50mph

The Highways department currently have plans which the Parish Council has supported, to implement a 50mph speed limit along the stretch of the A417 that comes through the Parish. The main aim is to reduce accident rates and as there were several major incidents at the junction with Hagbourne Hill. So this can only be seen as a good thing.

Fire

The arson of an enormous straw stack to the north of the village last month, which was reported by a vigilant villager, reminds us how destructive fire can be (picture below by Malcolm Brownsword)

Chimneys

The number of chimney fires has been on the increase in recent years, as the more people use open fires. This is especially concerning for villages like the Hagbournes that contain thatched buildings.

Recorded incidents in Oxfordshire have increased by around five per cent over the last four years, and in January 2009, crews in the south of Oxfordshire attended nearly twice the number of chimney fires (21) compared with 2008 (12).

Regular sweeping and maintenance of chimneys eliminates the build-up of soot. It also clears obstructions such as birds' nests, leaves and other debris. It's an easy step to take to make sure that your home is safer.

Calming

The County Council has now acknowledged that the existing road networks would not cope with the increased employment and housing being proposed at Didcot and that stronger transport links between housing and employment locations such as the Harwell Science and Innovation Campus (SIC) and Milton Park are needed:

Their proposals include:

- a Harwell Strategic Link Road from the A4130 east of the Milton Interchange to the A417
- relief to the Rowstock Junction to include a Harwell Field Link Road from the A417 to Harwell SIC on the A4185, increased capacity at the campus entrance, and improvements to the Featherbed Lane junctions.
- traffic calming through the villages of Harwell, East and West Hagbourne
- improvements to bus services throughout the area
- improvements to cycling links between Didcot and both Milton Park and Harwell SIC

There will now be local consultation and despite some of these items being required NOW, it may be many years before any of this is implemented.

NO changes to access onto the A₃₄ at Chilton were included.

Action Day

On Saturday 14th November we are hoping as many people as possible, young and old alike will come out and do their bit around the village.

There are lots of areas which need tidying up, including kerbs, paths, verges and boundaries that have become overgrown or gathered rubbish.

If everyone does a little in their part of the village an enormous difference could be made - so if you want to help planting hedge plants, clear brambles, or collect litter everyone will be welcome.

So those of you with paths beside your properties with weeds that need scraping out, hedges that are overhanging or fence lines that face public paths and you are prepared to put in an hour to improve the condition of your village - please come out and do your bit on the 14th.

The Pond needs the weed removing, autumn bulbs need planting, benches need scrubbing down.

If you have a petrol hedgecutter, strimmer or a bush saw, there are parts of the lanes / footpaths which need cutting back and clearing. We'll also need people to move rubbish, watch bonfires, fetch and carry, rake up and do all sorts of little jobs.

There'll be a list by the bus shelter, so come along, decide how much or how little you can do, and let's see what can be done in just one day.

Housing

In the Parish plan there was an indication that the Parish as a whole would support a few additional houses being built in the village. Affordable housing for local people is quite difficult to facilitate in small settlements but it is possible.

If you would like to express a view on this, you can help inform the Parish Council about how many local people would be interested in this sort of scheme by talking to a Councillor or you can write to the Clerk.



In an article about the village conservation area in the August newsletter, Roger Sweet asked some questions which the History Group may be able to answer.

We responded to the Proposed Conservation Area Character Appraisal and Management Plan for West Hagbourne in 2005, suggesting the extension of the conservation area west of Manor Farm to include the Horse and Harrow as a building of local note and of special historic interest.

We know that the Horse and Harrow existed in 1754 but it is probably much older than that. It has historic links with Morlands Brewery at West Ilsley and may well have been one of its first tied estates. The area adjoining it was once the site of a toll gate and toll house. It was known as Scotlands Ash Turnpike Gate and belonged to the owners of the Horse and Harrow in 1888.

The Horse and Harrow is one of West Hagbourne's oldest buildings and, in the absence of a church, village hall or shop, our only 'public' building. It has always played an important part in the life of this rural community and is an integral part of its history, making it a building of historical and cultural significance – two of the criteria for listed building status.

Furthermore, with an eye to the future and the very real threat of further expansion into our parish from the north west it's important to provide as much protection as possible for this historic building.

The Horse and Harrow has been under threat of closure in the recent past, for want of a landlord. If this happens again the owners could easily decide to close it down like so

many other pubs throughout the country

By placing the Horse and Harrow within a designated conservation area as a building of local note, it makes it much more difficult to destroy it.

On a final note, the building may not be of architectural significance but it does sit invitingly at the western approach to our village with its frontage facing the main road, providing a pleasing welcome to West Hagbourne.

The History Group

Moor Lane

Oxfordshire Conservation Volunteers spent a full day in the lane in September and the results of removing several tonnes of bramble and dead wood is really quite dramatic.

Under the advice of Cynth Napper various habitats were retained and some created, and masses of bramble and dead wood was removed from the watercourse.

Some of the views out from the lane across towards the old railway line have been restored and during the winter months we hope to restore some of the hedge planting.

A few of us tackled the upper ditch beside Thatch Cottage and despite disturbing a wasps nest, cleared lots of dead wood and nettles, which should allow the grass verge to fully recover, and now its almost ready for some native bulb planting which will be undertaken some time in mid November.

Tests will be made by appointment at Didcot Fire Station.

The testing team will collect and deliver blankets for people who have severe mobility problems or have no means of getting the blanket to the testing venue.

John Baille will now look after the web site and anything sent to the webmaster will be dealt with as usual.


The Council had no strong views on one small planning application at 13 York Road, and was advised that SODC has approved an extension at Scotland's Ash Garage.
