# West Hagbourne news



As you all know Taylor Wimpey applied to build over 900 houses and a care home on Hagbourne Fields – the field on the left hand side as you go up Park Road towards Didcot. This planning application generated a huge response by villagers in West and East Hagbourne, Didcot, Coscote and further afield and an extraordinary number of objections were lodged.

However just before Christmas Taylor Wimpey withdrew the application. They had been advised already that both OCC and SODC oppose the plan for many reasons including the following:

- 1) The site was not allocated in the existing Core strategy and there are no plans to allocate it in the new local plan. This is crucial.
- 2) Development here would be contrary to the Local Plan and has been demonstrated to be harmful in appeal decisions eg Catesby (on the other side of Park Road). SODC are

therefore entitled to refuse it and says that they would do so even if TW's new transport model enables them to get OCC to lift their highways objections. SODC would still be able to refuse as contrary to the Local Plan and on landscape grounds (as for Catesby).

3) SODC currently still have in excess of 7 years land supply which means the tilted balance favouring "sustainable" development would not apply here which makes it much easier to refuse. This supply level will fluctuate but under the Oxfordshire Growth Plan SODC

benefit from having the protection of a 3yr supply hurdle which is very unlikely to be undershot.

In addition TW had been told by OCC that they would have to have provided a new transport model too — this would have taken many months and so is likely to have been a factor in withdrawing the application. It is probably better from TW point of view to have withdrawn the application than to have had it refused but, for the time being at least, the result is the same!

With development you can never say that a site will never

be developed and we must continue to be vigilant but it looks very likely that this site will stay the way it is for some time.

### Taylor Wimpey allotments

Immediately north of the Hagbourne Fields site, Taylor Wimpey wish to move ahead with plans to turn the end of the field (by the Bloor Homes development) into 42 allotments. The site will be raised to almost 2m high, with a surrounding fence on top and 30 car parking spaces provided. The reason for raising the level of the site is to provide a dump for spoil from GWP. Again an incredible number of objections were lodged but this plan has received the green light. Many objections raised the issues of flooding and drainage and it remains to be seen whether the village suffers adversely once the site has been developed and also whether the footpaths are maintained something that was unclear in the original application.



#### **Parish Council**

In March 2019 work will commence on an extension of the footpath along Main Street. This will be on the same side of the road as the existing new footpath, and will run from the other side of the driveway of Green Thatch, towards the bend. The work will last about two weeks and this portion of Main Street will be closed. Fortunately the Harwell Link Road is now operational and will provide a viable diversion, although

there is bound to be additional traffic along York Road.
We are investigating the possibility of a 20 mph limit for York Road. As a first step, traffic surveys need to be carried out by the County Council, normally at the expense of the Parish Council. Fortunately our County Councillor Simon Clarke has kindly offered to pay for the surveys from funds that he has available.

# Your Parish Council needs YOU

Have you ever thought about what a parish councillor does? Managing the budget for spending on projects in the village, organising grass cutting and considering local planning applications are

some of their important roles. West Hagbourne needs five parish councillors, chosen every 4 years, and these can be elected (if there are more than 5 candidates) or nominated. Communities that fail to produce a parish council may have all local decision-making placed in the hands of their local district council. The next elections will be in May, so perhaps you would consider putting your name forward.

### South Oxfordshire Local Plan



The final version of SODC's local plan covering the period until 2034 has been published and can be viewed on their website (search newlocalplan). The consultation period runs until 18 February and given the usefulness of this plan in holding off development of Hagbourne Fields, you might like to comment favourably on the decision not to expand Didcot's southern boundary.

#### Winter Walk

In the absence of our organiser, Margaret, due to ill health, and without any canine inspiration, it was a very small group who set out from the bus shelter on Sunday 13 January for the Village winter walk. We set off down to the pond and then past Manor Farm, across the bridge and up the field towards Upton. Climbing up onto the disused railway track we made our way towards Didcot but as we reached the off ramp at Church Path, one of us had to retire hurt, returning directly to the village. Undeterred, the remaining walkers enjoyed the views across the fields to Wittenham Clumps and the majestic soaring red kites before turning off the cycle path at Mowbray Road Fields nature reserve. From there



they skirted the back of Loyd Road, realising just how badly these properties, many of them single storey, would have been affected by the proposed Loyd Road Fields development, losing their magnificent views towards the south. After crossing Park Road, the route took us along the footpath that skirts the edge of the Hagbourne Field where we came across notices announcing that there will be some footpath closures in 2019, presumably related to the allotments that will be developed south of Bloor Homes. Finally, we arrived back in West Hagbourne into York Road. A total of about 3 miles in just over an hour.

### **Carol Singing**

On a particularly wet December night, a dedicated band of singers revived the ancient West Hagbourne custom of serenading villagers with traditional carols. Despite the poor weather, about a dozen people arrived with torches and waterproofs, setting out first along Main Street towards Foxglove Lane and then back to the centre of the village. As the carol sheets became increasingly soggy and singing was restricted to the first verses of carols that everyone knew by heart, the singers made their way along York Road and



finally into Manor Close, where Bridget Pickup revived them with hot chocolate. The final leg of the village, along York Road, into Main Street and around by the pond brought us to Chapel Hayes where lan and Margaret had laid on mulled wine and hot snacks.

Despite, or perhaps because of the terrible weather, donations were particularly generous and a sum of around £200 was sent to Crisis UK a charity which helps the homeless. Thanks to Margaret Leishman for organising the necessary documentation, to the generous hosts who provided refreshments, to all the villagers who paid good money to hear us sing (or to persuade us to stop) and the brave souls who battled the elements to revive this tradition.

#### **Didcot Volunteers**

This is a car scheme serving Didcot and surrounding villages providing transport for medical appointments and shopping. The service is intended for adults, older people and people with physical disabilities. This is a door to door personal transport service operated by volunteers. Drivers use their own vehicles to take each client to and from the venue and will accompany the client throughout the hospital appointment if required.

Drivers with larger vehicles can take folding wheelchairs and walking aids.

Costs: a £5 donation is requested each year and 45p a mile travelled.

# Winter warning

In Oxfordshire the fire brigade have attended over 266 chimney fires in the last three years. Nearly 50% of these fires happen during January, February and March. Most people will get their chimney swept ready for the winter season but they may not realise about the other steps they could be taking to avoid a chimney fire.

If you enjoy cosying up in front of a log fire, make sure the sparks don't fly at home this winter.

Have a cosy home not a fire

- Get your chimney swept at least once a year, if you regularly have log fires get it swept more frequently
- If you have a 1st floor fireplace check that it is clear of debris

# Health updates

GP access hubs in Oxfordshire can offer you a routine appointment to see a doctor or practice nurse at weekends. You can book a hub appointment at a time to suit you by contacting your own surgery.

Seeing a doctor at the weekend or evening could prevent a cough or cold from getting worse, and frees up your own GP to see more vulnerable patients.

A late-night safe space for people experiencing mental health crisis has opened off the Cowley Road in Oxford. Oxford Safe Haven (OSH) offers additional out-of-hours support for adults living with mental illness in Oxford-shire. People must call ahead to hold a place at the drop-in in Manzil Way, Oxford, for immediate mental health support in a non-medical environment.


