



Rector's Reflections An Old Tradition Revived

Have you ever heard of the Rogation Days? These are the special name given to the three weekdays before Ascension Day. Ascension Day is always observed 40 days after Easter day, and so this year the Rogation Days fall on Monday 6th May, Tuesday 7th and Wednesday 8th.

You may well be wondering: what are the Rogation Days? They are days specially set aside for prayer (the English word Rogation comes from the Latin word, rogare, which means "to ask"). On these days, we ask God's blessing on the world around us. In the old days, the emphasis was very much on asking God's blessing on the crops growing in the fields, and there was often a tradition of going on a procession around the fields. This seems to be the origin of the tradition of "beating the bounds" of a parish. Nowadays, the scope of Rogation has been widened to include prayer for the world of work more generally, as well as prayer for local communities.

In England, Rogation processions were supressed at the Reformation, and the tradition of observing Rogation seems to have gradually died away. However, in the last thirty or forty years or so, there has been a revival of the tradition, at least some villages and communities. Locally, the tradition is observed at South Moreton. The 10.30am service at South Moreton on Sunday 12th May will take the form of a Rogation procession, and everyone is most welcome to come along and join in.

The idea of a procession to ask God's favour to protect the crops growing in the fields goes back long before Christianity. Despite its origins in ancient beliefs, I think it still has a place today, even in this age of scientific agriculture. It reminds us that all of us are still dependent for our food on the men and women who grow our crops and look after our farm animals. And now that so many of us no longer work on the land, it is good that the tradition has been expanded to include prayer for the world of work in all its diversity. The world of work, both paid and unpaid, plays such an important role in our lives. It is good to have the opportunity to ask God's blessing upon it. It recognises the fact that God cares for the whole of our lives - not just for what we might or might not do on a Sunday.

Bell Sunday – 12th May

Bell Sunday is an annual opportunity to celebrate the contribution of bell-ringers to the life of the Church, and to acknowledge the part that bells play in worship and community life all the year round. Bell Sunday is always kept on a Sunday close to St Dunstan's feast day, who is known as the patron saint of bell-ringers due to his experimentation in the early forging of bells in the 900's and his encouragement of the use of bells in parish churches. Help Mother nature - make your garden matter

We can all make real difference by doing simple things to support nature in our back gardens. Private UK gardens cover over 400,000 hectares - more than all national nature reserves. In the UK, 1 in 6 species is at risk of extinction. You can help recovery by:

- Cutting the grass less often or leaving wild patches to be cut just once or twice a year-leaving dandelions, daisies & other wildflowers to support pollinating insects.
- Not being too tidy leaving homes for nature.
- Weeding beds and borders less often allowing wildflowers and the insect life they support, into your garden.
- Avoiding pesticides and other chemicals in the garden building a more natural balance between 'garden pests' and their predators.

Vera Newman

19th August 1928 - 24th March 2024

Vera was born in Hertfordshire into the Livings family of grocers. They moved briefly to Steventon, where her father took over as manager of Rant & Toombs Grocery, but soon moved on to Didcot when an opportunity arose to establish their own business. Livings became a well-known bakery in the town, with the bakehouse in Bourne Street and the main grocery store on The Broadway.

Vera married Arthur Newman in 1956 and they moved to East Hagbourne where their daughters, Jill and Sarah were born. Always happy to be involved in village life, Vera was an enthusiastic member of the Hacca Club and keen fundraiser for local causes.

The arrival of grandchildren was a special time and Dominic, Emily, Lucy and Louis have always been a very important part of her life. Following Arthur's death in 2002, Vera adopted Hugo the 3-legged labrador and became a familiar sight walking him around the footpaths of Hagbourne. She loved to bake and delighted in trying out new recipes which friends were encouraged to taste test.

Although sad to leave Blewbury Road when independent living became impossible, Vera made the most of her time at Lyndhurst where she was so well cared for. As always, she approached life with enthusiasm and a smile, firm in the belief that tea and cake could solve most things.

Vera died peacefully at Lyndhurst after a short period of failing health.

The kindness and support of so many friends and neighbours has been much appreciated by Vera's family at this sad time.

News from Your Village Hall - Chairman Urgently Required

At the last committee meeting, and which I repeated at the Annual Parish Meeting the following day, I announced that I would not be standing again at our Annual Meeting in November for the post of Chairman of the Village Hall Committee.

I have now been Chairman for 12 years, and whilst I have enjoyed the job immensely, I think the time has come for me to hand over to a fresh pair of hands.

However, it is essential that someone steps forward to become the new Chairman, otherwise the Village Hall may have to close.

We are lucky to have a Village Hall, which is entirely independent and well used. It generally makes a surplus. year on year, although recently we have been spending some of our reserves to upgrade the kitchen, as well as the small hall.

We have a team of caretakers, principally Linda Benton, and more recently Mark Sutherland, who take care of the hall on a day-to-day basis. Geoff Leaver is our Booking Secretary.

However, as a charity, we run with a board of Trustees who direct policy and manage expenditure.

Our constitution allows for up to 13 people, made up of nominees from various user groups, as well as some trustees with no affiliation. However, in recent years we have seldom had more than 7 trustees attending our committee meetings.

There are only 3 executive Trustees, namely a Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer, who, in theory at least, are elected each year from amongst the newly nominated committee members. However, there is presently a vacancy for the post of Secretary. Charles Stutley is our Treasurer. We only hold our meetings 3 to 4 times a year, so the time commitment is not excessive for ordinary Committee Members.

Ideally, we would like to also recruit more people onto the committee, as well as seeking a new Chairman and Secretary.



Comments from the East Hagbourne Parish Council Chairman

Annual Parish Meeting The Annual Parish Meeting (APM) was a lively affair with a good attendance, perhaps stimulated by the headline request asking how best to spend around 1/4 million pounds CIL money. Draft minutes are already posted on the village website. These include a review of Parish Council activities during the last year and a report on the finances in addition to the many comments made at the meeting.

On the possible expenditure of CIL money, there was good support for using it on footpaths and footways. There was an appeal from the Village Hall for support for much needed repairs to roof and walls, a request for play equipment at the Recreation Ground for older children, possible regeneration of historic orchards, and village information boards. The District Councillor suggested that there might be other funding sources for work on the Village Hall including grants being offered by SODC.

Development by Village Hall The builders have finished all the work on Main Road at the entrance to the site although any remedial action may be done for the next 12 months. Already there is some concern over the quality of the road markings. However, the agreement with the County Council (the so-called S278 agreement) only includes the stretch of Main Road from Manor Farm Lane to the entrance to the car park so we will be asking the County Council, who in 2017 supported the planning application, to take responsibility for an extended area including Main Road to Coscote which suffered severe verge damage through heavy vehicles coming to and from site inter alia.

The ramp and step access from the site to the railway embankment is now open. Deanfield tell us that the responsibility for this is now with Sustrans who are responsible for the choice of safety barriers and the re-planting of vegetation on the embankment. The timing for the removal of the marketing suite building depends on when the last 7 Deanfield market houses are sold. This is likely to happen by mid-July when the children's play area will be built in that place. The workers car park and office buildings will be replaced by seeded soil from the mound near the drainage system in the August-September timeframe.

Speedwatch At the last Parish Council meeting, Councillor Robin Jaboor reported that eight people had volunteered to help with Speedwatch and are now doing the necessary online training. This should enable a start to running the monitoring of traffic through the village but more volunteers are needed to share the load. Interested parties and particularly volunteers should contact either Robin (robin.jaboor@easthagbourne.net) or the Clerk.

Flooding There have been encouraging meetings of a group of parish councillors led by Councillor Carolyn Shaikh and officers from SODC, OCC, and the Environment Agency with the support of SODC we are applying for working in de-silting part of our drainage system and further action on gully clearing that has already been started. There was a very well attended meeting concerning management of the two stream channels that run through the village. The flood group has also been revitalized and will be led by Jane Bell and Robert Ainger. One action has been to set up a WhatsApp group to help coordinate actions in flood situations. If you are interested in this flood group, contactJane Bell (jane.p.bell@btinternet.com).

Parish Surgeries The next parish surgery will again be in the Fleur de Lys on Friday 10th May from 5.00 to 6.30 pm. However, feel free to contact me (iain.duff@easthagbourne.net), the clerk or any other councillor should you have urgent concerns.

Parish Council meetings The PC meetings are held in the Pavilion on the Recreation Ground. Members of the public are welcome to join the meeting and the agenda is posted on village notice boards and the village web pages at least three clear days before the meeting. The next meeting, which is the Annual meeting of the Council, will be held starting at 7.30pm on Thursday 9th May. Let me remind you that this is not a formal or even approved article from the Parish Council but is rather a few words from me. Thames Travel bus service to the JR Hospital from Didcot – X32

The X32 service starts at Cockcroft Road, Didcot, which might be a convenient point for some people to catch it - still every half hour. It then goes to GWP South and down Wantage Road, past the Hospital, to the Orchard Centre, Station, and on to Oxford and JR.

Thames Travel bus service to the Churchill and Nuffield Hospitals

The bus to catch from High Street in Oxford is Number 15 which is every 1/4 hour during the day, taking 10-12 minutes, longer at busy times. You can catch it near the entrance to the Covered Market or near Queen's Lane. The stop for the Churchill is Roosevelt Drive. For the Nuffield, the stop is further on, and is called Lime Walk and is actually in Old Road near the Old Road entrance to the hospital. The 15 also stops near the Warneford.

A Hagbourne Premier: Didcot Phoenix Drama Group brings new play 'I Hear You' to Hagbourne Village Hall Saturday, 1st June at 2pm

Didcot Phoenix Drama Group are touring an original play, **'I Hear You'**, round three local venues in June. The tour begins with a 2pm matinee performance on 1st June at Hagbourne Village Hall. 'I Hear You' is a comedy drama that takes a humorous look at situations that can happen to anyone and asks who is listening and who is not listening. It's full of characters who listen and don't listen in different ways. The aim is that every member of the audience will find a character to identify with. The play encourages the audience to reflect on how well they are listened to, how well they listen to others and the consequences of not listening well.

The play was created by two Didcot Phoenix members - writer Emma Gardner and actor/director Maria Xucla-Lerma. Didcot Phoenix Drama Group celebrated their 40th anniversary last year and have a track record of producing new plays. The creative team behind this production won 'Best Original Play' at the 2023 Henley Drama Festival for their previous play 'No Prime Minister', also written by Emma Gardner. Another of the group's own plays, 'Not a Cream Cracker', written by Gerry Rouse, won the Charlotte Thomas Award at the same festival in 2022. The play features a cast of nine local actors from Didcot and the surrounding villages. Cast members have previously been nominated for best actor and best supporting actor at local festivals and include Sarah Medley, who won Best Supporting Actor at the 2023 Wallingford Corn Exchange Drama Festival. Sarah, who plays the part of Alice, jumped at the chance to take part in this new play: 'I think the message of this play, exploring what it means to be listened to, is such an important one...that's if you choose to hear it!'
