accidents happen

Within a week, there were two significant collisions in the west end of the village. A multiple vehicle incident happened at the foot of Hagbourne Hill which saw the Air Ambulance land by Scotland's Ash and required the

Fire Brigade to cut a driver free from the wreckage.







On another day, a head on collision involving two cars happened right outside the Horse & Harrow

Concern has been raised over the perceived speed on this stretch of Main Street, but measurement of flow and actual recorded speed in the last week of November in 2008, shows that only 12 vehicles were travelling between 46 and 51mph - nothing faster.

The mean average speed of traffic travelling westbound was measured as 31.2mph whilst the Eastbound result was lower at 25.5mph.

long term traffic plan

Oxfordshire County Council has recently published its South Central Oxfordshire Traffic Strategy (SCOTS) report, which has considered the impact and requirements of traffic in the Didcot / Wantage area.


The report considers the impact of increased vehicular usage and mathematical modelling on what would happen if things like a perimeter road was added to Didcot, improvements were made to Featherbed lane or if some roundabouts were improved, including

Much of this document is hypothetical, but it does try to answer where the most sustainable location for new growth could be, in transport terms. This inevitably puts forward the conclusion that Didcot, and its proposed development sites best meet the criteria for the 'specific area' under consideration.

The Parish Council does not believe that its conclusions make sense and intend to question OCC.

now what?

In one very detailed submission to SODC, a planning consultant (RPS) has proposed a site for development that swallows up Coscote and all of the land stretching from the A420 to A417. The boundary of the area comes right up to the back gardens of Main Street, Manor Close and York Road with no buffer zones shown



The proposals will be considered in South Oxfordshire District Council's core strategy for the period 2016-26 which is still being prepared.

The Vale of White Horse have already included the part of this area which is in their District in their draft core strategy which is in consultation now. See the web site for links to the documents and higher resolution maps

The Parish Council is very concerned that these proposals must have been discussed in advance of them being made public, and as a result of the Vales decision to move forward on this specific area, the Hagbournes are now under significant threat of being subsumed by Didcot.

These plans gather pace and appear to represent a real threat to West Hagbourne, its conservation area, and the maintenance of a significant rural gap between settlements. SODC policies should protect its rural villages and the best agricultural land but they are under strong pressure from central Government to deliver building sites for thousands more houses and seem to have decided on Didcot as the best location. Meanwhile developers would rather put all the houses in one site than provide infrastructure to several locations.

If the proposals are implemented in their present form, the Parish of West Hagbourne could be reduced to half of its present area

With Great Western Park, already approved, it appears that the consultation process is about to

West Hagbourne residents should make sure that SODC is no doubt how they feel about the proposed traffic schemes and development sites at every opportunity.

It was agreed that the BT phone box should be kept in the village and adopted by the Parish, though in a non operational state – Clerk to investigate cost of "adopting it". The History Group had supported this option in advance of the meeting.

Freedom of Information

Sweaty palms? Dry mouth? Heart beating fast?

As a parent, it can be very stressful going into school to hear about your child's progress, even when your child is doing well. You wonder what the teacher is going to say and hope there aren't any problems.

For parents whose children have additional needs, for example SEN/LDD (Special educational needs/learning difficulties and/or disabilities) those feelings of stress can be multiplied several times over. Even keeping up with the changing jargon in education can be a challenge!

It's so much easier if they have someone at the meeting with them so that they can be sure they heard what was being said or be clear what has been agreed. Having the chance to talk things through beforehand with someone who is good at listening can make all the difference. It helps a parent make sure they are clear about what they want to say at the meeting and helps everyone focus on what is important for their child.

Could you support a parent in this way? All you need is

- Some spare time
- An interest in education
- To be good at listening and seeing things through

It doesn't require a regular time commitment; you get to decide how much time you can offer.

Training is provided and all expenses paid so you won't be thrown in at the deep end or out of pocket.


new waste collection services

A new service for rubbish and recycling will start in South Oxfordshire in <u>June</u> of this year (and in the Vale of White Horse from October 2010) with the introduction of wheelie bins.

The District Council will be running a full communications campaign to inform residents of the changes and the roll out of the scheme.

The 'new service' will include:

- weekly separate food waste collection in a kerbside bin
- fortnightly *residual waste* collection in wheeled bins
- fortnightly collections of dry recyclables in wheeled bins (which will now include glass)



Over the next few South Oxfordshire will be working closely with Town and Parish councils to identify those properties that may have difficulties storing and using wheeled bins and to provide

footpath improvements

After many years of lobbying by the Parish Council, responding to requests to make it possible to safely walk along this part of Main Street without getting wet feet; the footway between York Road and the Horse& Harrow has been recently been resurfaced.

A solution to the constant dislodging of the kerbing has been implemented, with posts now protecting the ramped areas which replace the exposed corners that kept being

The construction of the cobblestone kerbing has been changed around the manholes which sit on the line of the kerb, and the path itself re-aligned and the grass verges tidied up.

Concerns over the visibility of the hardwood posts have been raised and the Highways Department have given assurances that reflective roundels will be affixed soon.
