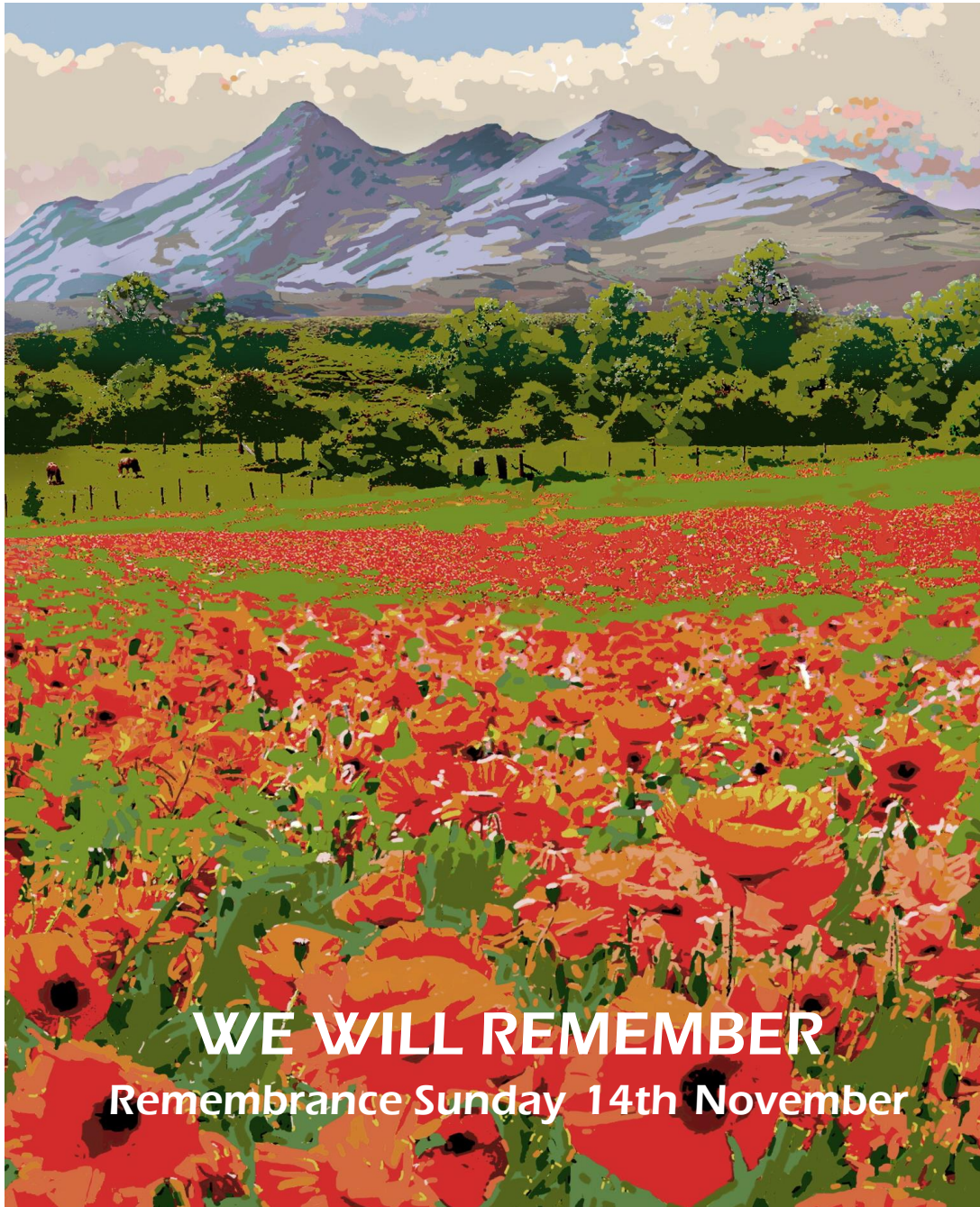

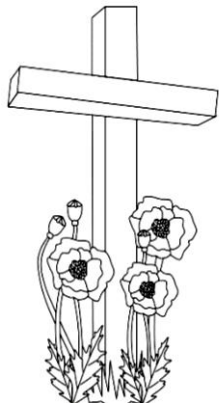

Rector's Reflections A Thought for Remembrance

This month, many people will be attending acts of Remembrance. Men and women of all ages will gather around war memorials, wreaths will be laid, and the names of the dead will be read out.

It is always a poignant time: a time to remember those men and women who gave their lives on behalf of their country, especially during the course of the First and Second World Wars. How should we honour those who gave their lives in war? The simple act of remembrance is important: it serves to remind us of the sacrifice made by the men and women of previous generations.

But I think we can also honour the fallen by committing ourselves once again to be peacemakers in our communities and in our world. We need to do all that we possibly can to avoid using war or the threat of war as a way of solving disagreements between nations. I'm not suggesting that it's always easy to be peacemakers or peacekeepers: it isn't. Sometimes, even peace-loving nations can be presented with terrible dilemmas. What if another country threatens to attack your own country, or the country of an ally? What if they move beyond mere threat, and actually launch an attack? Might there be circumstances when going to war is the only realistic option left? And what about countries ruled by ruthless dictators? Is it possible or desirable to make peace with someone you can't trust, or someone whose values are profoundly opposed to your own?

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus told his listeners: "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God". He didn't say "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will have an easy life"; nor did he say, "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be saved from complex moral dilemmas".

Nor did Jesus suggest that peace-making is for wimps, who lack the strength or courage to go to war. I think sometimes it takes as much courage and moral strength to be a peacemaker as it does to become a combatant.

I think we can all do more to be peacemakers and peacekeepers in our communities and our world. Sometimes, countries have to go to war; but let us do everything in our power to live at peace with one another. "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God". Father Jason

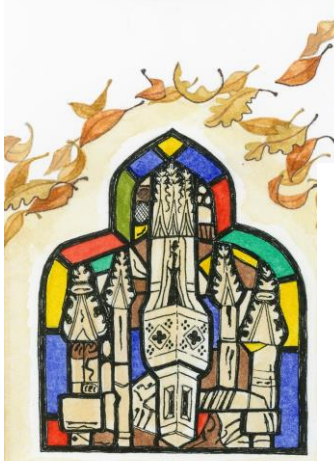

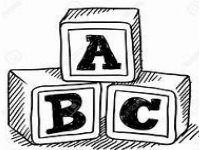

The Pandemic – Impact on Church Finances FY2021

St Andrew's Church has suffered a similar fate in its finances as last year: Lockdown from the beginning of the year, followed by progressive lifting of restrictions from the 12th of April, the 17th of May, the 21st of June, and finally 19th July have taken their toll. Income was lost through the absence of Services and fund-raising activities for most of the first half of the year. However, there have been fixed costs and obligations that have had to be met month-in, month-out despite this. The Parish Share, Building Insurance and Utilities (the latter albeit on a reduced scale) all figure prominently; Parish Share primarily funds clergy stipends.

The second half of the year has been encouraging and income has begun to flow again with the Church open for Services and activities. But there is no way to totally recover the losses of the first half, which will have to be covered by dipping into our cash reserves, as we did last year. I now forecast that over **£9,000** of cash reserves will have to be used to bridge the deficit.

So, my final plea is to reach out to readers of this Magazine for donations to help minimise the deficit. As they say, 'every little helps' and, with the spirit of Advent and Christmastide approaching, it is an opportunity to mark these special seasons with a gift to the Church. Donations can be made either by cheque or on-line: cheques should be made payable to 'Hagbourne Parochial Church Council' and sent to me at 45, New Road, East Hagbourne, OX11 9JX. Alternatively, please phone me on 01235 815605 and I can provide details for a bank transfer.

Asylum Welcome has been a registered charity since 1996. It exists to support refugees, vulnerable migrants and those forced to seek political asylum from danger in their homelands.

This is a never-ending job but currently, the Oxfordshire group's most urgent challenge is to support families fleeing threat, violence, and persecution in Afghanistan. Asylum Welcome is working with others including Oxfordshire-wide Councils (County and City), MPs, local Afghan leaders, refugee community organisations and other organisations to support those having to flee the Taliban.

In addition to helping new arrivals, they are working hard to provide information and practical support to Afghans who are already in Oxfordshire and who desperately need to find routes to safety for their family and friends back home.

Volunteers at Asylum Welcome are doing all they can to help with immediate needs and longer-term resettlement. As you read this note, they are supporting up to a hundred people in a local hotel during what could be an extended transition period.

Pet Service at St Andrew's 17th October 2021

The Sunday service had quite a different atmosphere on 17th October, numerous Hagbourne Pets brought their owners to the **Pet Service**. For some pets and families it was their first experience of a service in St Andrews – hope you came out feeling embraced and uplifted. Father Jason had his work cut out, at least 20 dogs, 1 rabbit, 2 pigmy goats and a Shetland pony were individually blessed as well as a blessing for all those who could not attend. Photos were on display of those pets who could not come.

The Service ended with a resounding hymn . . . "You shall go out with joy, and be led forth in peace, and the mountains and the hills shall break forth before you. There'll be shouts of joy and the trees of the field shall clap their hands . . ."

We want everyone to feel safe coming to Church Following advice from the Diocese, we will continue to encourage people to wear face coverings and to observe social distancing while in church. Communion will be in bread only. Congregational singing will be allowed when it is safe to do so: as the virus spreads via droplets, to be able to sing will depend on the numbers attending and the ability to be socially distant from others.

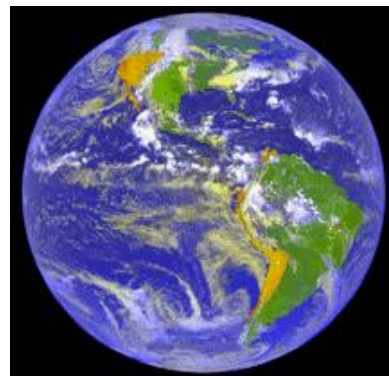

HUGS News - Our future needs us

We work hard all our lives in the hope that we can find some enjoyment and create a legacy to enable our children and grandchildren to thrive just as our ancestors did for us. We have been largely fortunate in this respect and our generation has reaped the benefits of decades of peace and prosperity. Situated in the sleepy vales of Oxfordshire it is easy for us to imagine that this state will continue undisturbed. However, we do not need to look far to find signs that things are not as they should be.



Changes in weather patterns, failed harvests, floods, wildfires; these are more and more prominent in the news. Talk of a Climate and Environmental Emergency has become increasingly frequent.

Until now we have largely left it to scientists and politicians to find the solutions to these problems and develop appropriate policies. For nearly thirty years they have been meeting annually to discuss goals and agree targets; the world's nations coming together for a Conference of Parties to negotiate a path forward. On 4th November 2021 Glasgow will host the 26th such meeting - COP26. It has been referred to as ***the world's best last chance to get runaway climate change under control.***

In a recent speech Antonio Guterres, the UN Secretary General, issued us with a stark warning. ***"If we don't act now on climate change, this coming century may be one of humanity's last... this is not a climate talk summit – after 30 years we have done with talking. Nor is it a climate negotiation summit – we cannot negotiate with nature. This is a Climate Action Summit... We have the tools to make the fundamental changes that are necessary, we need only find the will to put them into action."***

When he speaks of **Action** he is not just referring to the policy makers and the scientists; he means all of us. We need bold action in every sector from business leaders to local councillors to community leaders to individual households. The negotiations at COP26 will define the path we take. It is up to us to tell our leaders what kind of world we want to leave for our future generations and it is up to us to work together to take the steps that will get us there.

Tree orders We are taking tree orders again for this year's tree planting season. See our [tree page](#) for more info. Do you have room to plant a new tree in the ground or even in a pot? Do you have a hedge that needs some replacement plants or are you thinking of planting a new hedge along your boundary? Planting Native trees and shrubs is a fantastic way to support your local wildlife, making home for invertebrates and birds as well as providing food for them. The fallen leaf litter in the autumn in turn feeds your soil. You're also creating a carbon store that will grow with time.

We'll be offering different size trees again this year; small medium and large. They will arrive bare root so will need to be planted either into the ground straight away or heeled into the soil or a pot with the roots covered with wet soil, so they don't dry out.

Please order your trees by 7th November.

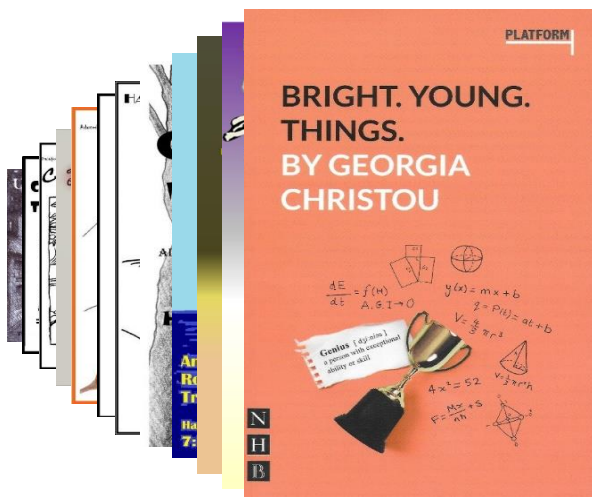

ROADWORKS INFORMATION

Roadworks and the resulting traffic restrictions are understandably an annoyance, particularly if a road is closed and diversions are in place. Oxfordshire County Council routinely inform the Parish Council of any road closure that affects the Parish and this information is posted on the Facebook page, sent to those subscribed to the email circulation, and added to the village website.



However, the majority of traffic situations result in lower levels of disruption, such as traffic lights and partial lane closures. These are often set up when utilities such as Thames Water, Openreach or SSE are carrying out works in the area. The Parish Council is not notified of these works.

A useful site to check for roadworks is [one.network](https://www.one.network) which shows roadworks along with details of which company is carrying out the associated works, and permit information. You can view 2 weeks ahead without needing to register or up to 12 months if you register on the site.

Citizens Advice – Two useful items from the Citizens Advice.

Citizens Advice on coping with Universal Credit shortfall This year, the month of September ushered in more ominous portents than chilly winds and dark nights: the Government reduced Universal Credit payments by £20 a week. This move could put many floundering people in a critical situation. Rising prices and the coming end of the pandemic furlough have joined other negative trends to put millions in serious debt, unable to pay vital bills and about to see life get even worse. But, if you are in this position, remember that support and help are available and you need not suffer alone.

Take charge of your situation. Start by making a list of what you owe and add up what you need to pay out each month. This list puts your financial position clearly in front of you in black and white. Next, prioritise your debts. There is advice on the Citizens Advice website to help you do this: <https://www.citizensadvice.org.uk/debt-and-money> Some bills are more urgent than others. Rent or mortgage arrears, gas and electricity bills and Council Tax count as priority debts as there could be serious consequences if you don't pay them. Get in touch with the companies to whom you owe money. Not everybody feels confident about doing this but the organisations expect such calls and they might be able to help by letting you pay smaller amounts over a longer period or even take a temporary payment break.

The government-backed Breathing Space scheme could also give you extra time to pay. See our website for details or www.gov.uk If you are eligible, you could get 60 days during which your creditors can't contact you, take any action against you or add interest and charges to your debt. A Citizens Advice adviser can check your debts to see if they are covered by the scheme. If you need more specific support or don't feel able to manage your situation alone, call the Citizens Advice debt helpline on 0800 240 4420. It really helps to make personal contact with somebody who understands. You can also call our Adviceline free on 0808 278 7907 (Monday to Friday 9 am to 5 pm) or try our webchat (click on "chat with us online about debt").

Citizens Advice information on vanishing energy suppliers Many people have recently had the disconcerting experience of seeing their energy supplier break up and go out of business during the recent energy price fluctuations. It sounds pretty drastic, but the situation isn't as bad as it seems. If you are one of those affected, remember these key facts: first of all, the gas or electricity supply itself won't be interrupted, so don't be concerned about that. Next, you should know that Ofgem, the industry regulator, will automatically move you to a new supplier. This usually takes a few weeks.

Wait for your new supplier to contact you. They will explain what will happen with your new account. But contact the new supplier yourself if you haven't heard from them within two weeks. You can check on www.citizensadvice.org.uk ("check who's taken over your energy supply") if you're not sure who your new supplier is. While you're waiting to hear from the new supplier, it's a good idea to take meter readings (and a photo of the readings) as they might prove useful later. Make a note of your account balance too. Keep any old bills you have, as these can help prove your payment history, credit balance or debt. If you aren't happy with your new supplier or tariff, you can switch suppliers. Look at "switch energy supplier" on our website or ring the Citizens Advice Consumer Helpline on 0808 223 1133.

Many people are seeing their energy bills increase significantly. If you are one of them, and worried about being able to meet these higher energy payments, please contact Citizens Advice on our Adviceline number 0808 278 7907.

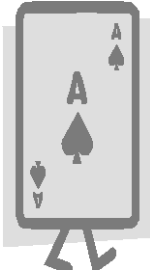
