### Remembrance Sunday

In June, 1954, the newly built bus shelter at The Square, was officially dedicated, by the then vicar of St Andrew's church, as

West Hagbourne's memorial to those men from the village who died whilst serving their country during WW2. Their names, as well as the one man from West Hagbourne who died in action during The Great War can be found on plaques inside it and on a tablet in St Andrew's church. The names of the four men who died during WW2 are also listed with those from East Hagbourne at the Lower Cross, and a wreath is laid especially for them every year at the Remembrance Day service.

During the village history walk in July, Sheila Taylor reminded us that the bus shelter was erected as the village's war memorial, and as a result of this the Association has decided to place a poppy wreath there as a fitting tribute to those men. Father Jason from St Andrew's church has kindly agreed to officiate a brief ceremony on Remembrance Sunday, 10th November at 3pm, at The Square. Everyone is most welcome to attend.

### AGM

This will take place on Monday 11th November at 7:30pm in Hagbourne Village Hall, East Hagbourne. You are invited to come and join us at our annual meeting which is open to all

residents within the parish of West Hagbourne.

## Parish Council

### New Footpath

A new footpath has been officially designated that will link into important routes from West Hagbourne to Didcot. For a long time people used a non-designated route from Park Road, behind Portway, west to join the footpath from West Hagbourne to the Wantage Road (see map, East Hagbourne FP1 and Didcot FP18). This is now formalised (diagram A1-A2-A3) and runs between the back of the new houses and the allotments site, across Park Road to the path running behind Loyd Road to

Mowbray Fields and the old Railway line. Once Didcot FP18 is fully re-opened, after the developers have finished, this will provide an extra route into



Didcot and complete a nice circular walk taking in Didcot and East and West Hagbourne.

### Road Closure

Despite some recent uncertainty, the road closure at the junction of Park Road and Brook Lane is still planned for the 14th to 16th October. Correspondence with OCC said that the earlier closure was to carry out drainage works, while the second visit is to carry out some structural patching works.

We are currently discussing matters with Highways, including the following:



1. Further work to the south end of York Road to deter traffic from using it as a rat run if Main Street is blocked.
2. Gates on the side of the road at both end of the village.
3. An additional vehicle activated speed sign and some changes to the existing sign

## New Seat

Work is progressing on the installation of extra seating under the Horse chestnut tree in the middle of the village. In preparation, the three planters that were located under the tree have been moved to encircle the finger post road sign. Some plants have been moved from the planters into the main garden at the bus shelter. Bulbs for a spring display will be planted during October and November. Meanwhile the footings for the new part of the seat have been prepared, ready for a concrete base. This project is funded jointly by the Village History Group and the Parish Council.

## Farming News

I went to the Newbury Show today (well that's what the locals call it! The Royal Berkshire Show I believe). I have never bumped into so many happy farmers! There was a deluge of rain, although unfortunately we didn't have much up this way.

It has been a lovely summer, so good to see the school children have some decent days to be out and about during their school holidays.

The harvest was a good one both for quality and yield except for the Oil Seed Rape which was attacked by the dreaded Flea beetle, which eats it way up the stem and destroys the plant.

Next year's crop has already been planted we are just waiting



for a decent rain to help it to grow.

It may have been noticed that we have a couple of fields of potatoes growing (about to be harvested) they are seed potatoes of various varieties, tended by a company whom we just let the land to. A good break crop. We have also planted cover crops and spread plenty of dung to increase the fertility of the poorer ground.

The barley and Wheat will be planted later on, at the end of October, later than usual as we need the rain to chit the volunteers and black grass, which we then spray off leaving a clean seed bed to plant the crop into. Many loads of grain have already left the store either for Warburtons or for export. Another harvest year has begun.....

The kestrels have definitely taken a dislike to the new nesting box at the back of the farm. Disappointing, as I always like to follow their progress. Maybe next year?

There were plenty of swifts



screaching around the village at high speed, some nesting in the old roof of our house. I love to see them and take great joy in their return each May. They don't seem to stay long, once the brood have fledged they are gone! I didn't think there were quite so many swallows this year until I counted over fifty gathering on the wires before they flew away. We provide little ledges in the horse stables for them to build nests and some have had two or three broods this year, probably due to the dry spell.

We always have lots of Great tit nests in gate posts and holes around the buildings along with wagtails which are delightful



little birds which follow you around the farm a bit like the robin does.

Let's hope we don't get the 'Beast from the East' again this winter! I look forward to sunny autumn days, the smell of dead leaves and log fires!!
