02/08/1925 - 13/10/2022

Dad was born in Hungerford. his family moving to West Hagbourne when he was young. He was the oldest of three with brothers Ken and Stan, and went to school in East Hagbourne. Like many children he got up to all kinds of mischief and playfulness. Called up on his eighteenth birthday to fight in World War 2, he joined the Royal Navy, ending up on the H.M.S BERWICK, which was on Convov Guard Duty in the North Atlantic. In 1945 the War Ministry were asking for volunteers to join the Army to fight in the Far East, so he joined the Royal Berkshire Regiment, fighting in Burma as part of the 14th Army. He came home in 1946. He then ioined Rowlands Bakerv. in Upton, as a trainee baker and Horse and Cart Delivery.

When that closed he joined the Railway and was based in Reading, working there for over 40 years, until he retired. He married his beloved Vi in 1950 and she had four sisters and three brothers, so there were lots of birthday parties, holidays, travelling and many family get togethers, which he thoroughly enjoyed. They moved to 10 York Road in 1952, making many friends in the village over the years. He would often be seen on his bike cycling around the village or to Didcot, where he would catch the train for work, or to the shops or the bookies at the weekend which he did until he was ninety. He also loved his vegetable garden spending a lot of his spare time there, preparing it for all his crops, right up to his 91st birthday. Sadly then his health began to suffer and he slowly deteriorated so he had to give it up -but what an amazing life. Time to say Goodbye. R.I.P

Keeping warm

Keeping the house warm

Get the boiler serviced earlier in the year if you can and check

the radiators. Engineers will be less busy in the summer, so worth bearing in mind for next year.

Age UK recommends keeping the living room at 21°C, the bedroom at 18°C and the rest of the house at least 16°C. Set the heating to come on just before getting up and switch off after bedtime. If it's very cold, set the heating to come on earlier and turn off later rather than turning the thermostat up.

Make sure that the house is well insulated to keep the heat in (and save on bills). Draft proofing doors and windows, as well as insulating the loft (and walls if necessary) will help to retain as much heat as possible. Grants may be available to help with insulation. Check out the Energy Saving Trust who can provide advice.

Switch off the heating in any rooms that aren't used; draw the curtains as it gets dark to help retain the heat.

If the house is heated by oil or solid fuel make sure there are adequate supplies for the winter.

Also, January/February is the time to trim mature native hedging (after the birds and wildlife have had a chance to feed up on the berries).

This year has been a busy one for HUGS, with successes in a number of projects aimed at enhancing the local ecology.

These included tree planting down Moor lane and around East Hagbourne, installation of 21 owl boxes in selected locations in and around both East and West Hagbourne, and the installation of a new wildflower area in East Hagbourne.

We shall continue our efforts to conserve and enhance the local environment with further projects over the coming year, and look forward to your support in this endeavour.
