### HGVS

A weight check was conducted recently in West Hagbourne. A Trading Standards employee was stationed at the junction of Foxglove Lane and Main Street on Thursday 23 March, monitoring through traffic. It is not clear if any overweight vehicles came through the village during the period of monitoring, but it is reassuring to know that occasional checks are being made.

### Broadband

A planning notification was sent to SODC in February for the installation of a brand new telecommunications cabinet on the the Horse Chestnut tree in the corner of York Road and Main Street, beside Lizard Bank with FTTC (Fibre to the Cabinet).

This will mean that West Hagbourne residents should at last be able to access the 'superfast' broadband speeds that have been available to other properties in the Blewbury Exchange for some time. No date has been given for the start of the work but hopefully it will be within the next few months.

### NHS Future

Further to the article on the OCCG **Big Health & Care public** consultation (February Newsletter), at the meeting held in Didcot on 13th February it became clear that insufficient information is being provided to allow the public to make informed responses to the consultation. The changes proposed could have far reaching effects on patients from the local community. We can expect to lose a number of beds at both the JR and the Churchill hospitals, at a time when, judged by the widespread housebuilding, the local population is set to increase. Underpinning the planned bed reduction is the idea that more services should be provided within the community, but this is set against the existing shortfall in staff, including GPs and nurses. At the same time, introducing such fundamental change is likely to carry a high initial cost. Although it is interesting to see innovative strategies being used to increase the response rate to this consultation (lottery tickets have been offered to some residents as an encouragement) such responses are unlikely to be well-informed if they are based on the information available so far. The division of the consultation into two separate phases also seems destined to reduce overall engagement due to 'feedback fatigue'.

The NHS as we understand it seems to under considerable strain and some believe that this is due to a longterm goal to alter it irrevocably from the 'free at the point of contact' and 'to each according to their need' basis on which it was founded. Privatisation of services introduces the need to make a profit for shareholders. Such a radical change should be carefully scrutinised by the public to ensure that they have the NHS they want and need. Responding to consultations is an important step.

The app describes the type of injuries or illnesses seen at minor injuries units and first aid units in Oxfordshire and how to book an online doctor's appointment via Patient Access. In addition, proposals are being developed to improve health and care in Buckinghamshire, Oxfordshire and Berkshire West to help our communities be the healthiest they can be, while making sure that services are affordable for years to come. The Buckinghamshire, Oxfordshire and Berkshire West Sustainability and Transformation Plan (STP) will set out the challenges and opportunities facing NHS and care services across the area.
