Rector's Reflections Saint Patrick's Breastplate

I wonder: do you have any plans for 17th March? As you may or may not be aware, 17th March is **St Patrick's Day.** St Patrick was British by birth, and was probably born c.390AD. As a young man, he was captured by Irish pirates and enslaved. After some 6 years in Ireland as a slave, he escaped (or was freed), and returned to his family.

He then trained to be a priest, and decided to go back to Ireland, but this time as a missionary. Patrick established a base at Armagh, and he seems to have focussed his missionary work in the north of Ireland. The date of his death is uncertain, but it was probably sometime in the 460s AD. Some of Patrick's writings have survived, including a short autobiography.

In subsequent centuries, Patrick's fame spread far and wide, and in due course he became regarded as the patron saint of Ireland. Lots of stories were told about him, which may or may not have any foundation in fact. For example, one story claimed that Patrick expelled all the snakes from Ireland, and another story has Patrick explaining the theology of Trinity by pointing to a shamrock.

There is a wonderful ancient Irish poem called St Patrick's Breastplate, which is popularly attributed to St Patrick. This poem has been turned into a hymn, which starts "I bind unto myself today the strong name of the Trinity". If you are unfamiliar with the hymn, do look it up. It is sung to a splendid traditional Irish melody – in fact, two different Irish melodies, as two verses in the hymn are sung to a different tune.

St Patrick's hymn is unlike any other – and whether or not it goes back to the Saint himself, the words are quite remarkable. So remarkable, in fact, that some might question whether they should be sung in church! Eric Routley, who wrote extensively on hymns, considered the hymn to be a "very primitive blending of supernatural and natural experience"; and others have written that the hymn contains "many elements of druidical incantation mingled with a war-song and a creed". I wonder what you think. Is the hymn suitable or not?

If you are curious to learn more, do come along to St Andrews's East Hagbourne at 10.30am on Sunday 17th March. You'll be most welcome. We're holding a special service to celebrate St Patrick and there will be the chance to sing his hymn!

Go with your gut in the garden!

THE EDIBLE MEADOW – coming to the RHS Chelsea Flower Show 2024

Can gut health be improved by eating or just walking past particular flowers? The gardener designers of the Bowel Research UK Microbiome Garden at Chelsea this year aim to illustrate that it can.

Inspired by medical and botanical research. the garden explores the link between healthy landscapes, guts, and minds, through a planting of ornamental grasses and edible perennials which offer a harvest for both people and wildlife.

The human microbiome - formed of microbes which live in and on us, mainly in our gut, disposes of bad bacteria and maintains good bacteria to keep us well. So, exposure to many different plants equals exposure to many different types of microbe. Healthy soil is vital - full of microorganisms which transfer to the plants we grow and food we eat. Sadly, industrial agriculture, on which we now rely for most of our food, is mainly based on sterile monocrops, in soil depleted of beneficial bacteria and microbes. While humans have a long history with soil, fruit and vegetable gardening provide our main relationship with soil today. Unsurprisingly, recent studies have shown that gardeners have healthier guts than non-gardeners *.

What makes the Chelsea microbiome meadow garden different from traditional Chelsea gardens is its plant diversity - including edible wild foods - making us aware that growing our own food, and having a multitude of different plants in our garden are key to our health. How can we achieve this in our own gardens? According to microbiome garden designer, Chris Hull, the answer is simple: "Grow your own food ... perennial crops to get more wildlife in ... and more diverse plants." There we have it.

Annual Parish Meeting The Annual Parish Meeting will be held in the Hagbourne Village Hall on Thursday 28th March. This is not a Parish Council meeting but is a statutory Annual Meeting for the residents of East Hagbourne. As an incentive to attending, a main topic for discussion will be what we can do with the money that we receive as a parish because of housing developments in the village. Since there are a significant number of houses in the development on Main Road opposite the school, the total sum that we will have will be greater than £250,000 and must be spent on infrastructure projects in the village within the next five years.

However, as this is your meeting feel free to propose other projects that you feel would offer lasting improvements to the village or village life. There will be a short summary of Parish Council activities and a report on council finances but the primary part and the main aim of the meeting will be this discussion. An agenda will be posted on the Parish Council noticeboard, Facebook, and Mailchimp on 18th March.

Parish Council meetings For some time an Action List has been included in both agenda and minutes of Parish Council meetings. To increase transparency, the Action List has been expanded significantly. It is hoped that the Action List will then be a good snapshot of the current activities of the Parish Council. To streamline meetings, this new Action List will not be part of the agenda but an updated version of it will be included with the minutes of the meeting. These minutes are published straight after the next PC meeting when they have been formally approved. The PC meetings are held in the Pavilion on the Recreation Ground. Members of the public are welcome to join the meeting and the agenda is posted on village notice boards and the village web pages at least three clear days before the meeting. The next meeting will be held starting at 7.30pm on Thursday 7th March.

Neighbourhood Plan At an SODC Council meeting on 22nd February, the East Hagbourne Neighbourhood Plan, was "made", that is it was formally adopted and accepted as part of the Local Development Plan. There are a few edits underway before the documents will be posted by SODC and on our website, but this has been a major undertaking and has required far more effort than I believe was anticipated by anybody when the work started nearly two years ago. Our thanks to the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group for their hard work on this.
