# Footpaths

The Parish Council have recently been approached by both the Ramblers Association and several residents expressing their concern over the changes made to a number of our rights of way.

The County Council has spoken to the appropriate landowners and reminded them of their legal obligations and responsibilities.

The worst affected footpath from Moor Lane across toward Upton should be improved when ploughing is completed, stiles will be installed on the deviated footpath between East Hagbourne and Blewbury and the Rights of Way Officer will monitor the significant changes which were made to Moor Lane.

# St George





The Council plan to attend a summit in Didcot held by Oxfordshire County Council to address how local communities interact with Council Officers and locally elected members of Councils at all levels.


The Council agreed to defer any consideration of a housing needs survey as the land under discussion will no longer be available.
