Village Walk

The village walk, which was organised by the West Hagbourne Village Association, took place on Sunday, 8th January.

Thankfully, after a rainy morning, the skies cleared for the afternoon when a group of 15, accompanied by 3 dogs, gathered for a New Year's walk. Having met at The Square, we crossed Main Street into Moor Lane, then once under the railway bridge, we turned left onto Church Path towards East Hagbourne. In East Hagbourne, we walked through the churchyard, then turned immediately right to meet up with the Fieldside path. After passing Captain's Cottage in Fieldside, we turned left along the little footpath and came out at Lower Cross on Blewbury Road.

Next, we walked towards Didcot along New Road, passed the Post Office, then turned off left along the path which skirts Millennium Wood, to meet the railway line.

We crossed over onto Mowbray Field where we paused briefly for a photo., then walked back along the line, down onto Church Path and into the village along Foxglove Lane. Finally, we returned to The Square having covered a distance of 2.84 miles in exactly 1hour and 30 minutes.

All walkers agreed that it had been a very enjoyable experience, and expressed a wish for another walk to be organised. This will be discussed at the next WHVA meeting later this month, so watch this space!

Garden Town

The SODC and the Vale are developing a delivery plan for Didcot Garden Town with a team of consultants to improve the existing town and link the new residential areas, enterprise zones and science campuses. Although West Hagbourne lies outside of the boundary of the planned Garden Town it is within the designated area of influence. It is important that as many people as possible have their say and help shape the vision for the future of Didcot.

For the village it is crucial that our views are well represented since these may differ from the residents of Didcot. If the consultants assign importance to views expressed by the largest number of respondents, we have to make sure lots of us respond.

A new interactive <u>Didcot Garden</u> <u>Town website</u> has been launched on which anyone can leave comments and suggestions. So far there are already comments about the amount of traffic through the village and the effects of recent and planned road changes. There are also references to maintaining the gaps between Didcot and the surrounding villages. You can easily add your views to the map and move the interests of our residents at the top of the agenda.

NHS issues

The Oxfordshire Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) has launched a "Big Health & Care" public consultation which runs between 16th Jan to 9th April 2017.

The consultation is concerned with the new NHS Sustainability and Transformation plans the CCG is obliged to implement.

A consultation event is being held in Didcot on Monday 13th February between 10am – 12pm in the Didcot Leisure Centre, Mereland Road. Spaces are limited and must be booked in advance.

Editor's note:

Sustainability and transformation Plans (STPs) are five year plans for the future of health and care service provision in local areas.

STPs represent a very significant change to the planning of health and care services in England. (King's Fund,Nov-16). Due to the ongoing shortfall in NHS funding, there will be a financial gap running into hundreds of millions of pounds by 2020/21 in most of the (STP) footprints (Chris Ham, CEO, King's Fund 2017). This means that we are about to experience significant changes and cuts in healthcare provision in Oxfordshire, and similarly across England. The CCG has no other choice but to implement these plans.

These plans will result in changes to the way our healthcare is delivered, and cuts to NHS services and hospital beds nationally are likely along with care becoming more difficult to access. Many commentators now believe that cuts to NHS funding, services, and the STPs are precursors to our government moving England towards an insurance-based US style health service.

Debt Advice

More people saddled with unmanageable debts are turning to Citizens Advice, leading the charity to call for people to seek help before they reach crisis point.

Nationally, a rising number of people have resorted to a debt relief order (DRO) since the amount of debt covered by a DRO rose from £15,000 to £20,000 last October.

DROs are a last resort for people who have exhausted all options for repaying their debts and won't be able to pay in the near future. They work by "pausing" most of your debts for a year so that your creditors can't chase you for repayment. At the end of the year, unless your circumstances change, your debts will be written off.

Debt write-offs can have a serious impact on people's credit rating, which makes it more difficult to take out more credit agreements or even open a new bank account.

Citizens Advice is now urging people who are failing to keep on top of their debts to seek advice early, so that they have the best chance of managing their debts.

An adviser stressed: "We will discuss your individual situation and look at the options available to you, so that you can make an informed decision about the best debt management for you."

Unitary Council

Oxfordshire currently has six councils – one county council, four district councils and one city council. Its suggested that all six councils should be ABOLISHED and be replaced by just ONE new council for the whole of Oxfordshire.

One Oxfordshire believes the current system is complicated, wasteful and no longer financially sustainable. Without change, important local services could be further reduced and some may have to be cut altogether.

It could save over £100m in the first five years - money that could be used to improve local services and keep council tax down.

This is called a 'unitary' council. One council for Oxfordshire could be simpler, better for services, more local and cost less to run.

The compound by the Kingswell is taking shape ahead of main work commencing on the link road that will run parallel to the A₃₄ linking the Wantage Road.

Note this will mean the old path The Driftway which runs between Harwell and West Hagbourne will once again be diverted.

Be Aware!

The police have recently reported a spate of local break-ins and power tool thefts from garden sheds and parked vans.

Also, fraudsters are emailing members of the public who are expecting to make a payment for property repairs. The fraudsters will purport to be a tradesman who has recently completed work at the property and use a similar email address to that of the genuine tradesman. They will ask for funds to be transferred via bank transfer. Once payment is made the victims of the scam soon realise they have been deceived when the genuine tradesman requests payment for their services.

Protect yourself

Always check the email address is exactly the same as previous correspondence with the genuine contact.

For any request of payment via email verify the validity of the request with a phone call to the person who carried out the work.

Check the email for spelling and grammar as these signs can indicate whether or not the email is not genuine.

Payments via bank transfer offer no financial protection; consider using alternative methods such as a credit card or PayPal which offer protection and give you an avenue for recompense.

This week people have been going round the village offering to do property maintenance or repair work. The police advise that no one should ever accept offers from strangers on your doorstep. It is extremely unsafe to do so as scams are likely. If you need work done, you should approach builders or other maintenance persons of your own choice, yourself. If anyone is concerned about being approached by people offering property services, or have seen your neighbours being targeted or are concerned for vulnerable residents, please contact the police on 01865 841148 or 101.


