Parish Council

We had a well attended and busy Parish Council (PC) meeting on 13 March. The main areas of discussion were:

Flooding

We discussed the impact of this winter's flooding on the village, the ways in which we can seek to mitigate the risk of a repeat and also the resources available to help those affected. lan Leishman has kindly agreed to put together a map of the watercourses around the village to help inform actions. The PC will be purchasing a supply of sandbags to be stored in the village for easy emergency access, and we are pressing Oxfordshire County Council (OCC) to clear our drains annually rather than once every four years, as per their current policy. Please can all those with

ditches, streams, culverts or any other form of drainage facilities on their property do everything they can to keep them clear. If you're struggling to do this, please ask for help. It's in all of our interests to do what we can to allow water entering the village to exit it quickly.

Moor Lane

We have been in regular contact with OCC about the state of the Moor Lane byway east of the old overhead railway bridge. We understand that OCC plan to place concrete bollards to close this section of the byway to vehicles for a period to allow "improvement works" (this may already have happened by time of printing, and the tarmac section adjoining Main Street will be unaffected), following which an assessment will be undertaken of the suitability of this section for the various user groups. We will remain in contact with OCC on this.

PC membership

Julie Freeland took her place on the PC as a new co-opted member. Mike Telford has now stepped down from the PC after 9 years' service, and Mike Butler has stepped down as Chair (he will remain on the PC for the time being). Both Mikes will be present at the annual PC meeting on 8 May (see below), where we'll have the chance to thank them properly for their contribution to the village. Another couple of residents have kindly volunteered to join the PC - Andy Wimshurst and Margaret Leishman - they will formally join the PC at our next meeting. Finally, I've picked up the baton as Chair from Mike.

PC regular bi-montly meeting Wednesday 1 May, and annual PC meeting Wednesday 8 May. Both will be at 7.30pm at Hagbourne Village Hall.

No mow May

Help Mother nature - make your garden matter.

We can all make raeal difference by doing simple things to support nature in our back gardens. Private UK gardens cover over 400,000 hectares - more than all national nature reserves. In the UK, 1 in 6 species is at risk of extinction.

You can help recovery by:

Cutting the grass less often or leaving wild patches to be cut just once or twice a year leaving dandelions, daisies and other wildflowers to support pollinating insects

Not being too tidy - leaving homes for nature



Weeding beds and borders less often- allowing wildflowers and the insect life they support into your garden

Avoiding pesticides and other chemicals in the garden building a more natural balance between 'garden pests' and their predators

Roger Sweet

1st June 1943-26th January 2024

Dad was born in 1943, the eldest son of Jack & Marjorie Sweet. His brother Roland was born in 1949. In his youth he enjoyed cycling, going on long cycle rides with friends. He even cycled to Woburn and met the Duke of Bedford. He followed in his father's footsteps by becoming a scout and went on scouting holidays including one to Switzerland. Dad later became a Scout leader himself with his friend Barry and often took the boys on scout camps on the train.

He met his late wife Margaret, our Mum, at the grammar school in Harrow, Middlesex they both attended. They married on 4 September 1965, however, tragically, our Mum passed away from a brain tumour at the age of 30 on September 5, 1974, just one day after their 9th wedding anniversary. After Mum

died, Dad looked after his three young children in West Drayton with Whisky the cat. We remember nice Christmases, being read bedtime stories at night, and being taken on adventurous camping holidays to Northumberland. Parenthood did not come easy to Dad, especially as we got older.

In 1988, when the children were grown up, Dad and Karen relocated to the bungalow Uplands, which he bought from Mr and Mrs Kimber. Soon after moving to Oxfordshire, Dad helped form the West Hagbourne Village Association and was a member of the Association's committee for some time. He was appointed Parish Clerk twice and held the post for several years. He also helped to create and was cofounder of the village website with John Baile.

Dad enjoyed living in the countryside and appreciated the changing of the seasons. He was a passionate gardener and took delight in seeing the first

signs of Spring and the arrival of the cowslips. Dad enjoyed DIY and decorating, whistling while he worked. When Karen eventually bought her own house, he was a great help with his practical skills. Driving was another passion and he enjoyed outings to the south coast. He also enjoyed watching Six Nations Rugby on television and he would often be heard shouting at the screen. He also dabbled in painting landscapes, inspired by TV artist, Bob Ross. In 2005, using computer skills learned in the 1990s, while working at the London Borough of Hillingdon, he created a unique website named 'Oxfordshire Villages'. This project involved him visiting every village in the county, capturing their essence through photographs, and conducting extensive research to write about each one. It inspired enquiries from individuals around the world.

Dad retired in 2004, and enjoyed a relaxing and happy retirement with Rosie the cat to keep him company. Throughout his retirement he was able to spend time on his passions whilst tending to his website and his garden, and participating in activities such as reconnecting with old school friends at meetups in country pubs.

Unfortunately, Dad's later years were overshadowed by health issues, particularly in the last five years. His declining health was a source of frustration, especially when it hindered his ability to walk and engage in various activities. Despite this and his frailty, Dad maintained his dignity until the very end.

Dad celebrated his 80th birthday in June 2023.

After spending 4 months in hospital Dad died peacefully at home, which is where he wanted to be, with his 3 children around him on 26th January 2024 which was also his father's birthday.

Bill Warner

9th December 1926 – 2nd December 2024

William (Bill) Warner passed away peacefully at home on 22nd December aged 97. He was born on 9th December 1926 in a cottage in Moor Lane, the eldest son of Henry and Winifred Warner and lived his entire life in West Hagbourne.

Leaving school aged 14 he started work as a 'Greaser' on the railway, working his way up to 'fireman' shovelling coal on the trains which at that time were carrying troops and weaponry across the country.

In the late 40's he met Jean and together they decide to build their own house in Manor Close helped by his dad Henry. Bill and Jean were married on 6 August 1949 and set up home along with their daughter Sally in the house they'd carefully planned. They were married for 68 years until Jean sadly passed away. Bill's mum and dad lived at the Old Post Office in The Square and ran the shop. After his time on the railway, along with his brother Stan, Bill set up a greengrocery business there. They went around all the local villages selling their goods from vans. When Henry sadly passed away in 1972 the business had to close. Bill then decided to set up his own building business. He quickly built up an excellent reputation for being hard working and reliable and was always in demand.

When not working he would be in his favourite place - his garden, growing vegetables as well as flowers. Every summer his beds would be full of beautiful bedding plants grown from seed in his greenhouse. He was really proud to win the Madge Cup on several occasions.

He wanted to be able to end his long and eventful life in his own home and thanks to his friends and family, kind carers and excellent neighbours he was able to do that.

The Horse & Harrow

Many villagers will be aware that planning permission has been granted for the conversion of the Horse and Harrow into a pair of semi-detached homes and for the construction of a further three houses on the site. With this decision West Hagbourne loses its only public meeting place and an important historic building.

The route to this decision has at times been hard to follow. The first application for this development was refused by SODC and the developers took this refusal to an Appeal. In the interim, the developers submitted an almost identical revised application. On March 16th this revised application was also refused by SODC. It was quite unexpected therefore that, on March 17th, we learned that the Appeal had been granted by the Planning Inspectorate, and the development would go ahead. If anyone out there understands how local planning works, please get in touch!
