Local Housing

The Parish Council have been asked to look into the feasibility of a small local development in the village to provide some low cost housing aimed specifically at local people..

Clearly there are many issues here, and whilst the Parish Plan clearly shows there is support for a small number of additional houses in the village, their location and support from the local planning authorities does have some implications.

The Oxfordshire Rural Community Council and the county council are working to reverse this trend. Their aim is simple: identify local need, locate local land - and knit the two together. Even where the supply of homes keeps pace with demand, prices are normally way beyond the reach of average incomes. The potential consequences are all too easy to imagine – fewer young families, vanishing shops and pubs, shrinking schools, under-used facilities and communities with a disproportionate number of older people.

With at least one offer of a parcel of land having been made which might be appropriate , the Council intends to undertake a housing needs survey to gauge what the local demand would actually be for this sort of housing. The process is complicated and many criteria need to be met in order that this sort of project could be

initiated, but if anyone would be willing to help in gathering the information it would be very much appreciated. Please contact the Clerk or a Councillor if you could spare some time to assist with this project.

Poor roads

Although there has been some fast and furious patching around the village recently please report any potholes to the Highways department as soon as they appear.

Moor Lane

Because of building work being carried out at several houses that back onto Moor Lane, there have been several complaints about the state of the verges, caused by large vehicles using the lane to access sites and deliver materials. Other large vehicles have compounded the damage, and the weather has made matters worse.

The owners of the properties have been contacted and have given their assurances that the verges will be rectified by February when work is due to be completed.

Additional work further down the lane will be carried out by the Oxfordshire Conservation
Volunteers who intend to spend a full day cutting back more of the overgrown brambles.

Budget

Hagbourne Hall

The Parish Council have agreed to make a substantial contribution to the proposed extension to Hagbourne Village Hall.

The extension plans include significant improvements to the toilets, a larger covered entrance area and the addition of a small meeting room with storage space

Parish councillors have therefore agreed that West Hagbourne will contribute to the funds provided by East Hagbourne in proportion to the relative population ratio, and the payments will be spread over the next three years.

This will result in a small increase to your Council Tax. Because the budget for this Parish has been so tightly managed over the past six years any change to the precept will naturally appear as significant change but in real terms a Band C property will pay less than £10 extra per year.

The village hall provides a valuable asset to all of us living in the Hagbournes. It provides a central resource for large events, the Village Association uses it, as does the Gardening Club and it enables the pre-school nursery to operate in close proximity to Hagbourne Primary school.


The Parish Council agreed its budget submission for 2010 and this is now available on the web site.
