### Rector's Reflections Four Words for Remembrance

Do you know Douai Abbey? It's only about half an hour's drive from here, and it's well worth a visit. The abbey church is open during the day, and visitors are welcome to come in and have a look around. It's a very peaceful space, I would heartily recommend a visit.

I popped into the abbey the other week, and spent some time in one of the chapels. The chapel has a stone altar, and around the top of the altar in an inscription in Latin. The inscription consists of four words: "Christus Rex Princeps Pacis". If you don't know Latin, the words can be translated into English as "Christ the King, the Prince of Peace". On the front of the altar is carved a crown of thorns, and in the centre of the crown of thorns is the Latin word "Pax". Pax is, of course, the Latin word for "peace". Douai Abbey belongs to the Benedictine religious order, and the search for spiritual peace is at the heart of the Benedictine life.

This month will see Acts of Remembrance in villages and towns across the country. As the names of the fallen are read out, we are reminded once again of the pain and suffering brought about by war. How are we respond? We can respond in practical ways, by supporting the work of charities who help members of the armed forces, and their dependents. But we can also respond by once again committing ourselves to the cause of peace.

Which brings us back to those four words on the altar at Douai Abbey. For Christians, Christ is our true king, and he demands our complete obedience. Christ works to bring peace to our world: inner peace, and peace in our relationships with one another and with God. Christ is indeed "Christus Rex Princeps Pacis" – "Christ the King and Prince of Peace". In the Beatitudes, Christ pronounces a blessing on those who seek out peace: "Blessed are the peacemakers for they will be called children of God". Notice that Christ does not promise that peacemakers will have an easy life, but he does promise that they will be blessed by God.

I wonder how we might be peacemakers in our own families and communities? Father Jason

This time we are looking at simple ways to make your home that little bit cosier this winter, and at the same time reduce your carbon footprint!



**Draught Proofing Your Home** Draught-proofing your home is one of the cheapest and most effective ways to save energy – and money. The great news is that installing draught-proofing is simple and can be carried out by most people themselves. Installers are available but will cost more than a DIY solution.



To draught-proof your home, you should block up unwanted gaps that let cold air in and warm air out. Saving warm air means you'll use less energy to heat your home, so you'll save money as well as making your home snug and warm.

Draughts enter your home around any gaps leading to the outside, such as doors, windows, chimneys, wall cracks etc. To identify draughts, just walk around your home and feel with your hand the draughts around these features or look for daylight coming in! For older homes you may be surprised just how much cold air comes in! Door and window gaps can be blocked by fitting DIY self-adhesive foam strips, rubber strips, or plastic or metal strips with brushes or wipers attached, for a longer lasting but slightly more costly solution. At the bottom of doors, a simple home-made 'sausage' can reduce draughts. These can be made from old tights or similar stuffed with any beyond-repair textile items e.g., socks.

If you have a chimney but don't use it, this may be worth draught-proofing. DIY draught excluders are available, or you may wish to leave this to a professional. Do remember that some rooms require ventilation, so don't over-do draught-proofing in kitchens and bathrooms where a lot of moisture is produced, or in rooms with open fires or open flues. **Reducing Heat Loss Through Windows** In addition to draught-proofing window frames, you may wish to consider improving the energy efficiency of the window unit. A potentially significant amount of heat can be lost directly through the window panes. If you currently have only single-glazed windows, you may wish to consider double or triple glazing. This can be expensive and may not be an option if you live in a conservation area or listed building. You can however consider much simpler and cheaper solutions.

Fitting a secondary pane of glass or transparent material over the inside of the window frame (making sure you leave an air gap between the outer glass pane and the secondary pane) can be an effective lower cost solution. DIY kits are readily available using acrylic sheets and magnetic or clip fixings. Or for an even cheaper and simpler but shorter lasting solution, use cling film taped to the window frame. Again, DIY kits for this are readily available from DIY stores.

Finally, heavy curtains, particularly if fitted with thermal linings, can reduce heat loss through a window at night, and will also reduce draughts. Make sure you open curtains on the South side during the day to take full advantage of heat from the sun. 

#### **HUGS November news** – Hagbournes and Upton Group for Sustainability

#### Owl update - Who gives a hoot? We all do!!!

It's been an owltastic year for East and West Hagbourne! Between 2021 and early 2022 we rolled out an amazing 7 Barn Owl boxes, 5 Tawny owl boxes and 9 Little Owl boxes in East and West Hagbourne. Boxes are sited across local farmland and gardens according to the type of box and potential new occupants. Surveys run from April for Tawny Owls, May for the Little Owls and June for the Barn Owls. Any chicks are weighed,



measured, aged and ringed – as are any adults without rings who are living with them. All these details go to the British Trust for Ornithology (BTO) database and the British Owl Project also keeps records - including notes on land use and state of habitat.

Installing a network of potential owl homes is a fantastic achievement - now we want to join them up with surrounding areas. New "home" uptake depends on good habitat to supply food for parents and chicks. We can all help provide for the owls by building a strong web of biodiversity for creatures above and below the soil line. So, whether you are wilding your garden, planting a hedge, creating linear areas of unmanaged grassland, or grazing livestock without using wormers (which improves grazing and insect life), you will be amazed at how fast wildlife and nature move in.

Get out and listen to the tawny owls - they are at their loudest now as they claim their territories. Let's help them by building the habitats they need to thrive. Light pollution seriously affects our nocturnal wildlife, so you can help right now just by turning off your outside lights at night.

Let's all give as many hoots as we can about owls!



### **Tribute to Bill Absolom** 21st April 1923 – 17th July 2022

Bill was born on 21st April 1923 in Warborough to Monty and Christina. He had two brothers, Don and Gordon. Bill went to school in Warborough and then, aged 11, to Dorchester. On leaving school Bill went into the grocery trade in Wallingford, cycling from Warborough each day, 6 days a week. At the outbreak of the Second World War he joined the Home Guard and when he reached 18, Bill joined the Royal Berks Regiment and later was transferred to the Royal Artillery.

The Royal Artillery eventually became The Maritime Royal Artillery and Bill then spent the rest of the War serving as a gunner on the merchant ships which were responsible for carrying supplies to Britain. There were large convoys of merchant ships, and the gunners were there to defend them. Bill travelled with the convoys to America, South America, Australia, South Africa, North Africa and also on the coal ships sailing around Britain. One incident involved a tanker carrying 10,000 tons of pure industrial alcohol on which Bill was one of two Royal Maritime Artillery gunners protecting the ship "British Respect". The ship was part of a convoy of ships sailing from the Bay of Gourock, Scotland and Bill's vessel was positioned right at the rear of the convoy, called "coffin corner" for obvious reasons! They proceeded to the Pentland Firth, and onwards to the Arctic Ocean passing the tip of Norway to Murmansk and Archangel. His ship left the convoy and went on to the White Sea where ice closed around them, and they became stuck. An ice-breaker was sent to their aid and they were eventually rescued and unloaded their cargo at the Kola Inlet to the relief of all concerned. Winston Churchill was to have said that the convoys going across the Arctic Ocean were on "the worst journey in the world."

Bill was a quiet, modest man and like a lot of ex-soldiers who have been on active service was quietly dismissive of his brave exploits. He was awarded the Arctic Star medal for his War Service. Bill was demobbed in December 1946 and married Heather in 1951, they celebrated their Platinum Wedding Anniversary in 2021. After the War Bill went back to his work in the grocery trade, then on to AERE Harwell and then on to British Leyland at Cowley until his retirement. Bill and Heather have lived in East Hagbourne for many years and have been very active members of the community. Bill was a member of the British Legion and was a familiar figure going around the village selling poppies in October and November. Bill enjoyed attending the Services at St Andrew's Church and was attending the church right up to the end of his life. He was a volunteer driver for the Oxfordshire Ambulance NHS Trust for nearly 16 years, sometimes going to the Oxford Hospitals two or three times a day to transport patients. Bill was a quiet man who loved his car and his local community.

Bill's health sadly deteriorated over the past few years and he became housebound. Heather would like to thank everyone, especially Marian, for their kindness and generosity with giving Bill lifts to hospital, doctors' appointments and to church.

Bill died on 17th July and his Funeral Service took place at St Andrew's on the 9th August. Heather and the family would like to thank Fr Jason and all who attended the Service and to the ladies who provided refreshments after the Service. Donations were given at the Service in memory of Bill to the Battersea Dogs and Cats Home. The charity have sent Heather a lovely letter to say "thank you" for the donation of £184.20.

#### **Comments from the East Hagbourne Parish Council Chairman**

**Housing Development by the Village Hall** The tidy up before the opening of the marketing suite was very quick and impressive. This suite is normally open on Fridays and Saturdays, and anyone can call in to see the model of the site, although appointments should be made for any sales related queries. The brick work has now started on several of the houses and the show house, normally the first to be built, should be completed by April next year with viewing from mid-May. It will probably be next summer before we will welcome newcomers to the village.

Substantial work on Main Road is required by OCC but the plans are that this will be done during school holidays, possibly next Easter.

When we hear of any greater than normal disruption, for example that a heavy vehicle needs to come through the central village, the Parish Clerk will broadcast such information on the village Facebook pages and on mail chimp. The Construction Plan does allow working on Saturday mornings although this will only happen infrequently and advanced notice will be given.

**Welcome Pack** The Welcome Pack will very shortly be ready for distribution. It consists of an A5 booklet with information on the village and village activities and some leaflets on specific activities. Although the primary audience for this pack is newcomers to the village, we have a large enough print run for some interested not-so-newcomers to have a copy. These will be available from the Village Shop, the Fleur and the Church.

**Waste disposal and recycling** Jessica Beare, the Waste and Recycling Officer for South and Vale, will give a short presentation in Hagbourne Village Hall on Friday 4th November at 7pm. Some refreshments will be available from 6.45pm. Jess will then be happy to field any questions concerning waste disposal and in particular on recycling. This will be your chance to get good clear information on what can and cannot be put in our green, black, brown, and food bins.

**Warm Hub** As announced separately in this magazine, one way of combating the colder weather is to come to the Hagbournes' warm hub in the Pavilion from 2-4pm on Wednesdays starting on the 2nd of November. This friendly social event accompanied by free hot drinks and "tasty goodies" is being organized by a number of villagers and sounds far preferable to shivering at home.

**Neighbourhood Plan** At the meeting in the Pavilion on Monday October 24th, Crispin Topping, chairman of the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group (NPSG) introduced the proposed updated plan and the reasons for doing this and spoke in details about the Design Code and its rationale. David Rickeard of the NPSG gave a presentation on the new section on biodiversity. After these very clear presentations the audience of around 30 villagers had the chance to ask questions and the meeting concluded shortly after 9.00pm. Comments can still be made on the draft plan, available on the village web site, and it is hoped to submit the plan formally to SODC in a few weeks.

**Parish surgeries** After a lively October surgery in the Fleur, I will hold my next surgery at the same venue from 5.00 to 6.30 on Friday 18th November when I look forward to discussing any items related to the parish and hopefully to address any concerns you may have.

**Parish Council meetings** Parish Council meetings are held in the Pavilion on the Recreation Ground. Members of the public are welcome to join the meeting and the agenda is posted on village notice boards and the village web pages at least three clear days before the meeting. The next meeting will be held starting at 7.30pm on Thursday 10th November. Let me remind you that this is not a formal or even approved article from the Parish Council but is rather a few words from me. Thus, anything in this article should not be construed as coming from or endorsed by the Parish Council. Iain Duff.

**FOOTWAY ACCESSIBILITY** An ongoing and increasing concern in the parish is finding the right balance between vegetation and footway accessibility. Some of the footways are narrow or raised by design, and the Parish Council has received a number of complaints that overhanging hedges or other plantings are restricting safe usage of the paths. Some of the complaints relate to established hedges and planting which is in need of significant cutting back ahead of ongoing maintenance in order to reclaim the footways. **Please could all residents review their boundaries and trim back to an appropriate extent so those with walking difficulties, wider buggies and mobility scooters may use them without getting caught in branches or low-level planting. Enforcement action may be required by the county council in some instances. Thank you in advance for your efforts to keep the parish both aesthetic and accessible.**
