Annual Parish Meeting

The Annual Parish Meeting took place on 17 May 2012 in Hagbourne Village Hall. Over twenty members of the public. The Minutes are available on the village website. There was agreement that a VAS unit should be installed near to the Horse Harrow to warn people if they are exceeding the 30 mph speed limit as they approach the main part of the village. There was also general approval for the "20 is Plenty" sticker system, with stickers being placed on waste bins. It was felt that there should be a Parish Meeting on a summer afternoon, in addition to one that complies with the law.

Tyrrell Trust: Grants available for residents in 2012

Green Deal on the Horizon

The Green Deal is a government scheme created under the Energy Act 2011. It provides a framework for householders to access energy saving measures at no up-front cost. So, what does this mean? Essentially, you'd get an assessment to look at what the householders would most benefit from, and that fits within the 'Golden Rule' more on this later. If you wished for example, solid wall insulation and a new high efficiency boiler to go ahead, then you'd get a low-interest loan for the costs involved. The Golden Rule is that payback of this loan should come from savings that the householder makes as a result of the improvements being made, and full payback much be made within a 25 year time period (or earlier in the case of some technologies). The loan is attached to the electricity meter at the house, so wouldn't need to be paid off when you sold your home, unless you chose to. Repayments of the loan are collected by the electricity supplier.

Greg Barker, Minister of State has described the Green Deal as "the biggest home improvement programme since the Second World War". However, in the case of loft and cavity wall insulation, current funding which makes this available, professionally installed, for free will end when the Green Deal comes in. This means that there are only a few weeks left (likely to be until end September) to make this energy efficiency improvement. The 'Oxfordshire Affordable Warmth Network' can help, and is supported by your local council. The VAS is now in operation on the road from the Horse and Harrow. The Parish Clerk is arranging for a stock of "20 is Plenty" stickers to be obtained, for distribution to those who wish to use them. The Council was asked to comment on proposals for construction traffic travelling to and from the Bloor Homes site on Park Road. We had previously made representations on construction traffic in our objections to the plans. The proposals state clearly the construction traffic is not to pass through West Hagbourne. There is an exemption for local cars and vans carrying workers to the site, but we have asked that even they been discouraged for passing through West Hagbourne. The Council is investigating options for an informal summer meeting.

Bonfires


