

Rector's Reflections The Value of a Number

During November, our thoughts will naturally turn to Remembrance Sunday. We shall wear our poppies and remember with pride all who have served our country in war, and especially those who have been injured or killed. It is a sobering time.

As we hear the names of the fallen read out, we are often struck by the numbers who died in the 1st World War. There are historians who have tried to work out accurate totals for the number who killed in the Great War.


It is not a straightforward exercise, and the accuracy of any given figure can always be disputed. But having said this, total military deaths from United Kingdom and the colonies has been calculated at 887, 858. Total military deaths from France were greater: the numbers range between a low of 1,357,000 and a high of 1,397,800. Austria Hungary lost between 1,200,000 and 1,494,200. Losses in Germany were higher (2,037,000) and the highest number of military casualties of all were quite possibly in Russia (1,700,000 to 2,254,369). Totting up all the military deaths in the 1st World War, we come to a figure of between 8,573,058 and 10,824,240.

These are only military deaths. We can add to these totals civilian deaths, caused by military action and crimes against humanity. These deaths come to 2,250,099. We can then add civilian deaths due to malnutrition and disease. Excluding deaths caused by the flu pandemic, these come to between 5,411,000 and 8,100,000.

So at the most conservative estimate, the combined death toll in 1st World War, both military and civilian, was approximately 16 million.

This figure should shock us. It is a reminder of the sheer horror of war. But it is not just a piece of information. It should lead us all to re-double our efforts to be peace makers, in our communities and our world. I believe we can never try hard enough to do all that we can to avoid armed conflict taking place in the first place, and where it has occurred, to bring it to an appropriate end as soon as possible.

Jesus told his followers: "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God". Indeed, they shall. *Father Jason*



HUGS - Hagbournes and Upton Group for Sustainability

Go outside and take a deep breath! How nature reduces anxiety and improves health – proof at last!

We know intrinsically that nature is good for us but now botanist Kathy Willis, Professor of Biodiversity at Oxford University, has delved into how this magic works (*). Her research links the amount of green space in our lives and better health, mood and longevity.



Fascinating facts include:

- Our heart rate and blood pressure fall, stress hormones decrease and our brainwave activity is calmer and clearer when we are in nature
- Hospital patients recovering from surgery improve three times faster when they look out of windows at trees rather than seeing walls
- Cedar enhances cancer-fighting cells in our immune system
- The scent of roses helps people drive more calmly and safely
- Touching trees makes us feel calmer

Why not get out for more walks locally or visit some of the amazing (and free!) Earth Trust and BBOWT nature reserves near us. Enjoy surrounding yourself with green space and improve your health! Check out our HUGS 3 Village Wild Walk (including seasonal guides) - <u>https://www.hugsustainability.org/walk</u>

Our nearest nature reserve is the Earth Trust managed Mowbray Fields, in Didcot. Beautiful wildflower meadow in summer and ponds and marsh to explore from raised boardwalks - <u>https://earthtrust.org.uk/visit/mowbray-fields/</u>

If you want to explore further afield, these BBOWT reserves are 15 miles or less from the Hagbournes -

7 miles <u>Cholsey Marsh</u> Wallingford, OX10 9HH. Beautiful riverside marsh full of birds, plants and even the nationally rare Desmoulin's whorl snail.

10 miles <u>**Dry Sandford Pit</u>** Cothill, Oxfordshire. Amazing mosaic of fossil-packed cliffs, ponds and streams, grassland, scrub and woodland in an old quarry.</u>

11 miles <u>**Hitchcopse Pit</u>** OX13 5QF north-west of Abingdon. An old sandpit with fascinating plants and insects.</u>

12 miles <u>Hartslock</u> (Goring on Thames) RG8 0EP. Great views of the River Thames, sloping chalk grassland full of national plant rarities.

14 miles <u>Iffley Meadows</u> 1.5 miles south of central Oxford OX4 4B. Ancient wet meadows. **15 miles** <u>Snelsmore Common Country Park</u> 4 miles north-west of Newbury RG14 3BQ. Multiple pathways across beautiful heathland.

Comments from the East Hagbourne Parish Council Chairman

Conservation Area We have had a Conservation Area in the centre of the village since December 1970. This was expanded in October 1993, and an outline map of the area is in the file:

SODC did a nice Character Study of the Conservation Area in December 2000 which is included as Appendix 6 in our Neighbourhood Plan. There are currently 72 designated Conservation Areas in South Oxfordshire, and you might ask what does this mean? I got the following information from going to https://www.southoxon.gov.uk and click on Conservation Areas https://www.southoxon.gov.uk and clicking on Conservation Areas.

According to SODC: "Conservation areas are areas of special architectural or historic interest which have a specific character or appearance which enhances the local area. By designating a conservation area, it means these features are better preserved and helps to ensures it will continue its valuable contribution to the wider district." Perhaps it becomes clearer when we see from SODC that: "When we designate a conservation area it means that extra planning controls will apply to that area."

There are several headings for this in the SODC website. The main one's concern planning applications where one must provide sufficient detail to enable SODC to assess the impact of the proposed development on the character of area. Normally this is done through Heritage Appraisals and Impact Assessments or as part of a Design and Access Statement. There are also stronger controls on biodiversity. In principle, it should also include stricter controls on new developments that should preserve and enhance the conservation area.

Perhaps the area that causes most confusion for planning applicants and parish councillors is the implementation of permitted development where planning permission may be needed for works that do not normally require consent outside a conservation area, including the insertion of new dormers, roof extensions and cladding. Normally, the controls would be enforced if the change is visible from roads or footpaths and has a potential impact on the character of the conservation area.

However, this is often difficult to assess so the recommendation would be to consult with SODC planning to see whether an application should be made. In the cases where SODC recommend that a planning application is not necessary, then it would be advisable to keep evidence of this, in case someone thinks otherwise and lodges a complaint to the Parish Council. In the case of Kingsholme Close, a particularly iconic setting in the centre of the conservation area, an Article 4 Directions was made to make clear what applications normally covered by permitted development would need planning applications. Listed buildings also have much more restrictions and nearly always require a planning application. The General Permitted Development Order which governs all this is very detailed and quite hard to navigate but a useful website to find whether a planning application is needed is: <u>https://www.planningportal.co.uk/permission</u>

Another area where extra controls are enforced is for trees in the conservation area that we already discussed in the September Parish Magazine. This means that a formal application must be made if you are intending to top, lop, or fell a tree over 75mm in diameter at 1.5 metres from ground level. Of course, for chapter and verse on this, refer to the SODC webpages but among the more interesting controls are restrictions on outdoor advertisements, control over demolition or partial demolition of buildings over 115 cubic metres, and the power to seek repair of unoccupied buildings.

Parish Surgeries The next parish surgery will be in the Fleur de Lys on **Friday 15th November from 5.00 to 6.30pm.** However, feel free to contact me (iain.duff@easthagbourne.net), the clerk or any other councillor should you have urgent concerns.

Parish Council meetings The PC meetings are held in the Pavilion on the Recreation Ground. Members of the public are welcome to join the meeting, and the agenda is posted on village notice boards and the village web pages at least three clear days before the meeting. The next meeting will be held starting at 7.30pm on Thursday 14th November. Let me remind you that this is not a formal or even approved article from the Parish Council but is rather a few words from me. Bus service to the Churchill, Nuffield and Warneford Hospitals

The bus to catch for any of these hospitals from the centre of Oxford is number 15 which is every 1/4 hour during the day, taking 10-12 minutes, longer at busy times. You can catch it near the entrance to the Covered Market or near Queen's Lane. Those stops work whether you're connecting from Didcot with the Thames Travel X32 or, quicker but more walking, using the train from Didcot. The set down points are announced on the bus; for the Warneford, Warneford Road; for the Churchill, Roosevelt Drive; for the Nuffield, the stop is further on, called Lime Walk, and is actually in Old Road near the Old Road entrance to the hospital. The website for the 15 is https://www.oxfordbus.co.uk/services/OXBC/15, where you can also find a useful bus map and even live information. When using the X32 to Oxford, it's also possible to connect with the 15 near the Police Station, generally fewer people trying to get on at once.

The temporary bus timetable in operation while the gas works takes place on Main Road in East Hagbourne. On school days, the morning 94A trip will now leave Didcot Parkway at 0717 and serve Sandringham Road as an alternative for students who normally board in East Hagbourne. Both school journeys will then operate via Park Road and serve the Moor Lane bus stop in West Hagbourne for students who board here.

These school journeys will not serve East Hagbourne at all.

During the day, service 94A will operate via normal route to East Hagbourne, then divert via Blewbury and Upton to The Horse & Harrow pub in West Hagbourne, before returning towards Blewbury and resuming normal route. A map of the diverted route can be found <u>here</u>. The bus company apologise for any inconvenience this causes. The current aim is for Main Road to reopen around Christmas, from when service 94A will return to its normal route.
