

# Rector's Reflections A Significant Number

Are you interested in numbers? Sometimes numbers can express something very particular and precise, but on other occasions numbers serve to express a more general idea. For example, if someone said to you, "I'll be with you in 5 minutes", does this

mean that they will be with you in precisely 5 minutes' time, or does it mean that they will be with you shortly? Clearly, the meaning of "5 minutes" depends on the context. The same is true of references to time in the Bible: sometimes the reference to a period of time should be taken quite literally, and on other occasions, it needs to be interpreted more loosely.

You may well wonder: why have I chosen to write about time? The reason is that this month will see the celebration of Ascension Day, which is by tradition celebrated 40 days after Easter. This year, Ascension Day falls on 18th May, and in our group of churches we will mark the occasion by a special Service at Blewbury. Ascension Day commemorates the occasion when Jesus was "taken up to heaven": "he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of ... sight". The fullest reference to this mysterious event is found in the first chapter of the Acts of the Apostles. I describe the event as "mysterious" because something mysterious happened to Jesus' resurrected body, and the event has been remembered ever since. In terms of when it happened, the account in the Acts of the Apostles points to it happening 40 days from Easter Day. However, in the Bible "40 days" is sometimes used quite loosely to express an indefinite but significant period of time. So, when we read that the Ascension took place "40 days" after Easter, the reference to 40 days does not necessarily have to be interpreted literally.

Why is the Ascension celebrated? In essence, it's because it is the companion festival to Christmas. At Christmas, we celebrate Jesus coming down from Heaven, being born as a human being; at the Ascension, we celebrate Jesus returning to Heaven, but still retaining his human nature. It's a way of saying that although we no longer have sightings of the risen Jesus in our day to day lives, he remains alive, fully human and fully divine. He is still present, caring for us and for our world – not just today, but for all time. This is good news indeed!


#### Oxfordshire Artweeks - May 6th to 29th

Enid, here is a photo of Babe with Fly and one with a group of our relatives which we met at the Grand Challenge. I must dash, bye for now, Elsie.






Goodbye Enid, I'll leave you with a couple of comments, below, from emails we received after the show, don't forget to keep an eye out for details of our next production.

# **East Hagbourne Community Shop Celebrating 20 Years**

As we celebrate our 20th Anniversary, each month we will be sharing stories from past and present volunteers and the wider community about what Shop means to them, and why keeping the Shop going is important to all of us.

This month we remember John Jones, a founding member and long-standing volunteer of the East Hagbourne Community Shop.

Many of you may remember John Jones, a long-time member of the East Hagbourne village. He was very active throughout the community as churchwarden, village walk leader, and founding member of the Friends of St Andrew's. Back in 2003, John was one of the locals who rallied 'round to help save our local Post Office by revitalising the village Shop, to help keep both amenities alive as part of a vibrant neighbourhood community.

Along the way, John offered his skills in DIY, recruiting volunteers and overseeing the finances. He served as Shop Committee Chair for over 10 years, and then, after stepping down, he served in the Shop every Tuesday. He also prepared the volunteer rota and helped out with the shop party.

John is the reason Alice Smith, our current Volunteer lead, became involved in recruiting – and many of the current volunteers can testify to her uncanny ability to engage newcomers! He continued to serve the community in his various activities until he moved back to Connecticut in 2020 John wrote us earlier this month, looking back 20 years to the Shop founding:

# WHY YOU SHOULD ... GO FOR NO MOW IN MAY!



It's an easy way to make a real difference for nature! #NoMowMay is a Plantlife campaign. Owners of our 20 million UK gardens and those in charge of our verges and green spaces, are asked not to mow for this one month. This gives bees, butterflies, and other wildlife a much-needed spring boost - and shows us what can happen when we put the mower away.

- MORE NECTAR: lawns with frequent mowing and weed removal are wastelands for insects and flowers. Less frequent mowing can provide enough nectar sugar for 10x the number of pollinators and insects: bees, butterflies, moths and beetles – helping the animals who feed on them.
- MORE SPECIES: gardeners taking part in #NoMowMay 2022 reported 250 species of plants, including wild garlic, wild strawberry, orchids and snakeshead fritillary, flowering within their lawns.
- MORE SUPERFOODS: Dandelions are a great superfood for butterflies and bees. Outnumbered by daisies by 85:1 on a 100m<sup>2</sup> lawn, this yellow treasure provides 9% of the lawn's pollen and 37% of its nectar sugar.
- QUANTIFIABLE SUCCESS: Let Plantlife know you are taking part
   <a href="https://www.plantlife.org.uk/campaigns/nomowmay/">https://www.plantlife.org.uk/campaigns/nomowmay/</a>) and they can measure the total space
  being liberated for nature. At the end of May, count the difference record the flowers that
  have grown in your grass with the <a href="Every Flower Counts">Every Flower Counts</a> survey and get a "Personal Nectar
  Score", of how much nectar is being produced by the flowers on your lawn and how many
  bees it can support.

We have lost 97% of flower rich meadows since the 1970's — resulting in the disappearance of vital food needed by pollinators including bees, butterflies and moths

**POPPY PATTERN** We are hoping to create a display of poppies to go into St Andrew's for Remembrance Sunday in November. If you would like to make some poppies there are lots of patterns for knitting patterns online. We include one below to try. A crochet pattern to appear next month.

You will need red double knitting wool and a pair of size 4mm needles. Cast on 60 sts Rows 1-8 (K2, P2) to end. Row 9 (K2tog) to end. [30 sts] Row 10 (S2kpo)\* to end. [10 sts]. Break off yarn, leaving a long tail. Thread tail through remaining 10 sts and pull tight, then fasten off yarn.

\*S2kpo = slip 2 stitches, knit 1 then pass 2 slip stitches over.

Join edges of the poppy together and sew a black button in the centre of the poppy.

If you do not have black buttons, then oversew the centre with black wool.

#### **Comments from the East Hagbourne Parish Council Chairman**

**Housing development by the Village Hall** The work on the sewer connection was completed just within the deadline so that access along Main Road was restored before the school term restarted on 17th April. The works for the S278 requirements (work on road humps, yellow lines etc) will again require road closure and will be done during this year's school summer holidays. Work on the stepped and ramped access from the site to the Sustrans route on the embankment should start around 9th May. The show house should be open from around 8th May and the first residents should move in before the end of May assuming Thames Water make the necessary connections in time.

**Annual Parish Meeting** The Annual Parish Meeting was held in the Pavilion on Thursday 30th March. There were 25 people present including our district councillors and our county councillor. Perhaps the main message from the village to the Parish Council was that footways (aka pavements) and footpaths should be a future spending priority. The draft minutes for this meeting will shortly be posted on the village webpages where you can read about this public discussion, the annual report and finance report from the Parish Council, and a report on the East Hagbourne Pavilion and Recreation Ground.

**Parish and District Council Elections** The Parish and District Council Elections will be held on Thursday 4th May. The polling station is the Village Hall and it will be open from 7am to 10pm. A photo ID is required when voting. Since there were seven candidates for the eight positions on the Parish Council, there will be no voting for that council although there will be voting for electing our two district councillors.

The seven people who will thus serve on the Parish Council from May are: Paul Dixon, Iain Duff, Cordelia Gover, Robin Hewat-Jaboor, Natalie Milner, David Rickeard, and Carolyn Shaikh. We welcome Natalie and Robin as newcomers to the Parish Council. Councillors Derek Button and Jean Elliott are retiring from the council and were formally thanked by the Parish Council for their services over a good number of years.

The new councillors together with the five reappointed former councillors will sign their declaration of office at the annual meeting of the Parish Council on 11th May when the chairman and vice-chairman for 2023-2024 will be elected.

**Parish Surgeries** The surgeries at the Fleur de Lys continue to be lively, and so I will hold the next one there from 5.00 to 6.30 on Friday 5th May. Feel free, however, to contact me, the clerk, or any councillor should your concerns be more urgent.

**Parish Council meetings** Parish Council meetings are held in the Pavilion on the Recreation Ground. Members of the public are welcome to join the meeting and the agenda is posted on village notice boards and the village web pages at least three clear days before the meeting. The next meeting (the Annual Parish Council meeting) will be held starting at 7.30pm on Thursday 11th May.
