idea for memorial

Parish Councillors have been considering the question of whether people might like to have a special place to plant trees in memory of deceased village residents, given that the garden by the bus shelter is fully planted and there are very few other places available in the village.

Sue Lay has suggested that people could plant a tree in memory of someone on the parish boundary, with of course the permission of the landowner.

The location of memorial trees and who they were planted for would then be marked on a map of the village and kept by the Parish Council and the Village History Society in perpetuity for all to see. Over time this would provide a long term record of people who have lived in West Hagbourne as well as enhancing the Parish borders.

mobile library - good news!

As of Friday 16th June, West Hagbourne will be getting a regular visit from the mobile library. It will stop in the village every other Friday. Details to follow on web site and notice boards.

It will have a good range of books for adults and children that are issued for four weeks. The mobile library will also carry audio books, videos and may carry DVD's too - videos and DVDs are loaned for one visit only. For a nominal charge, you will be able to order anything in the library catalogue. All the mobile libraries have a passenger lift.

If you are already a member of Oxfordshire Libraries, you need only to bring along your existing ticket to make use of the mobile library's facilities. If not bring along 2 forms of identification that show your name and address, and join straight away.

The use of the service will be reviewed regularly, and if demand warrants it then Oxfordshire Libraries will arrange a longer visit.

travel token changes

From the 1st April 2006 SODC will be offering those *over 60 a FREE bus pass*. This allows travel anywhere in South Oxfordshire, Reading and Oxford City. It also lets you to travel to Abingdon, Princes Risborough, High Wycombe, Stoke Mandeville Hospital and destinations on the way.

If you are *over the age of 70* you can now *choose* between the free bus pass, *or* £20 worth of travel tokens which can be used on bus, train, taxi or local voluntary transport schemes.

You need to apply for the bus pass, you will need a passport photo and you will have to submit an application form, please contact the clerk for further details.

The Parish Council does not supplement this, as this would mean another increase in the precept which is collected as part of your council tax bill.

parish council report

The Parish Council met on *Thursday 9th March* at Hagbourne School.

One member of the public attended the Open Forum and the new notice board and village map and the new concessionary fares were discussed.

Planning applications The Parish Council's objection to the revised planning application for Didcot West has been submitted.

CIIr. Patrick Greene has advised that there is likely to be further delay as the Highways Agency has objected on the grounds of additional traffic accessing the A34.

Planning permission for the conservatory at Fairview, York Road was granted.

The Planning Officer dealing with the barn conversion at Ivy Farm has advised that he is still waiting for further information from the applicant.

Experimental traffic proposals The County Council's Area Traffic Engineer has confirmed his agreement to replacing the white lines and any signs removed if traffic speeds are increased or other problems are identified. A decision will now be made on which signs can be removed and arrangements will now be made for the white line and signs to be removed.

Village tidy-up The village tidy-up will be on 22nd April. Volunteers will be sought to carry out other minor jobs, e.g. exposing the Foxglove Lane end of School Path which is lost under the mud.

The future of Didcot Bernard Mead attended a workshop held for parish councillors on the "Vision for Didcot's future".

Marion Judd has also attended a similar workshop although the emphasis was on Health Service provision in the town, although it also considered wider issues about Didcot's future.

Memorial tree planting A suggestion was made for a memorial grove for the village to be included in the Parish Plan. The Parish Council has decided instead to facilitate memorial tree planting along the parish boundaries with the locations of each tree recorded on a map and this will now be included in the Parish Plan. Of course landowners' permission will be needed for any planting and the Parish Council feels it should create a map showing land ownership in the parish.

The new notice board and map The new notice board purchased for the Village History Group's new village map is now in place and the new map will now be fitted as soon as possible. Future use of the old notice board, perhaps as a third parish notice board, will be discussed by the parish council.


Parish Plan Progress is being made, and it is now in its final stages. The first village coffee morning has been held and was most successful.

Land adjacent to Horse and Harrow The ground was not cleared in January as expected. Chilton Construction now say they will clear the ground during March.

It was agreed that the *Annual Parish Meeting* will be on *Saturday 20th May* and will be held in the garden of Broomsticks (by kind permission of Marion Judd).

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on *Thursday 11th May* at Hagbourne School. This will be preceded by the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council.

farming and the Countryside

The application of fertiliser is in progress, the spring beans have been planted and where the ground is hollow underneath the growing corn has been rolled, what we need now is a good dose of rain!

We have had to keep the bangers active on the rape and bean fields as the pigeons and rooks are having a wonderful time digging out and eating all the young shoots. There are a lot of rookeries around it must have been a prolific breeding season last year.

The lapwings are back in the field behind the house but I doubt they will nest there as it is a winter crop and it grows too high for them, they prefer a spring crop or fallow which of course with the change in farming practices the majority of cropping is done in the autumn.

We have been tidied up the horse paddocks and chain harrowed them to promote new grass growth. Fencing has been erected, stables renovated where necessary, and the livery is full to capacity at the moment, with the added addition of a foal to everybody's delight! (In the last paddock near the embankment).

Quote from local RSPB – Did You Know? – 'You would think that tawny owls must have 20:20 vision to be able to fly around in the middle of the night, but in fact, their eyesight isn't much better than ours. Their secret is to know every inch of their territory like the back of their wing, so that they can fly from memory. It's their fantastic hearing that enables them to pinpoint their prey'.

The pond has some water in it as last, without a decent regular top up during the next few months it will be dry again before the end of summer, the streams are also very low for the time of year.

With Spring just around the corner, the daffodils should be at their height of splendour for Easter and our village should look wonderful.

parish plan steering group

The Parish plan made considerable progress over the past year. Villagers were invited to see the outcome of the Parish Survey at drop-in meetings in Upton and East Hagbourne Village Halls. They were also asked to sign up for those projects that they were most keen to see taken forward.

The greatest support was expressed for a Transport and Traffic lobby group and it is planned to arrange their first meeting in April.

Interest was expressed in having some day time social events and a successful coffee morning was organised by Val Walton and Hazel Rack. It is hoped that this will prompt further events.

A Village French conversation group that meets once a month was also established following the drop in meetings. Do you have an interest you would like to share? It is not too late to include this in the plan.

Marion Judd has been seeking suitable sites for a Memorial Grove and a suggestion has been made and which will be pursued. To plant trees around the Parish Boundary. These trees would be marked on a master plan, perhaps displayed in the village, and would provide some formal expression of the historic extent of the parish, hopefully resisting further erosion. Other projects under way include the preparation of a 'Welcome Pack' for new villagers, which will be managed by Andrea Mitchell and Mary Ann Butler, and the establishment of a 'personal' column in the village newsletter..

The Steering Group will be working on producing a written plan in the next few weeks and this will be circulated to all households for comments. They will then arrange a meeting to formally adopt the plan and to establish how progress to delivery will be monitored. Your help continues to be essential to the success of any plan adopted.
