## Tour of Britain

## Rain Again

It seems the weather truly is becoming more extreme. On Friday 19th September around an inch and a half of rain fell in about 30 minutes. Gutters overflowed, water swept down the roads and then gathered in the usual low spots; Brook Lane, York Road by York Farm and on Main Street by Green Thatch.

A broken down car by Appledore caused some traffic chaos, and vehicles soon reverted to their winter flooding route of taking the 'village only' diversion in York Road. However, Chris Lay and Dave Carter were soon on the scene clearing out

the culverts and drains to allow this water to drain and a police car turned up to help divert the traffic and then push the car out of the flood.

The flooding in York Road caused problems for the children coming home on the school bus as they were stranded on the bus shelter side but needed to get further up York Road. Luckily Dickie Allen came to the rescue and drove through the water to collect the four children and then ferried them across in his car. The next day more remedial work was carried out in York Road to try to ensure that the water drains away better in future. Luckily there was no flooding of property.

## Village garden...

Autumn is well underway but there is still some colour in the bus shelter garden, largely courtesy of the salvia family. Over the past couple of weeks, daffodil bulbs (*Tete a tete*, a sturdy low-growing variety) have been planted among the perennial plants to provide early spring colour. For the moment, the planters under the tree have chrysanthemums in them, but soon these too will be replaced by daffodil bulbs, ready for spring. More work will be carried out on the beds over winter to ensure continuity of colour throughout the year.

Sue and Dave would like to acknowledge the important contributions made to their gardening efforts by Hugh and Tracy at The Square (water and brown bin access), Robert at Woodleys (mowing, cutting back, watering, sweeping and general maintenance), and Jackie and Barry (Witchaven) and Michael (Thatch Cottage) for their tireless efforts to sweep up the straw. Thanks too to Mary Ann (Blissetts) for tending the planter by the pond. Many people contribute unseen to the benefit of the village, so thanks to them too.

## Defibrillator

There are around 60,000 out-of-hospital cardiac arrests in the UK every year. Acting quickly when someone is in cardiac arrest and fighting for their life is crucially important. According to the NHS sudden cardiac death kills 100,000 people every year in the UK.

Lots of people feel this is a good idea and after an initial flurry of activity, we now need to focus on how we will raise the remaining money to put an **Automated External Defibrillator** in the telephone box.

There has been some discussion about how useful this might be and the need to have trained volunteers to make use of it in an emergency yet there is support for project from the local Ambulance Services.

The unit would only be unlocked by a code given by the 999 operator in an emergency and a voice system talks the user through each stage of the process.



In addition to the cost of the defibrillator, it will be necessary to find an annual sum for maintenance costs.

The Parish Council has already agreed to contribute and to provide a banking service for any funds raised.

We have already received several generous donations from individuals, but we need lots more and hope that everyone will contribute what they can.

# News

## the Countryside

We have had a beautiful English summer. The wheat harvest has been really good with high yields, although corn prices are depressed because the UK has a three million tonnes surplus and everywhere globally has had a good harvest. The rape was average and the poppies excellent with a high morphine content.

We have planted next year's rape, and it is all showing which is great. The first wheats have all been planted and when the drill comes back from Wallingford (we share it with a neighbour) we will carry on planting the second wheats. Planting conditions are excellent.

When the cultivations were in progress, over at Blewbury I counted 27 Red Kites and loads of Seagulls following behind, an amazing sight.

The trees along next to the stream at the east side of the farm yard have been cut down ready for cleaning out the stream with an excavator. Hopefully this will aid flood water to escape should we have another wet winter again.

A pair of Kingfishers have been residing along the back stream behind the farm; now it is cleared I do hope they will come back. We found a Crested Newt in one of the ponds but not a sign of the Water Voles - I think they have gone. Kestrels nested in the box and the Buzzard settled in the large trees at the back. A smaller group of Swifts were around our end of the village this year. I love to see them and hear them screech across the sky in the evenings. They were gone in early August. The Swallows and House Martins have now left. I think some of them managed to rear a third brood so hopefully more will return from Africa next summer!

Just as a point of interest, we were in Cookham, Bucks at the weekend and we saw a small flock of green parrots.

I personally didn't realise that they had colonised quite so near to us so if anyone else has seen any I would be interested to know... **Sue Lay**

## CAB-broadband

If your broadband connection is really slow and unreliable and you've contacted your provider who has said you'll need to pay more than £100 to cancel the contract. Is there anything you can do about this? Our advice:

One of the main ways that you can get yourself a better broadband service is to switch supplier. It's become much easier to switch broadband providers in recent years, which in turn has led to better deals for consumers. Some companies, however, charge cancellation fees that can go into hundreds of pounds.

Most broadband contracts operate for a fixed term (12 or 18 months), and users can be charged for prematurely ending the contract. It is therefore important to check the terms of your contract before entering the switching process. If you are looking to move to another company because you are having problems with your broadband service, make sure you tell them about the problems. Record dates and times of the issues you have had, so you have evidence that shows why you're ending the contract and switching. If you have already complained about these problems it is worth reminding the firm of that fact.

## Hare coursing

With the introduction of the Hunting Act 2004 in February 2005, all forms of hare coursing are banned in the UK.

Hare coursing is a seasonal crime and usually begins as soon as crops are harvested. With an early harvest this year there have already been several reported incidents in South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse.

Hares are in decline and their destruction is a concern. But with hare coursing there is also associated criminal damage - to fencing and hedging to gain access, and to the land with the indiscriminate use of vehicles. It is also not unusual for hare coursers to intimidate landowners and other users of the land, such as ramblers.



### How to recognise hare coursing

Hare coursers tend to travel in groups, usually in 4x4 vehicles (the Subaru is often the vehicle of choice), with dogs, which are generally lurchers. You might see them parked up by a field, gathering in a field, or walking in a line abreast across a field.

If you believe hare coursing is taking place call the police (999) from a safe location tell them what you have seen give them the location of the incident – try to be as precise as possible using landmarks or road junctions say how many people are involved and give a good description, if you can describe any vehicles you have seen if possible, state how many dogs are involved if the suspects leave, try to determine their direction of travel do NOT approach the offenders yourself or put yourself at any risk. Thames Valley Police take hare coursing very seriously and will respond to any incident.

# Health Matters

## Flu jabs

It's time to book your annual flu jab appointment. Those most 'at risk' include people aged over 65, pregnant women, anyone with a long term condition like asthma, diabetes, heart disease, chronic kidney and liver disease, neurological disease or with a weakened immune system. GP practices across Oxfordshire will be holding seasonal flu vaccination clinics from October, and 'at risk' patients are advised to contact their practice and book an appointment for a jab.

Carers Oxfordshire which is funded by Oxfordshire County Council, discovered almost 3,000 unknown carers in the county thanks to a series of activities during Carers Week in June and a month long pharmacy campaign run in partnership with OCCG.

# Bus Review

The only Bus serving West Hagbourne is the 94/95 Circular service which links us to Didcot. It is at risk as tenders come under scrutiny by Oxfordshire County Council.

Every year the subsidy costs £79,591 but only an average of 151 passenger journey happen each day.

The transport Officers' commented that early morning and later evening journeys are little used.

Continuation of these facilities may be prove unsustainable and some changes to the service may be necessary, particularly if tender prices for these routes increase.
