He met his beloved wife Joan at 17 years of age and they were married at St Edwards five and a half years later in June 1964. Over the next seven years Sean's work took them to Staffordshire, Derbyshire, Yorkshire and finally East Hagbourne in Berkshire as it was then, now Oxfordshire. During that time, they were blessed with three lovely daughters, Sandra, Gillian, and Patricia. All three girls went to the village Primary School and then onto Our Lady's Convent in Abingdon.

In 1977, Sean was offered a mechanical engineering post taking him to the Iran/Afghanistan areas, Algeria, Dubai, Kuwait and Saudi Arabia over the next 9 years. When on leave he enjoyed spending time with family and friends and being a part of the Church of English Martyrs parish in Didcot. He went on to work for the Ministry of Defence in Didcot and in the latter years of his career, in Caversfield at Bicester. He enjoyed sailing expeditions with the Ministry of Defence around the South Coast and France. Sean and Joan became keen bowlers in the village club for many years and at times he was Captain and President. Sean is well remembered locally for planting daffodils many years ago on both sides of the verge way from the village to Coscote corner; and in parts along the West Hagbourne path and near the bridge.

Sean and Joan were further blessed with six grandchildren and two step grandchildren.

After retirement in 2002, Sean had more time for dog walking and village activities.

As they became older they decided to move to Bicester where they have spent the last nine years being well supported by family, friends and the Parish of the Immaculate Conception.







Stop using pesticides and see more birds

`The actions of gardeners, in terms of which habitats they create in their garden, and whether or not they apply pesticides, has a significant influence on the avian biodiversity of their garden.' (de Montaigu and Goulson, 2023).

area habitat is also important, so the more bird friendly we all are, the better.



Devastating decline of over 70% in house sparrow numbers since the late 1970s has placed them on the UK Red List of conservation concern. With an estimated 22.7 million gardens in the UK, decisions we make in our gardens have never been more critical to their survival. A recent study (*) funded by Songbird Survival, is the first of its kind to examine the impact of pesticide use on garden birds. Bird friendly habitat in our own gardens – with ponds, native hedging, climbers - and bird feeders, means not just more birds but more species. Surrounding

Key findings of the study and what it means

- 32 % of the 615 gardens in the study used pesticides, glyphosate made up 53% of applications.
- Chemicals in pesticides associated with the worst effect on birds are: glyphosate, acetamiprid, deltamethrin and metaldehyde.
- Effects of pesticides on birds are understudied. Known effects include delayed embryo development, delayed appearance of feathers, tremors, depression, lower food consumption and lower body mass.
- Bird species richness is highest in gardens with high surrounding habitat quality and without pesticides.
- House Sparrow numbers were much lower in gardens using pesticides, particularly glyphosate & metaldehyde.
- European Robin and Great Tit numbers were also badly affected by the use of glyphosate.
- Bird friendly habitat is less effective in gardens where pesticides are used.

Biodiversity boost HUGS is working closely with Soha (South Oxfordshire Housing Association) to increase wildlife friendly habitat and boost biodiversity in East Hagbourne, with recent wildflower planting in Rymans Crescent. We're now working with Soha and The Poet's Trail in Wilcher Close to plant fruit trees, edible native hedging and wildflowers. What is a Parish Council and why become a Parish Councillor?

What is a Parish Council? A parish council is a local authority that makes decisions on behalf of the people in the parish and has an overall responsibility for the well-being of its local community.

It is the level of government closest to the community, with the district authority next above it in the hierarchy. As the authority closest to the people, parish councils are invariably the first place people will go with concerns or ideas. For this reason, they are a vital part of any community.

Parish Council work falls into three main categories:

- representing the local community
- delivering services to meet local needs
- striving to improve quality of life in the parish

Why become a Parish Councillor? If you live in a community where something 'big' has happened, you'll know that when people in the community need support and guidance, it is sometimes the parish council that is turned to.

By becoming a parish councillor, you become someone your community will look to for help, guidance, and support: a community leader with the power to influence decisions for the benefit of the people you serve. Seeing your community change for the better, as a result of decisions you have helped make, is something that can give you a sense of achievement and pride.

What decisions do Parish Councils make? Parish councils make all kinds of decisions on issues that affect the local community. Probably the most common topics that parish councils get involved with are planning matters (they are statutory consultees), crime prevention, helping local groups, managing open spaces and campaigning for and delivering better services and facilities. It's true to say that on their own, parish councils have limited powers to make decisions. But they do have the ability to negotiate with, and the power to influence, those other organisations that do make the final decisions (such as the district or county councils, health authorities, police etc). In this respect parish councils are extremely powerful. The organisations that make the final decisions know that a parish council gives the best reflection of how a community feels about something, and its views will be taken seriously.

How much time does it take up? Our council meets once a month for the council meeting, to which members of the public are also invited. Meetings usually last two hours, depending on the agenda. In addition to this, much of the work is done through emails including discussing planning applications and progressing local projects. Occasionally, an additional meeting may be convened when a decision is needed on a particular urgent issue.

How long does a parish councillor serve for? Once elected, parish councillors sit on the council for a period of four years until the next election, unless they resign beforehand.

Comments from the East Hagbourne Parish Council Chairman

Housing development by the Village Hall I owe a great apology for a serious misdirection in this paragraph of last month's comments. The information I gave came from a straight request to an email address on the Fairhive Homes webpages. However, I have since spoken to the Fairhive people handling Deanfield Green and to the SODC housing allocation team. Happily, to register for affordable housing you need only go to the South and Vale housing register accessible through the web page: https://www.southoxfordshirehomechoice.org.uk This is no different than if you were on the list for SOHA housing in the village.

20mph Limit From discussions in the village, it was clear that the survey for a 20mph limit in New Road and Blewbury Road did catch the attention of Hagbourne residents. I am delighted to record that 159 completed survey forms were submitted, and this return of more than 30% is regarded as very high for this type of survey. The results of the survey are summarised in the bar charts on a separate page of this magazine. The bottom line is that although the majority supported a move to a 20mph limit, there is a sizeable minority objecting, more so for New Road than Blewbury Road. There was a strong vote against most measures for traffic calming although the residents in Blewbury Road supported road narrowing at their entrance to the village by a small majority.

93 respondents also made use of the comments box sometimes continuing on the back of the page or using extra sheets. Mostly the comments backed up the reasons for the response with feelings being strongly expressed both in favour of and against the proposal. Several of you used the opportunity to expand the discussion, the most common comment was that money would be better spent on fixing roads in particular filling potholes with 14 of you raising such a demand.

Other items raised in discussions included support for a 20mph limit from the shop to the Lower Cross on New Road (8 requests) and for Bishops Orchard independently of the New Road decision, and a speed limit on the Coscote Road. Although several supported street parking as a form of traffic calming, 6 suggested that street parking should be reduced. The Parish Council will send the results to the county council team and we will keep you updated on this, noting that even if something does happen it won't be before April 2024.

Coronation Street Parties Information on the organizing of street parties and applying for road closures in celebration of the Coronation of Charles III can be found on the website: https://www.southoxon.gov.uk/south-oxfordshire-district-council/licensing/temporary-road-closures/ The deadline for requesting road closures is 31st March.

The East Hagbourne Sport and Recreation Committee have blocked bookings for the 6th, 7th, and 8th of May on the Pavilion and Recreation Ground, and anyone interested in using this facility for a Coronation party should contact the Parish Clerk.

Parish Council Elections A separate article in this magazine gives a short description about what a Parish Council does and the duties and responsibilities of council members. It also outlines the eligibility requirements for candidature. It would be good to get a good slate of applications. If you want to know more about what being a councillor entails, please contact the Clerk, myself, or any Parish Councillor.

Parish Surgeries The surgeries at the Fleur de Lys have been lively affairs and so I will continue there with a surgery from 5.00 to 6.30 on **Friday 3rd March** but feel free to contact me, the clerk, or any councillor should your concerns be more urgent.

Parish Council meetings Parish Council meetings are held in the Pavilion on the Recreation Ground. Members of the public are welcome to join the meeting and the agenda is posted on village notice boards and the village web pages at least three clear days before the meeting. The next meeting will be held starting at 7.30pm on **Thursday 9th March**. Let me remind you that this is not a formal or even approved article from the Parish Council but is rather a few words from me. REMINDER: Photo ID required to vote at upcoming Local Elections

The government has introduced a requirement for voters to show photo ID when voting at a polling station at some elections. This will apply for the first time at the local elections on Thursday 4th May 2023.

Accepted forms of photo ID will include, but are not limited to, passport, driving licence (including provisional license), disabled parking blue badge, certain concessionary travel cards and proof of age cards with a PASS mark. You can still use your photo ID if it is out of date, as long as it looks like you.

Anyone who doesn't have accepted photo ID can apply on the government's website now for a free voter ID document, known as a Voter Authority Certificate. The deadline to apply for voter ID for this election is 5pm on Tuesday 25th April. Further information on this requirement is available here




