Planning

The application for six houses on the field by Lizard Bank is still under consideration.

The application for the Nursery development (5 houses) has been approved.

A revised document has been submitted for the development at the Pub (mainly concerned with the siting of bicycle storage). The rejection of the original application is under Appeal.

Remember that if you comment on planning applications that your comments will be made public on the Planning website. Also that the Planning department are only allowed to take into account what are called 'Material Planning Considerations' so you need to consider carefully the basis for your response.

HUGS Update

Nature in Deep Trouble

When 16% of UK monitored species are in danger of extinction you are in deep trouble, says naturalist and TV presenter Chris Packham.

The new State of Nature report, led by the RSPB and supported by more than 60 conservation and research organisations,

19% average decline in British wildlife species in the UK.

30% decline in species providing pest control, creating a vicious cycle for farmers' yields.

50% of fish stocks are not sustainably harvested

0% of the seafloor is in good condition due to damage from fishing gear.

93% of woodlands & 75% of peatlands are in a poor ecological state. These habitats are crucial for carbon storage, and can be harnessed to help fight climate change.

Although the UK leads the world in biodiversity monitoring, it has experience massive declines.

The solutions needed are well understood. Large scale restorative work to bring degraded habitats to life needs to be replicated and expanded. Farming must shift to regenerative models, developers must build nature in as we plan our homes and infrastructure while polluters must pay. Behaviour change is required in every corner of society and every inch of the economy - says Richard Benwell, chief executive of the Wildlife and Countryside Link. The Government has committed itself to protecting 30% of the UK's natural environment by 2030 with an Environmental Improvement Plan to create and

restore at least 500,000 hectares of new wildlife habitats.

At a local level we can all help nature - in our gardens, along our roads, in our ponds, in the

decisions we take to protect nature.

As Chris Packham says "this is our time. So, it doesn't matter whether you're into bats, bumblebees, butterflies, birds, bugs or badgers – ultimately, we need to come together."
