# Park Road Update

There has been some confusion about the most recent consultation on development to the south of Didcot. We are still waiting for a decision from SODC about Taylor Wimpey's application to build houses to the south of the current limit to Great Western Park. However. many of you will remember that the original Great Western Park application covers land further south than the building line of the Bloor Homes development. This land was allocated to provide a visual southern boundary to Didcot, in the form of allotments and a wild area. It is this area that has been the subject of a recent application from Taylor Wimpey. In their application to the Planning Department they detail the number of parking spaces at the allotments, and the proposed tree planting and use of this land. The

important issue for West Hagbourne is that they will raise the level of this land (using spoil from elsewhere on GWP) to even it out across the plot. This brings worries about future flood risk as the application mentions run off into existing ditches. Although we may benefit from trees providing some screening of Didcot, residents in Bloor Homes are are worried that they will lose their open views to the south. This may be relevant to us too as one ground for refusing the application to develop Hagbourne Fields is that this would destroy views to the open countryside and the AONB. Tree planting and raising the level of the land might mean there are no views. The consultation with respect to the allotment land closed in November. We await news of this and other planning applications.

# Roads, Lanes & Pavements



### Road Closure

Main Street from the junction with York Road at Appledore to the Horse & Harrow will be closed from 28 January to 1st February 2019 (inclusive) for works by Thames Water. This will involve a long detour for villagers heading south so please leave extra time for your journey. It is also likely to result in some traffic congestion at first although it may result in more commuters using the new road from Didcot to the A417 in future.

### Moor Lane

Nettles and weeds are growing apace on the verge of Moor Lane as far as the bridge over the ditch behind Main Street. The village mowing contract used to keep this tidy. Residents have indicated that they would appreciate it if mowing this stretch could be reinstated.

### Autumn Reminder

Please keep pavements clear of leaves and mud, and keep any vegetation overhanging pavements and roadways cut back for the safety of pedestrians.

# Free Parking

The annual free parking tradition is provided by South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse District Councils to encourage people to shop locally for their Christmas presents.

Free Christmas parking days also mean people don't have to pay to park if they wish to catch up with friends and family in the pubs, cafés and restaurants found across southern Oxfordshire's towns during the festive period.

Wallingford -Thursdays from 6 December


